Gospel Reflection

Thus says the Lord: (Isaiah)

Share your bread with the hungry, **shelter** the oppressed and homeless, **clothe** the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own. Then your **light** shall break forth like the dawn and your **wound shall** quickly be healed.

Imagine you were an Israelite hearing these words as you returned from years of bondage in Babylon. Imagine.

Imagine you are a Ukrainian refugee, a survivor of recent bombings, and you hear these words. Imagine.

God's point is that such acts of compassion would **scatter the darkness** that has troubled their lives; such acts of kindness would reveal the **light of God's love** for all to see. In that process, **healing** for them and for others would begin to take place.

Centuries later, Jesus says, "You are the salt of the earth... you are the light of the world." What does he mean? Don't we consider him the light of the world? Perhaps Jesus is saying, you are the light that shines forth when you are kind, empathetic, generous with your time, present to those who are most in need. You are salt for the earth when you dare to go out of your comfort zone by helping to make systemic change...like tutoring a child at one of our inner city schools, or becoming a foster parent, or working to rehabilitate ex-felons, or joining one of our many outreach groups at St. Hilary's.

Isaiah and Jesus did not direct these words only to the financially secure and comfortable, but also to those ordinary folks, like us, who are often in need of comfort and support ourselves. We are all called to scatter the darkness around us.

During this month of February let us pause to remember the words of Martin Luther King, Jr., who suffered many painful set backs in his work for racial justice, but was still able to proclaim:

"Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that."

Offertory: The offertory at the end of the year 2022 is up \$66,102, which is a 6.1% bump from this time last year.

With the completion of the church roof, all capital expenditures projects from this past summer have been completed. We are moving forward with upgrading the security of the school with funds donated from last November's We Give Catholic campaign.

As of December, the parish is operating at a surplus of \$191,000, which is above our projected revenue surplus over the first six months of the year by 12k.
