

Gospel Reflection

Reflecting on the scriptures

Apparently, even in Jesus' day there were people who were very concerned about their image ... folks who performed good works just to be seen, hogged places of honor and insisted on titles and honorifics. Today those people would hire image consultants!

The image consultant works with the politician or celebrity to create in the public eye an image of their client, a picture of how that client wants to be seen by others. Positive publicity translates into votes for the politician or media contracts for the entertainment celebrity. There is money to be made in the creation of an Image that is attractive to others.

How frightening it must be if one's public face differs significantly from the private reality! How worrisome to have to keep a true self hidden. But for some people the acclaim, adoration and approbation of others is necessary in order to feel loved, to feel worthy.

The antidote today's gospel offers to this soul-sickness is humility. Humility is our honest acceptance of ourselves as blessed but broken, lovely but limited. How much better to believe deeply that we are created and loved by God who knows the truth of us, who knows our imperfections and loves us anyway than to believe that we must be perfect to earn God's love.

There is such a thing as greatness, Jesus tells us in the gospel. But it is not greatness created by public acclaim, power, influence and connections. "The greatest among you must be your servant," he says. This is how we become truly great, by serving the needs of others, the needs of a suffering world.

As we embark upon choosing leaders for our country in the coming year let us bear this gospel in mind...and value service over image.

St. Hilary Parish Pastoral Council October 24, 2023

Derek Mankin bagan his reflection by asking members of Parish Council to complete a survey on the Eucharist. The survey asked "Do you believe the Eucharist is the true Body and Blood of Christ"? The responses included never, often and always. Some council members stated during RCIA they learned of the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Others shared they learned this fact when their children were preparing to receive the sacrament. As cradle Catholics some of us felt like we always knew of Christ's presence in the Eucharist. The Eucharistic Miracles were very affirming for other members. Dereek shared that he is reading *This is My Body* by Bishop Barron, a wonderful resource on the Eucharist. Derek closed with *A Short Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament*.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 PM by Scott Smith.

Financial Report: Trey Baker reported financial information through September 2023. Our offertory is up \$13,350 from this point last year which is a 3% increase.

As of September, the parish is operating at a surplus of \$278,000. Currently, our expenses are down across the board from this time last year. The main surplus is still due to our tax return, which is being allocated towards our roofing projects.

Our church roof has been completed with the inspection currently in process. The school roof has begun and is currently progressing as well. It should be done and ready for inspection in the next couple of weeks, depending on weather.

Invoices were sent out to families with a due date of October 31st for SRO fee, with a balance owed of \$190. We have received around 120 payments out of our 340 families so far, with only a few families asking for assistance with this fee.
