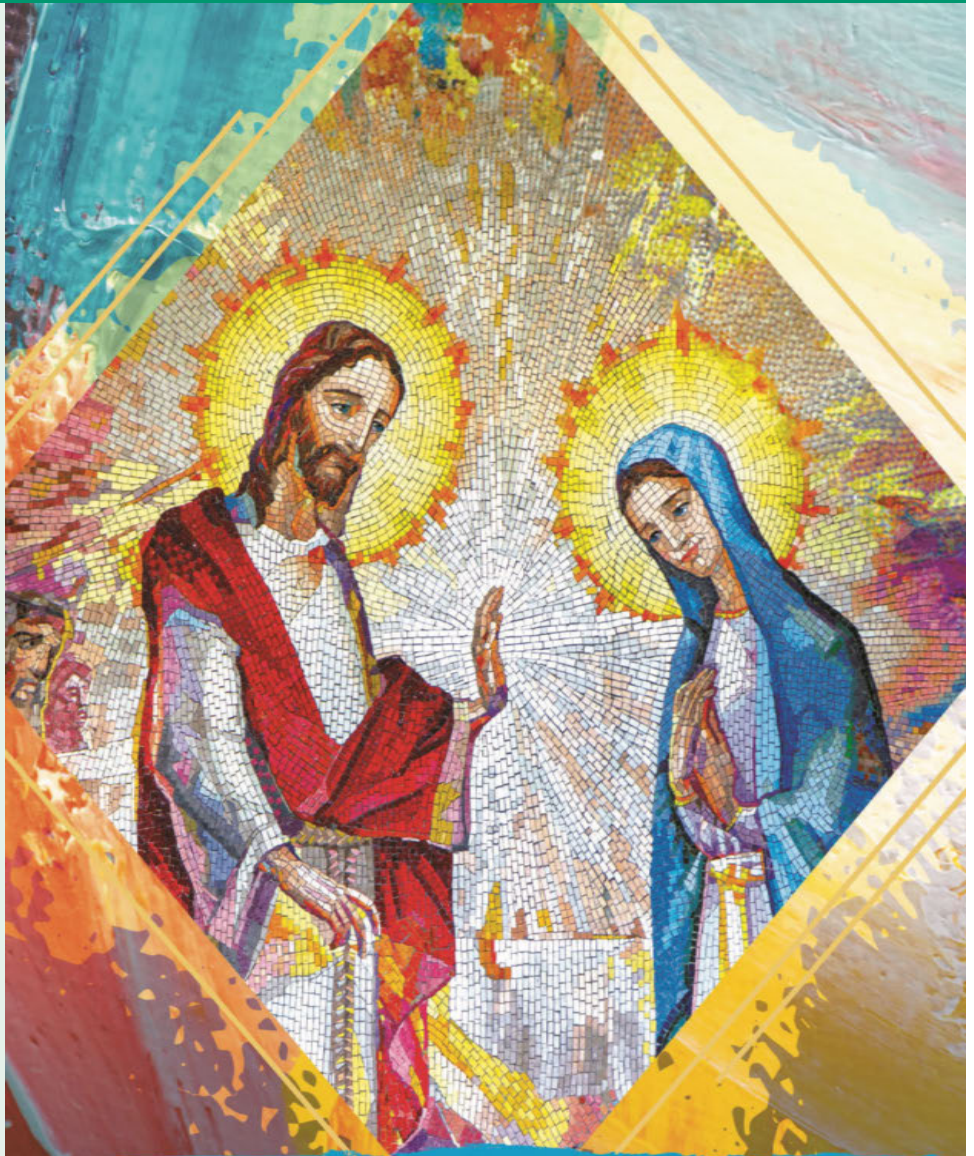

Gospel Reflection

Reflecting on the Scriptures

Today's gospel is uncomfortably timely. Jesus is accused of being either crazy or possessed! The kingdom of God that he has been preaching is a kingdom of peace and justice where inclusion reigns over marginalization and "Love one another" is the mandate. ...a message shocking to some of his listeners.

To the charge that Satan is the source of his power, he responds with common sense wisdom: "How can Satan drive out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand." And he adds, "If a house is divided against itself that house will not be able to stand." Wise words.

Division, polarization, seeing others as adversaries leads to weakness in the institution: in a family, in a church, in a congregation, in a country. The reign of God does not require unanimity. It does not require that we all agree. But a "them v. us" mentality that sees those we disagree with not as conversation partners but as adversaries, as "criminals," as "scum"... breeds the kind of fear and contempt that strikes at the very foundation of the group.

To my ears this gospel observation sounds eerily current. What would Jesus be saying today if he stood on the hillside preaching to a crowd? What would his observations be about the polarization we are experiencing in so many areas? And what about the fear-mongering we hear?

How does that relate to his observation that once a house is weakened by division, then can it be plundered by another? It might be worth asking who stands to gain by weakness in our institutions today?

Preschool (age 3 to PreK) on Thursday mornings (9:00-11:00am), Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. CGS is a Montessori-based program which combines the teaching of Hebrew scholars, Scripture studies, and Roman Catholic Liturgy and doctrine. The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd strives to cultivate the natural bond already between God and the young child and produce a life-long desire for them to draw near to God.

Kindergarten and grades 1-8 on Monday evenings (6:45-8:00pm), in our Traditional PSR (Parish School of Religion) program. Peer groups in grade specific classrooms explore the religion curriculum as articulated by the Diocese of Cleveland. By the witness of their own lives volunteer adult catechists and classroom aides share their love Jesus each week with the children. Training, resources, guidelines, and support provided by the parish staff.

Grades 3-7, on Sunday mornings at 10:10am (typically the 2nd Sunday of the month), Family Catechesis, our home-school study model with a once-a-month session for parents and children to attend together. Students use a textbook and online resources to complete grade level specific content at home with parents. As a family, they come in for thematic lessons/activities with the large group once a month.

St. Hilary School Academic Challenge Team competes at NAQT National Championship

St. Hilary School's Academic Challenge Team "A" had its strongest performance ever at the NAQT 2024 Middle School National Championship Tournament on May 11 in Chicago, IL. All 160 competing teams from across the nation (as well as a few teams from Seoul, South Korea) had to navigate eight full matches and five byes. The St. Hilary team's final tally was about on par with the rest of its Ohio rivals, with 3 wins, 5 losses. The team had three close matches in which it dominated the competition up until the last few toss up questions, with the opposing team beating St. Hilary in the end by 5 to 10 point margins, narrowly preventing St. Hilary from advancing to the finals on May 12. St. Hilary School's Academic Challenge Team "A" consisted of seventh grader Natalie Warmus (team captain), and eighth graders Alex Henry, Andrew Schafer and Elizabeth Siefker. The team was coached by St. Hilary School teachers Mr. Jonathan Abucejo and Mr. Sean Gaudus.

Financial Report:
Offertory:

As of the end of April, offertory was ahead of 2023 numbers by \$43,000 which is a 2.3% increase.

Change In Investments – Another positive month has our total investments up \$125,000 for the year.

Notes – tuition invoices were mailed in April. About 25% are paid in full and monthly payments begin in June. St. Hilary Celebration was held on May 3 at Portage Country Club and the committee is still working on finalizing the expenses. The Celebration is estimated to make a profit of between \$205,000 - \$210,000 which is the largest ever.

- **Summer maintenance:** Grades 3, 4 and 5 classroom refresh: paint, flooring, lockers, ceiling, lighting.
- **St. Hilary School Graduation** – May 31, 2024
- **School Enrollment:** There were 558 students enrolled during the 2023-2024 school year. The projected enrollment for 2024-2025 is 605-610. Additional support services are being considered due to the increase. The architect will be providing recommendations on use of the gym locker rooms that are not being used for gym class and CYO athletics and have not been used since pre-Covid.

Old Business:

- Joyce Davis provided a positive update on the Classic Sabers Ministry. There are about 162 members, and several events are scheduled for the remainder of the calendar year. Please continue to watch the bulletin for these announcements and details on registration.
- **Stewardship:** Trapper Jack – September 25, 2024. Marketing and promotional materials are prepared and will be distributed.
 - Small Faith Sharing Group: Video: Presence and Book Study: 33 Days to Eucharistic Glory by Matthew Kelly.

This 4-part series was discussed as an option to participate in beginning in October.
