

# **Faith Formation**

# Gospel Reflection

Have you ever been asked to do a job or perform a task that seemed beyond your skill set? Or one that you had not done before, stretching your gifts to the limit? Today's Scriptures are all about people being called, being chosen by God to do something challenging.

For Amos, the Old Testament figure, it meant being summoned from his work as shepherd and gardener to admonish the people of Israel for their unfaithfulness to God's covenant. (Amos had probably been pretty content with herding the sheep!) In his letter to the Ephesians, **Paul** makes clear that they have been chosen, showered with every spiritual blessing, to do the work of Christ in the world. So no excuses for not getting it done!

And **Mark's gospel** recounts how the 12 apostles are sent out, two by two, by Jesus to preach a message of repentance to all who would listen. Remarkably they are instructed to travel lightly...taking no food or money or extra clothes. They are to depend on the hospitality of strangers. Their mission? To preach the good news, to heal the sick and to drive out demons of every kind that afflicted many. Remember, there were no credit cards or cell phones to rescue them if they got in trouble!

Being called to do God's work is not for the faint of heart. It can take us into uncomfortable territory. It brings us face-to-face with cultures and challenges that are foreign to us. It sometimes calls us to speak truth to power, difficult as that might be. More importantly, for each of us, discovering the place God wants us to be is the challenge. God probably won't communicate with us as he did with Amos or as Jesus did with those disciples. Sometimes the call comes through a bulletin plea for help at a soup kitchen or nursing home. Sometimes a friend will invite us to help with a tutoring program in the inner city, or an advocacy effort on behalf of the formerly incarcerated, or....the issues are many.

Answering the call can be life-changing. Just ask Amos or Paul or those first disciples...or the every-day disciples who live among us, responding to God's call through the multitude of outreach and justice organizations here at St. Hilary's.

May today's Scriptures inspire each of us to reflect on how well we are discerning and responding to the demands of discipleship, wherever that may lead. If you don't know where to start, just read the bulletin!

**Preschool (age 3 to PreK) on Thursday mornings (9:00-11:00am), Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.** CGS is a Montessori-based program which combines the teaching of Hebrew scholars, Scripture studies, and Roman Catholic Liturgy and doctrine. The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd strives to cultivate the natural bond already between God and the young child and produce a life-long desire for them to draw near to God.

Kindergarten and grades 1-8 on Monday evenings (6:45-8:00pm), in our Traditional PSR (Parish School of Religion) program. Peer groups in grade specific classrooms explore the religion curriculum as articulated by the Diocese of Cleveland. By the witness of their own lives volunteer adult catechists and classroom aides share their love Jesus each week with the children. Training, resources, guidelines, and support provided by the parish staff.

**Grades 3-7, on Sunday mornings at 10:10am (typically the 2nd Sunday of the month), Family Catechesis**, our homeschool study model with a once-a-month session for parents and children to attend together. Students use a textbook and online resources to complete grade level specific content at home with parents. As a family, they come in for thematic lessons/activities with the large group once a month.
