

Reflecting on the scriptures

When I was growing up we learned about the food pyramid. That was just about the extent of our understanding of nutrition. Today it's very different. Food packaging includes the recommended daily allowance of important nutrients, how many calories in a serving, and exactly how many of those cookies constitute a serving. Spoiler alert... It might be fewer than you hoped! Whole aisles in the grocery store feature foods that are gluten free, sugar -free or low in sodium. So what's changed?

I suspect we have learned that the foods we consume have a direct bearing on our health. Some foods can have a damaging effect on our body over time. Other foods and a balanced diet can give us a healthier body, more energy, even help us fight off disease.

But if we just look, however admiringly, at the fruits and vegetables on our way to the chips, those fruits and vegetables aren't going to help us. We need to consume healthy food... to make it part of us.

In today's gospel Jesus says "For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink...One who feeds on me will have life because of me."

In order for this heavenly food to give us healthy souls we need to use it. We need to take it in and make it a part of our living...to be... like him...broken and shared to answer the hungers of the world.

Help us *Build the Future* for the Children of St. Hilary School of the Congo! Special Collection August 31 and September 1


On the weekend of August 31 and September 1, we will again ask for your support with the Building the Future program in the Congo.

■Kindergarten 2024-2025 Opening Schedule

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 28 - HALF DAY

• First day of school for Kindergarteners only. To help children acclimate, this will be a HALF DAY.

• ON AUGUST 28 ONLY, Kindergarten students will arrive between 8:30 and 8:45 am, after our regular drop-off time. This will allow time for saying goodbyes in our "hug zone" outside our main entrance before our Kindergarten team takes children to classrooms. Look for your child's teacher and teaching assistants holding signs indicating where each class should meet near the main entrance / Jesus statue.

• If your Kindergartener will ride the bus to school during the first week of school, please email his/her teacher so arrangements can be made to assist your child in getting to the classroom.

• ALL kindergarten students will attend from 8:45 a.m. to 12:00 pm. There will be no buses to take kindergarten students home on these days and no Latchkey available for kindergarten students these afternoons. Please be sure your child has a ride home.

ON AUGUST 28 ONLY, Rooms 101 and 104 will be dismissed from the Moorfield Road doors. Room 105 will be dismissed from the doors by the Jesus statue. The child's name should be displayed prominently in the passenger window. Please email the teacher if someone other than a parent will be picking up your child.

THURSDAY, AUGUST 29 – FULL DAY

• **FULL-DAY kindergarten program begins.** Please make sure your child has arrangements for lunch, a snack, a rest time towel, and a ride home or Latchkey arrangements at dismissal time.
