Gospel Reflection

Once, many years ago, as I was tucking into bed my “night owl” of a granddaughter, she mumbled that she wished she was a grown-up and could stay up as late as she wanted. Ha! What she did not know then, but I reckon she has learned by now, is that “adulting” is not just a case of being able to stay up late and do everything you want. With age you require responsibilities. There are bills to be paid, people who count on you, chores to be done.

In today's gospel James and John approach Jesus with similar short sightedness. They ask for prime spots next to Jesus when he comes into his glory. What they get from Jesus is a wake up call. Before the glory comes the tough stuff, “the cup” that Jesus will drink. This angling for recognition generates some dissension in the ranks when the other apostles become aware of the request James and John have made. The scripture says “they became indignant at James and John. “ (I'll just bet they did!) Jesus gives them all a reality check. Greatness does not lie in power and the perks of authority. “Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. “

This definition of greatness by Jesus is particularly timely for us right now as we stand on the brink of our own very adult activity: casting our vote at the ballot box. Our bishops remind us that participation in civic life is our right and responsibility, that voting is an exercise of faithful citizenship. And that properly forming our conscience in order to vote responsibly is something we as adults are called to do. Conscience formation is a process, a process that relies on prayer, scripture, church teaching, educating oneself. It requires prudential weighing of alternatives and can never be collapsed into simply “doing what one is told” ... by anyone... for, certainly, that is not adult behavior.

While we will never find the perfect candidate to support, we must form our conscience with the information that is available to us. Today's gospel lesson, that “whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant,” is certainly a good place to start.

Good questions to ask of candidates seeking public office might be: “What seems to be this person's orientation toward authority and power? What are his/her policies with regard to the common good, especially the most vulnerable, ...the poor, the unborn, the migrant?... for certainly these, who have no power of their own, are the focus of a servant leader. What are his/her policies with regard to care for creation, a theme of Pope Francis’ teaching? Finally, what can we know about the character of this candidate with regard to the theological virtues of faith, hope and love and the cardinal virtues of prudence, temperance, justice and fortitude, along with honesty.

Wrestling with these issues is something we cannot avoid if we are to be adult disciples of Jesus.

Ignite Young Adult Conference February 22



Made to Serve

I thought it often in my first year as a mother, when I was every day discovering what this new life of parenthood looked and felt like: doing anything with kids is a hundred times harder than doing it without kids. But it's a thousand times better.

From eating dinner to going to Mass to taking a walk around the block — every single outing, even the simplest ones, had an extra level of logistical complexity. I had to bring diapers and food and extra clothes, I had to be ready to distract, to comfort, to settle, to de-escalate. Before, I just showed up, did the thing and went home. Now, I had to be ready to coordinate.

I had to be ready to serve.

But even while everything had become so much more complicated, so much harder, there was suddenly a joyfulness to these experiences that had not been there before. Yes, I was a mom now, a servant if there ever was one, constantly tending to someone else's needs, and it was difficult. Sometimes terribly so. But it was beautiful (not in a physical way — I was usually covered in baby spit-up — but my soul had that glow, you know?).

It was the first time in my life that I really understood what it was to serve, and the power of that vocation to which we are all called.

This isn't just true of parenthood. It's true of every relationship. When we find someone we can meaningfully, wholeheartedly serve — our spouse, our best friend, our employees, our students, our patients, whoever it is — the effort becomes nothing compared to the joy and the fulfillment we find in the work.

We were made for greatness, and Christ tells us that to be great is to serve. So don't be afraid of greatness. Don't be afraid to serve.

Why do we do that?

Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Is Halloween a pagan holiday or a Catholic one?

Answer:

The short answer: nowadays, a little bit of both. But it wasn't always that way. Halloween and All Saints' Day are closely connected. In the 800s, the Catholic Church began celebrating All Saints' Day. It was originally called All Hallows' Day or Hallowmas. The celebration began early on All Hallows' Eve. But if Halloween is really about the saints in all their victorious glory, where do we get haunted houses, costumes, and pranks?

All Saints' Day became associated with the other deceased rather quickly. November 2nd is All Souls Day, where we pray for the souls in purgatory. Throughout the European world, especially with the Celtic and Germanic peoples, the dead were honored in the autumn months. The Celtic pagan celebration of Samhain had its own folk rituals and occurred around the same time as these Catholic feast days.

Within the last few hundred years, this included dressing in disguise and going door to door, asking for food in exchange for a rhyme or poem. Some people masqueraded as "dark" spirits and pulled pranks on others. Today's celebration of Halloween tends to take on these later practices, rather than the original meaning of celebrating the saints. But remember ... this feast was Catholic first!
