

Gospel Reflection

I once had a priest friend who believed that Sunday preaching should make us uncomfortable, should prick our conscience and cause us to examine our lives. Needless to say, his preaching did not always make him very popular with the congregation. After hearing today's Gospel, one wonders how Jesus would have been received by some of us. It is a gospel that can make all of us squirm a bit, whether cleric or layperson. The location of today's story is the Temple precincts. Perhaps it is that location that prompts Jesus to speak to the crowds words of warning about the behavior of the religious leaders....the scribes especially, whom Jesus describes as prancing around in their robes, taking places of honor and, most egregiously in Jesus' eyes, taking advantage of the poor, especially the widows: "(The scribes) devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext, recite lengthy prayers." Then Jesus sits down across from the treasury and observes the folks contributing their money to the temple, many of them well-off. Calling his disciples to join him, he reflects on seeing a poor widow giving to the temple out of her poverty. Jesus is moved to point out the contrast with the wealthy, who are able to give out of their surplus. This is the text that can make us most uncomfortable. How much giving is required of us to meet the standard set by Jesus?

Each day, especially in this season, requests for financial aid vie for our attention. Many wonderful organizations are working to feed the hungry, house the homeless, sustain our planet, do medical research, end gun violence, minister to the imprisoned....I look at the stack of mail requests and reflect on this gospel and indeed on all the gospel passages dealing with wealth and being a disciple of Jesus. I think of the rich young man in another story, who wanted to follow Jesus but went away sad, because Jesus challenged him to sell everything and give to the poor. Many of us are not as financially deprived as the widow in today's gospel, nor are we able to follow the path of someone like Dorothy Day, but we live in an age when the ability to make systemic change is available to us. And we don't need to leave home or empty our bank accounts to make a difference in our corner of the world. But we do need to spend time discerning our gifts, doing some research, and asking God's help in using our resources to work for a just and peaceful world..

Let us be grateful for the preaching that makes us uncomfortable; for the gospel that seems impossible to live. That means Jesus' message is getting through to us. May we embrace the challenge.

Put aside what you hear in the headlines. Come listen to someone on the inside, on the ground, who lives in the reality of war on a daily basis, the constant stress of trying to care for family and friends in her community while sirens go off, the possibility of her only son being called back into the service after just being re-



leased, and only daughter mandatorily slated to serve within the year. Shira Pomeranz, Israeli guide and friends of hundreds of people from our parish and others in the diocese, is coming from Israel to speak to us Fri, Nov 15, for Catholicism 101. This is not a debate but a presentation. It will give you the inside track from someone who was born and has lived in Israel her entire life, with the exception of a couple years spent in the US, a guide for 40 years with a vast knowledge of the biblical and secular history, the ancient and modern cultures, the scriptures and archaeology of the region. This is a woman for all people, who loves Christians, Moslems and Jews, and who works cooperatively with all three groups to build a culture of peace. She will not speaking for the Israeli government but her own very human story...providing a much larger context to the current conflict than just the last 75+ years Israel returned to the Land. She will summarize the conflict from Biblical times until today.
