

Gospel Reflection

To everything, turn, turn, turn; there is a season, turn, turn, turn, And a time for every purpose under heaven.

Today's Scriptures reminded me of this 1959 song by Pete Seeger. It is that time indeed in our **church year** when we will bid farewell to 2023-2024 next Sunday and begin a **new liturgical year with Advent on Dec. 1.** It is that time of turning, when most of the leaves have fallen from the trees, Halloween decorations have been replaced by Thanksgiving images, and the stores are filled with everything Christmas. It is that time. It is that season.

We hear its approach in the words of today's readings. Scholars call these texts "apocalyptic," meaning they reveal a vision of the **end of time**, the end of the world as we know it. They are not comforting texts. The prophet Daniel says, **"It shall be a time unsurpassed in distress..."** and Jesus predicts, **"In those days...the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken."** We know that for many in our world today that end-time is already taking place. We hear the litany of devastation on the nightly news in places like Gaza, Sudan, Ukraine, Lebanon...for many, the world as they have known it has already ended.

This closing of our liturgical year gives us pause to reflect. What is the season of our present life? How far have we traversed on life's journey? With which season do we most identify? Wherever we are in the seasons of life, let us take this opportunity, prompted by our church calendar and its choice of readings, to rejoice in the gift of time that we have been given and to reflect on the many things we have yet to do as followers of Jesus. It is indeed a *time for every purpose under heaven*:

> A time to allow new life to be **born** in us; a time to let old habits **die.** A time to **plant** seeds of hope; a time to **reap** flowers of justice. A time to **kill** the anger prompting past actions; a time to **heal** broken relationships. A time to **heal** broken relationships. A time to **laugh** in times of joy; a time to **weep** with the brokenhearted. A time to **break down** walls of division; a time to **build up** bridges of unity. A time to vanquish **war;** a time to celebrate **peace. May it be so for each of us.**

St. Hilary Giving Tree Begins Nov. 23-24!



Next weekend, November 23-24, the annual St. Hilary Christmas Giving Tree will be in place in the Spiritual Center and in the back of the church. We work with 20 agencies and inner city schools. We only work with the Guidance Counselors and heads of the agencies that know the families'

situations and give us the names and information for the children's needs. We are also helping teens and young adults that are homeless, as well as seniors who need extra help buying food and their needed essentials. (Clare, a senior, wrote a thank you note last year saying, "I didn't have anything else under my Christmas Tree. Your gift cards and box of candy or cookies are so important for those that have no one else I their lives.")

There are many grandparents who have grandchildren living with them, for many reasons. This year, we have children with stage 4 cancer, heart problems, and many autistic children, and a family that is living in a shelter that came from North Carolina that lost everything in the hurricane this fall. A number of older boys last year wrote that they haven't had a Christmas for many years. Keshon wrote, "I'm not used to getting anything on holidays not even my birthday, and I really do appreciate it."

This year again has been a difficult year for so many with the economy as it is. The poor are getting poorer and more children are going hungry. Poverty affects all these families and seniors in one way or another. We are helping children without parents and unaccompanied teens.

We truly, truly thank you for your participation in reaching out to help those in need again this year. We are only touching a handful of children and seniors that need someone to care.

We have a few special needs as well: used or new bibles or children's religious books and doll houses; Unwanted Halloween candy; and UNUSED, UNOPENED travel items (shampoos, soaps, etc., please drop off in the Spiritual Center Donation Hallway with "Attention Betty."

Open M is an ecumenical ministry in South Akron bringing faith, help, and hope to those living on limited resources and those looking for a way out of poverty. They have a Free Medical and Dental Clinic. Volunteers with medical and dental backgrounds are needed. Volunteers are also needed for the food pantry and other areas at Open M. Every month on the third weekend (November 16 and 17), laundry detergent (which cannot be bought with food stamps) is collected at St. Hilary for OPEN M. We are the only church that collects this much-needed product for the clients of OPEN M. Please be generous and help out by donating a bottle or pods of laundry detergent.

SVDP 2024 Fiscal Report

Our 2024 fiscal year ended on September 30 and it was a very busy year for the 20 individuals who are members. The following good works are the result of St. Hilary parishioner's generosity to those less fortunate in Summit County.

In addition, we gave 686 books to children and 1062 bags of groceries during our visits.

This year we assisted 439 households with an average of \$408 each. We also assisted over 100 individuals find employment.

Since 2002 we have distributed almost 3 million dollars of assistance to 10046 households.

We need your help to achieve these results in the future. We actually spent \$72000 more than we took in last year. We can help less people or help them at lower levels. However, you can see by the rent expenses that our average payment of \$408 doesn't even pay a half month's rent. Rent has skyrocketed in Summit County and this will lead to more homeless individuals. Your response to our food requests this year has been tremendous and has saved us from buying as much food as other years. I ask that you consider joining our efforts through donations or becoming a member of our group. Parishioners do so much at St. Hilary and it is tough to ask for more, but SVDP is the face of St. Hilary to so many in need. Our home visits enable us to really understand individual's needs and provide help so that they can live better lives. Feel free to contact me anytime.
