



In the quiet anticipation of Christmas, a time of profound spiritual reflection and preparation unfolds within the Christian calendar. For many, it is a time marked by the lighting of candles, the joy of cherished traditions, and the vibrant chords of carols that herald the birth of a child in Bethlehem. This sacred season is known as Advent, a word that itself holds the promise of something extraordinary yet to come.

The Advent season is a four-week period before Christmas that celebrates the anticipation and coming of Jesus Christ, the Messiah. Not only is the Christian meaning for preparing and celebrating the coming of Jesus Christ, his birth at Christmas, but also to celebrate the new life when someone accepts Jesus Christ as their Savior, and lastly, the anticipation of Jesus returning again.

There are beautiful and rich traditions behind the celebration of Advent. Let's take a deeper look at the focus and themes of each week of Advent, and some of the traditions celebrated worldwide during the Advent season. May you find time to slow down this Christmas season, say "no" to the things that distract you from Jesus, and say "yes" to the gift that God wants you to experience.

# Gospel Reflection

The liturgical season of Advent, which means "coming", requires us to be time travelers. We are asked to focus on three different "comings" of Jesus: To look back to the inbreaking of the kingdom of God in the person of Jesus born at Bethlehem, to look forward to his coming again at the end of time and, finally, to pay attention to his coming to us daily in our present lives.

The focus of today's gospel is his future coming and the gospel contains some frightening imagery: "People will die of fright", " The powers of the heavens will be shaken."

For the just, however there is nothing to fear. Jesus tells his disciples, "When these signs begin to happen, stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand."

The future can be frightening because it is something over which we have no control. But today's gospel reminds us that our future is in God's hands.

Disciples of Jesus have important work to do. He has left us his example and his preaching to light our way. Like him, we care for the marginalized, oppose unjust structures and prioritize acceptance and inclusion. But ultimately the coming of the kingdom is God's accomplishment. We are God's servants. And if we are faithful disciples we need not be afraid.

Today, on the First Sunday of Advent, the church begins a new liturgical year, with scripture readings in the "C" cycle. This year most of our gospel selections will be from the gospel of Luke.

If you read these columns regularly, I assume your intention is to apply the scriptures to your daily life. Imagine how helpful it would be to familiarize yourself with the readings before you come to the weekend liturgy!

A resource I have found very helpful for many years is At Home With the Word. Each annual edition contains the scriptures for the year, background material for the gospel, commentary and a few discussion questions. I highly recommended it for use individually or and in faith sharing groups. New copies are available now in the parish office for \$10.

# St. Hilary Giving Tree Gifts due back on December 15!



The 43rd Annual St. Hilary Christmas Giving Tree has begun! The trees are in place in the Gathering Area and in the back of the church. There are many tags for children, teens, young adults and seniors. We work with 22 agencies and inner city schools that are aware of the families' situation.

Please wrap your gifts and tape the tag SECURELY on your gift...this is the only way we know where the gift will go. This is extremely important! If you have more than one gift for one tag, please place the gifts in a bag (like a kitchen trash bag). Do not tie together as they often get separated. You can also write the number of the tag on each of your boxes.

Please also wrap all GIFT CARDS in a box. You can tape the gift card on top of a box of candy or cookies, and wrap it with your tag on top of the box. Please write the amount of your gift card on the card so your senior knows how much they can spend.

When you take your tag from the tree, please take a picture of it or keep track of agency or school that's on the right hand corner of the tag. If you lose your tag, you will know the section your child is in. Each year we have lost tags and it's hard to know what child you are trying to help.
