

Reflecting on the scriptures

This year it seems like Christmas has come too soon. Thanksgiving was late last month and the season of Advent has been cut short, with the Fourth Week of Advent only a few days long. And now Christmas is upon us.

Gospel Reflection

At home and at church we are ready to put Baby Jesus in the nativity scene. Then it will be complete. Joseph, probably holding a shepherd's crook, will be standing behind the manger. There will be an animal or two, may be a donkey and a cow. The scene will likely include a shepherd and a few sheep. If the scene is scripturally correct you won't see the three kings yet, awaiting their appearance on Epiphany. And Mary will be there. She will be kneeling next to the manger. She will likely be draped in a blue veil and looking very serene. Not at all like she had just given birth!

I remember delivering my first child. He was also the first grandchild on both sides of the family. No son of God... but quite an event in our family! I recall being wheeled from labor and delivery back into my hospital room. I was exhausted after over 12 hours of labor... exhausted and ill prepared for a room full of excited relatives waiting for me. I believe a wise nurse suggested they all go down to the nursery and take a look at the new baby.

Giving birth is hard work. They don't call it labor for nothing!

At Christmas, I like to recall a quote attributed to Meister Eckhart, a Dominican friar and mystic of the 14th century. Translated from the German, he said something like "What good is it for me if Mary gave birth to the son of God many years ago and I don't give birth to God's Son in my person and my culture and my times?" That, too, is hard work.

It is important that we not freeze-frame the nativity scene and file it away as then and there. God intends that this nativity be here and now. That we bear God's gift of peace and compassion into our time and place. We cannot expect it will be easy. It never has been. But if this young girl could do it, without any of the advantages I had at St. Thomas Hospital years ago, then we can certainly give it our best shot!

St. Hilary School is Making a Catholic Education Affordable for All!

It has long been part of the mission of St. Hilary Parish to make a Catholic education at St. Hilary School affordable for every family. With the parish subsidizing the difference between tuition collected and the true cost to educate each student, plus providing scholarships and assistance that help families directly, the commitment of the parish has been evident for many years. Yet, some families have still felt that the gift of a Catholic education was out of reach. That has changed in a big way.



Funding Expands Access for Every Student

St. Hilary School has joined all elementary schools in the Diocese of Cleveland as an EdChoice Scholarship provider. This means that all students registering, or re-registering, for enrollment at St. Hilary School will have the opportunity to receive an EdChoice Scholarship to offset a portion – and in some cases, all – of their St. Hilary School tuition. This significantly expands access to a Catholic education at St. Hilary School for all children, which is a blessing beyond measure. To add to that blessing, St. Hilary School also participates in the Angel Scholarship program through the Diocese of Cleveland, which provides substantial additional funding to help bridge gaps not covered by the EdChoice Scholarship. Even more funding is available through St. Hilary Parish Foundation scholarships, as well as tuition assistance provided by St. Hilary Parish and / or the Diocese of Cleveland. For all of these forms of assistance, the threshold for financial need is altered as a result of having the EdChoice Scholarship program in place to cover families with the greatest levels of need, making these other assistance dollars available for families in other income tiers. Once the highest levels of need are met, assistance can be distributed to successive levels. Therefore, even families who previously assumed they would not qualify for a scholarship or assistance should apply in order to help fulfill the commitment to keeping a Catholic education at St. Hilary School as affordable as possible for all.

The Importance of Putting Catholic Education Within Reach

One of the most important factors in a child's life is his or her school setting. In the words of Bishop Edward Malesic, "As the largest youth ministry of the Church, our schools' mission is to provide the highest quality education for academics, faith formation and holistic development. Catholic education is the heart and soul of what we do as the Church." At St. Hilary School, in addition to a tradition of academic excellence spanning more than 60 years, faith makes the difference in ensuring that what is important at home is also emphasized throughout a child's school life. Today's world is fraught with aspects of society that often contradict the values parents practice and teach at home and threaten to undermine how children are raised. St. Hilary School works as a partner with parents to help provide continuity in exposure to faith-based principles throughout a child's daily life. Now, every family can more easily avail themselves of this partnership to forge a foundation grounded in faith.
