

Gospel Reflection

Reflecting on the Scriptures

All of life is more than the eye can see.

In today's gospel, Peter, John and James get a master class in that reality. They go with Jesus up the mountain and see him transfigured. "His face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white," says Luke. This was not a different Jesus, but the same person they knew all along. The real Jesus. Now they saw him more deeply, more than their eyes had ever before seen.

How appropriate for us to read this gospel at the beginning of Lent. Though we may have somber associations with the word "lent", it actually means "spring." And now, in the spring of the year, the natural world is really more than the eye can see. Beneath those piles of dirty snow at the edge of the parking lot, underneath the layer of last year's fallen leaves, new life is beginning. We may not be able to see those little green shoots yet, but they are there. More than the eye can see.

The same thing can be said of the people we pass. The homeless person pushing all of her belongings in a grocery cart, the heavily-tattooed cashier, the young family at the border escaping violence in their home country, they are all more than we can see. Their histories, their challenges, their hopes and dreams, and, most importantly, the divine spark within them, are all invisible to our naked eye, yet a real part of each person.

In "Fratelli Tutti," Pope Francis tells us, "For Christians, the words of Jesus have an even deeper meaning. They compel us to recognize Christ himself in each of our abandoned or excluded brothers and sisters." #85.

As we pray, fast and offer works of charity this Lent, may we do so with attentiveness to the reality invisible to our naked eye...to Christ himself in each other human being.

St. Hilary Pastoral Council Nominations due April 1

Nominations are being accepted for St. Hilary Parish Pastoral Council (PPC). There are two seats opening this year! PPC functions as an advisory board and representation of the parishioner population to Fr. Steve. Serving on Parish Council is a wonderful way to grow in faith, learn about the ministries available at St. Hilary, and an opportunity to shape the future vision and goals of our parish.

In addition to serving as a conduit between Parish Council and our many ministries, the scope of Council's discussion includes:

Identifying the needs of the parish,
Planning how to meet those needs,
Setting goals for the parish and ways to meet those
goals, and

Evaluating our progress in light of those goals.

Council meetings are held 10 times a year on the fourth Tuesday, 7-9 p.m. Members normally serve a three-year term and may serve no more than two consecutive terms. To qualify as a Parish Council candidate, nominees must meet the following requirements: (1) Must be an active and registered parishioner of St. Hilary Parish, (2) Must be 18 years or older, (3) Must be in full communion with the Church, (4) Able to work collaboratively with others, (5) Only one household member can be on Parish Council at one time.

The deadline for nominations is **April 1, 2025**. All nominees are invited to attend the April 22, 2025 Parish Council meeting to observe the council in action. New members will be selected through a process of discernment during the May meeting. New Council members will then be invited to attend the June 24 meeting where they will be commissioned for their term which will begin with the August meeting.

- 2. Decrease the amount of grassy areas requiring maintenance

- 4. Avoid fertilizers, herbicides, pesticides, and watering lawns
- 5. Plant trees
- 6. Support the local Metroparks: visit, volunteer, and support levies
- 7. Support organizations dedicated to land conservation like the Western Reserve Land Conservancy, The Conservancy for Cuyahoga Valley National Park, The Nature Conservancy, or the Trust for Public Land
- 8. Ask governmental officials to increase funding for state and national parks and forest areas



Holy Thursday Collection

As we begin our Lenten journey, our 3% Outreach will provide information and stories on how the generosity of St. Hilary Parish has contributed in helping feed and nourish the many thousands of hungry families and individuals over the many years with the help of the Holy Thursday Collection. We work with St. Bernard's Catholic Church in downtown Akron, Blessed Trinity Parish on North Hill in Akron, and now the satellite program with North High School. You have touched so many lives with your generous donations year after year.

Deborah Gisewhite, head of the food pantry at Blessed Trinity where our former Assistant Pastor, Father Joe Warner is now Pastor, shares: "In 2024 our Pantry served 3,755 families—an increase of 12% over 2023."



When you donate to our Blessed Trinity Food Pantry, it supports three food programs. The first program allows families to pick up a three-day supply of food which includes meat, vegetables/fruit and starch items as well as toiletries. The second program delivers food to the homes of disabled or homebound persons. The third program helps support a pantry at North High School to provide food items for students in need of weekend sustenance during the school year.

Debbie shares, "A few months ago a senior gentleman started visiting the pantry with two young boys. I usually have some small snacks on hand for kids and these young boys were so polite that the next visit I personally went out to see them. The gentleman told me that he had married a young woman and due to a sad circumstance has been left to raise the boys on his own—and there are actually three boys. He was forced to retire from his job and he homeschools the boys. I eventually met the third boy who was as polite as the other two. The family visits our pantry on a monthly basis as he is on a fixed income and they have really inspired the pantry staff with the joy that they give,"

Follow along over the next few weeks to learn more about these food pantry programs. Please know that everyone is a volunteer and that everything you give will go directly to serve the hungry. God Bless you during this Lenten Season.


