

## Gospel Reflection

#### **Reflecting on the Scriptures**

Today those of us celebrating a Scrutiny with our Elect who plan to be baptized at Easter will hear the gospel of the Samaritan woman at the well from John's gospel. The rest of us will hear from the gospel of Luke, the story of the barren fig tree. In solidarity with our Elect, let us take this time to focus on our own baptism, which we can do as we reflect on each of those gospel stories. But first a history lesson.

After World War II, theologians around the world struggled to make sense of the Holocaust. Most of the those who gathered Jews into railroad cars and took them to the death camps to be exterminated were themselves baptized Christians. How could baptism into Jesus fail to motivate those soldiers to resist such evil?

And now, the gospels for today. I suggest they both tell us that our relationship to Jesus it's not simply a private affair. It is supposed to bear fruit.

The Samaritan woman at the well, after her conversation with Jesus acts on what she has heard. John tells us that after the disciples returned, "The woman left her water jar and went off into the town. She said to the people: "Come and see someone who told me everything I ever did! Could this not be the Messiah?' And they set out from the town to meet him.... Many Samaritans from the town believed in him on the strength of the woman's word of testimony." Her experience of Jesus moved her to action.

In the gospel from Luke, the poor barren fig tree was in danger of being cut down until the gardener begged for a brief reprieve: Please let it live one more year while I fertilize it. If it still doesn't bear fruit, then cut it down, he suggested.

Most of us who will hear these gospels today are baptized into Christ Jesus. Let us ask ourselves some hard questions. If I can hear about civilians being targeted by bomb-carrying drones and do nothing... If I learn about individuals who have had their livelihood imperiled without due process and do nothing... If I know about life-saving food and medicine rotting in warehouses while poor people die outside those doors and do nothing...then, my baptized brothers and sisters, what fruit has my baptism born in me?

## St. Hilary Pastoral Council Nominations due April 1

Nominations are being accepted for St. Hilary Parish Pastoral Council (PPC). There are two seats opening this year! PPC functions as an advisory board and representation of the parishioner population to Fr. Steve. Serving on Parish Council is a wonderful way to grow in faith, learn about the ministries available at St. Hilary, and an opportunity to shape the future vision and goals of our parish.

In addition to serving as a conduit between Parish Council and our many ministries, the scope of Council's discussion includes:

Identifying the needs of the parish,
Planning how to meet those needs,
Setting goals for the parish and ways to meet those
goals, and

Evaluating our progress in light of those goals.

Council meetings are held 10 times a year on the fourth Tuesday, 7-9 p.m. Members normally serve a three-year term and may serve no more than two consecutive terms. To qualify as a Parish Council candidate, nominees must meet the following requirements: (1) Must be an active and registered parishioner of St. Hilary Parish, (2) Must be 18 years or older, (3) Must be in full communion with the Church, (4) Able to work collaboratively with others, (5) Only one household member can be on Parish Council at one time.

The deadline for nominations is **April 1, 2025**. All nominees are invited to attend the April 22, 2025 Parish Council meeting to observe the council in action. New members will be selected through a process of discernment during the May meeting. New Council members will then be invited to attend the June 24 meeting where they will be commissioned for their term which will begin with the August meeting.

#### St. Hilary Creation Care Ministry

As spring brings forth renewed life we invite you to observe and enjoy the native plants rejuvenating in the garden bed outside the gathering area windows (adjacent to Faith Lutheran). This is the beginning of the parish's St. Kateri Habitat - a living, sacred space highlighting the harmonious coexistence of faith and ecological stewardship. In North America, native plants (a key component to St. Kateri habitats) are species that were present in a location prior to the arrival of European settlers. Straight native species refers to a native species that evolved without cultivation or hybridization. "Varietals" or "nativars" are found naturally in the wild, but with a specific mutation that makes them desirable to select and propagate. A "Cultivar" is a native species not occurring naturally in the wild. They are created by hybridized breeding or vegetative cloning/propagating. Often cultivar seeds are sterile or will revert back to one of the parents. All native plants are better than non-natives in supporting local ecology, but straight natives are most ideal. Consider adding some native plants to the landscape around you. There are several native plant nurseries in the area. Plants in the St. Kateri Habitat were procured from Avonlea Gardens in Chardon, OH and Scioto Gardens in Delaware, OH., but other nurseries in the area have a selection of native species. The Summit Metroparks is hosting a Native Plant Festival May 17 at Munroe Falls Metro Park with much more information and vendors on site.


## Summit Adult Services: Compassionate Care for Older Adults


