

Gospel Reflection

On this 5th Sunday of Lent we are blessed with Gospel stories rich in stark images: a woman caught in the very act of adultery brought before Jesus so he could approve of her stoning...a gospel most of us will hear...and the dramatic emergence of Lazarus from his tomb, proclaimed at the liturgy for those who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil. In both gospels, Jesus is rescuing someone from death. In both gospels Jesus is calling someone to a new life.

Powerful words and images come to mind when hearing both stories. Empathy...compassion...throwing stones...judging dying...rising to new life. Clearly Jesus is empathizing with Martha and Mary, sharing in their grief at the death of their brother Lazarus. In being asked to weigh in on the death sentence for the woman caught in adultery, Jesus remains silent, and instead begins writing in the sand. Some scholars speculate he is listing the sins of the accusers. That would fit with the words he finally speaks: "Whoever is without sin may cast the first stone." When Jesus finally looks up, no one is left but the woman. After observing that no one has condemned her, Jesus simply says, "Neither do I...go and sin no more." Note: the reprieve is unasked for. It is freely given by Jesus, with the admonition to change her life. An example of compassion? It would seem so. What a lesson for us at this time in our history, as a church and as a country.

During this season of Lent we are called to enter more deeply into our baptismal call; to immerse ourselves in what it means to be a disciple. And that is not easy, especially now. Think about the images and words in today's gospels. How many **verbal stones** do we cast at one another these days, especially at those with whom we vehemently disagree? How much empathy do we have for the thousands whose lives have been impacted because of new government cutbacks? Not surprisingly there is a debate going on about the danger of being too "empathetic" when making governmental, budgetary decisions. In fact, on a recent podcast, a current official observed that "the fundamental weakness of Western civilization is empathy."

Jesus would have had his work cut out for him at this time, in this place! Which means we Christians are called to do even more. Some of us, along with Temple Israel, Faith Lutheran, New Hope Baptist and Prince of Peace Baptist are trying to do just that by participating in our justice series; "How to Disagree With Love and Respect." It is usually more satisfying to throw verbal stones at those with whom we disagree. But this week let us refrain from using harsh words and judging others' motives. Instead, let us reflect on the ways we can be empathetic participants in life's challenges. It's what Jesus would expect us to do.

Inspiration for our lives today: praying for and supporting those who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil as they enter their final two weeks of preparation. Resisting the current tendency to label and demonize others who don't share our political view. Examining our participation in judgmental words and actions during this time of challenge and change in our country. The opening prayer of today's liturgy calls us to a better way to live as followers of Jesus: "By your help...Lord our God, may we walk eagerly in that same charity with which, out of love for this world, your Son handed himself over to death." That is indeed, a high bar for each of us this Lent.

St. Hilary Creation Care

Water, as provided by God in today's first reading, is such a precious resource. As stewards of this water, we need to be conscious of the amount of water we are using and reduce when possible. Even in places like Ohio, a water-rich area, water conservation is important. Highly developed areas can reduce the amount of rainwater returning to aquifers through the ground by 35% compared with undeveloped areas. Even when absorbed by the ground, it still takes a long time to return to the aquifer. Water returning to the system through the drain requires resources to treat the water before it can be reused, so reducing water usage reduces these required resources, too.

We can reduce the amount of water we use by:

- Switching to low flow shower heads, washers, and dishwashers
- Turning off the water while brushing teeth or shaving
- Fully loading washers and dishwashers before running
- Fixing leaky faucets and toilets
- Reducing outside watering especially if it is on a timer and there is rain in the forecast

2024 Statistics for St. Bernard Three Hunger Programs

- The Morning Sandwich Program passed out 24,720 bagged lunches (averaging 2,060/month
- The Hot Meal Program served 6,048 people with a nutritious meal (averaging 504 people for 4 meals/ month) Plus warm clothing, blankets and personal hygiene were given to people
- The Food Pantry served 1,476 households. This was 3,384 people that were provided with groceries (averaging 123 households and 282 people/month)
