

Gospel Reflection

It is Palm Sunday, the beginning of the holiest week in our Christian calendar. It is a week when we should really get serious about spending time in prayer and reflection, and importantly, in immersing ourselves in the liturgies. Holy Thursday-Good Friday-Easter Vigil are considered one, ongoing liturgical movement—the Triduum. Only the Easter Vigil ends with a closing blessing!

So let us take time this week to contemplate those words and phrases that ground our faith and discipleship, that retell the story of Jesus' dying and rising, that bring us together as community to walk with him on his final journey.

Let us ask ourselves, how do these words, these events touch our lives here and now? How do they resonate and inspire us as we embrace the challenges of each day? How do they inform the way we are present to others? The way we embrace those who are suffering? The way we refrain from judging? The way we forgive?

My God, my God, who have you abandoned me? (Psalm 22)

...Jesus emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. (Philippians, Palm Sunday)

After arriving at the Mount of Olives, Jesus prayed, saying, "Father, if your are willing, take this cup away from me; still, not my will but yours be done." When he rose from prayer and returned to his disciples, he found them sleeping from grief. (Luke, Palm Sunday)

"Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." (Luke, Palm Sunday)

So when he had washed their feet and put his garments back on...he said to them, "Do you realize what I have done for you...? (John, Holy Thursday)

When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Behold your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his home. (John, Good Friday)

After this, Joseph of Arimathea, secretly a disciple of Jesus for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate if he could remove the body of Jesus. And Pilate permitted it. Nicodemus...also came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes...They took the body of Jesus and bound it with burial cloths along with the spices...In the garden was a new tomb in which no one had been buried. So they laid Jesus there..." (John, Good Friday)

St. Hilary Creation Care

The Lake Erie-Ohio River Wastershed Drainage Divide splits both Summit and Medina counties. Northern areas drain to Lake Erie while water in the southern regions ends up in the Ohio River. In the US, more than \$450 billion in foods, fiber, manufactured goods and tourism depend on clean, healthy watersheds. Protection of watersheds starts at a very local level. Runoff from yards, roads, and parking lots into storm sewers make their way directly to rivers and streams. Fertilizer from yards and farms is designed to be water-soluble to dissolve in soil, but when too much is applied, the excess seeps into groundwater and storm sewers. Dirt, sand, and other particulate material from parking lots and streets (with metal and other heavy contaminants) wash off into urban streams and exist as contaminated river sediment for years.

How can we help?

- Properly maintain septic systems
- Wash cars on grass to catch runoff
- Dispose chemicals properly never pour down drains, especially storm drains check with Summit County Hazardous Waste for disposal
- Collect rainwater for watering garden
- Create a rain garden from native plants to absorb contaminants
- Plant a tree or shrubbery to prevent erosion on river/ stream banks
- Pave walks, drives, and patios with water-permeable material to prevent more runoff
- Do not overfertilize
- Pick up after pets and dispose of waste in toilet or trash
- Clear trash from storm drains

Mini Reflection: I'm Catholic. I'm proud of being Catholic. But is that wordless witness really evangelization?

The Stones Will Cry Out

I have a complicated relationship with evangelization.

I don't think that we (I'm talking about 21st-century American Catholics here) have had much formation around what exactly it means to proclaim the Gospel. We don't know how to do it. We don't really want to do it. It sounds kind of scary and awkward. It sounds like knocking on strangers' doors and yelling through the keyhole, "Have you accepted Christ as your Lord and Savior?" It sounds like arguing with friends and family. It sounds like a real pain.

I'm Catholic. I'm proud of being Catholic. I do my Catholic things in my Catholic house throughout my Catholic life. But is that enough?

All Christians are called to "wordless witness" in how they live their lives, writes Paul VI in the apostolic exhortation *Evangelii Nuntiandi* — but this alone, he says, is "insufficient." We must talk about Jesus. We must name him. We must speak of his life, his promises. We must *proclaim* him.

We must be loud enough that a Pharisee would cringe at us.

And yet — and Paul VI acknowledges this — it's not actually evangelization if we do it so badly that nobody listens. If we "impose" truth on someone's conscience instead of "proposing" it. If we make the mistake of thinking there is one singular way to share Christ with the great variety of personalities that exist in this world.

Dear reader, I am running out of column space, and still I have no answers for you, or for myself. I don't know how to do it well. But I know we have to try. We have to pray. We have to reflect. We have to be patient. We have to be humble. We have to remember it's about him and not about us.

Most of all, when we find ourselves confused and retreating into silence, we must remember Christ's words: "If they keep silent, the stones will cry out."

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Where do Palm Sunday palms come from and where should they go?

Answer:

The Palm Sunday celebration has ancient origins. Beginning the liturgy "outside" the church, we symbolically reenact Christ's entry into Jerusalem. The crowds in ancient Israel waved palm branches a symbol of royalty - to welcome Jesus. These days. obtaining palms takes a lot of planning and coordination, as hundreds of thousands of churches worldwide need them on the same day! Many in the United States order palms from Florida, California, Texas, or Central America. Many companies stress the sustainability of their production and the just wages paid to their workers.

The palms used on Palm Sunday are blessed at Mass. This means they shouldn't end up in the trash! Many people weave palms into crosses or families display them in their homes. If you do not plan on displaying your palms throughout the year, they should be burned, buried, or left at the church. In the final case, the palms are burned to provide the ashes for next year's Ash Wednesday service.


