

Gospel Reflection

"Christ is Risen!"

"Truly! He is risen!"

With these words Orthodox Christians throughout the world greet and respond to one another during this Easter season. Their joy is palpable. There don't seem to be enough words to capture this incredible event. Not even our liturgies can do it.

The Easter Vigil is a good example. It has **eight** Old Testament readings, beginning with the book of Genesis and the creation story, and continuing through the call of Abraham, Moses (Exodus), the prophets Isaiah, Baruch and Ezekiel. Not all readings are required but we hear at least three (Genesis, Exodus, Isaiah). Those who celebrated the Vigil last night heard Luke's account of the resurrection. This Easter Day we hear the gospel of John. In both gospels it is **Mary Magdalene** who comes to the tomb first and finds it empty. It is she who spreads the news to the apostles. Even the disciples seem lost for words at what has transpired.

On this great feast of Easter, let us:

- Sing our hearts out with Alleluias!
- Rejoice with those newly baptized and received into the church at the vigil.
- Welcome with joy the many folks who celebrate with us today.
- Resolve to bring the hope of Christ's resurrection to the needy of our community.
- Refrain from harsh and critical words over political differences.
- Strive to be Christ's presence where it is most needed right now.
- Pray for a miracle of peace in Ukraine, Gaza, Sudan and wherever there is conflict.
- Ask God's guidance for our country and its leaders during this time of upheaval and uncertainty.
- Share Christ's love with family and friends on this joyful day.

St. Hilary Creation Care

All of today's readings underscore Jesus' indescribable metamorphosis from dying to rising. While we, too, are beneficiaries of this new life, we are also perpetrators of death, as suggested by Pope Francis in Laudato Si'. We are strangling the earth of its life with our garbage; choking the atmosphere with our pollution; poisoning water with our plastic. "All creation is groaning in labor pains even until now." (Rom 8:22)

Human beings, while capable of the worst, are also capable of rising above themselves, choosing again what is good, and making a new start...No system can completely suppress our openness to what is good, true and beautiful, or our God-given ability to respond to his grace at work deep in our hearts. (Laudato si' 205)

The outcome of this situation is in our own hands. We can decide to change our ways of consuming, of wasting, of polluting. We can commit ourselves to the birth of new life for earth, rather than disfigurement and death. The Easter message is a promise of life, not merely for human beings, but for all of creation. God has entrusted us with the fulfillment of part of that promise. How open are we to being midwives of new life?

Mini Reflection: Everybody's trying to find God. They may not admit it. They may not even know it. But the search defines them, and it defines us.

The Search

Everybody's trying to find God. They may not admit it. They may not even know it. They may talk around it, shy away from saying the name, both to others and to themselves: *God*. But I know for a fact that every person who was ever born into this world spent their lives searching for Him - somewhere, somehow, even if the only place they thought to look was in money or drugs.

It's a comforting fact, really — a reminder of how alike we all are. Catholic, Jewish, Muslim, atheist, rich, poor, Black, white. When it comes right down to it, the history of humanity is a never-ending Easter morning scene that plays in perpetuity. The sorrow, the shock, the confusion. Again and again, as each newborn baby opens his eyes, the search begins anew. Where did he go? What has happened? Where can I find him?

Catechesis isn't enough. Even those who learn about Jesus Christ, who accept his word, hang hesitantly outside the tomb, afraid to go in. Jesus' best friend — the disciple whom he loved — ran faster than Peter, so desperate he was to find his Lord. But when he got to the tomb and saw it empty, he got spooked. He froze.

Sometimes, we expect God to be right where we left Him — in a certain parish, with a certain priest, in a certain relationship, at a certain job. We show up, and we're heartbroken to see that our expectations have been turned upside down. *He's left us*, we think dejectedly, but we're wrong.

There is no one who has been abandoned by God. There are only those who stop looking for Him.

Catholic Life Explained Question:

How do I discern if a call to do something big is really from God?

Answer:

Each day we face plenty of decisions about following God: whether or not to pray, how to treat people, and how to prioritize our time. Sometimes there can be something much more significant we discern: a vocational call, a promotion at work that requires a move, or a new ministry position at church. In addition to a pro-con list or a cost-benefit analysis, here are a few things to prayerfully consider and to talk over with trusted individuals.

Does it conform to God's will revealed in the Church? God doesn't call us to do something that contradicts the moral law. Will it encourage spiritual growth? Sometimes we need to choose between multiple good options. Consider the personal impact on you and others you are responsible for, like family. Other times we might be invited to do good for others, but when we assess our other life commitments, we see that saying yes to this would actually impede our prior responsibilities in the long run. Does the call seem consistent? This isn't to say that God won't do something new. Even so, consider if the call is consistent with your gifts and abilities. Can you see a "through-line" so to speak, with how your experiences have led you to this point? Do others confirm it? Share your reflections with trusted, insightful confidantes. Have they seen the same things you have, or are they bringing up new points to consider? Humbly add their relevant points to your considerations. Don't forget your gut. After you've carefully considered everything in your mind, don't neglect your instincts. Does your heart say yes or no?
