

Gospel Reflection

Reflecting on the Scriptures

During Eastertide many of our first readings concern Paul's missionary activities. Paul is thrilled to have been commissioned by God to bring the good news to the Gentiles. His excitement leaps off the pages of scripture. We...the "Gentiles"..., so many years later, have little appreciation of this revolutionary idea.

Recall that most of those early followers of Jesus were Jews. The idea that the good news might include those "others", the Gentiles, was not universally well received. Some Jews objected to these "outsiders." Peter and Paul came to loggerheads over the issue with Peter insisting initially that to follow Christ meant to observe Jewish practices.(Gal:2) But Paul and his Spirit- infused missionary activity won the day. Christianity was to be open, welcoming and inclusive.

And characterized by love. Which brings us to today's gospel. The "new" commandment Jesus gives his disciples is to love one another. It is love which is to identify the Christian as a follower of Jesus Christ.

Today some who call themselves Christians cannot be identified by their obvious love for others. They could not honestly be described as welcoming and inclusive of others who are different. Instead of a spirituality of abundance, fueled by trust in God and love for the other, they evidence a spirituality of scarcity. Exclusive and unwelcoming, they see others as threats instead of as children of God with innate dignity.

While care and concern for others should be shared by all people of good will, we who call ourselves disciples of Jesus Christ have been given a very clear challenge: "Love one another...This is how all will know you are my disciples. "

So let us be inspired by the words of Pope Francis, written five years before his death, in his encyclical <u>Fratelli Tutti</u>: "We want to be a church that goes forth from its places of worship... to build bridges, to break down walls, to sow seeds of reconciliation. " (#269) ...For that is how true disciples of Jesus Christ should be identified.

St. Hilary Creation Care

In 2021, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops wrote in support of PFAS Action Act of 2021 (H.R.2467) noting that human and environmental health concerns are interconnected, and we must not forget that "human life is itself a gift which must be defended from various forms of debasement" (Laudato Si', no. 5).

"Per-fluoroalkyl and poly-fluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are a diverse class of compounds containing thousands of individual chemicals. Useful for non-stick and water-repellent properties, certain PFAS have been integrated into numerous household products. PFAS have also been employed in firefighting foam across the United States.

"PFAS are resistant to degradation and bioaccumulate in the environment and the human body. Prolonged exposure to these chemicals can cause cancer, thyroid problems, birth defects, and reproductive, developmental, and immune system disruptions...Pregnant and nursing mothers, and their children, are especially affected. Such exposure occurs through polluted drinking water, food, soil, dust and the use of consumer products manufactured using PFAS. The widespread utilization of these "forever chemicals" has resulted in significant environmental contamination."

Research into the removal of these chemicals has had some promising recent breakthroughs (e.g. nanocages promise to remove 80-90% from ground water). And the EPA finalized maximum contaminant levels in drinking water with measurements of local supplies to begin by 2027. As of last year, PFAS are considered a hazardous substance, but a recent EPA proposal to limit PFAS in industrial wastewater has been withdrawn.

Contact your state and federal representatives to encourage continued funding of research into PFAS mitigation and to enact limits on PFAS in industrial wastewater.

St. Hilary Students Compete in Geography Bee

St. Hilary School held its school geography bee on May 7, 2025. National Geographic has permanently discontinued its GeoBee, but St. Hilary School's bee was organized by eighth grade teacher Mr. Max Sherry to enable students in grades 5-8 to continue to learn about geography and participate in this traditional academic competition. Fifteen students competed in the bee after qualifying at the classroom level. Eighth grader Joey Olszewski won the bee, and seventh grader Chris Regula was runner-up in the competition. As the winner of the bee, Joey also received a \$500 scholarship in memory of St. Hilary School graduate Jimmy Lyons, who won the school bee for four consecutive years between 2003 and 2006, was a state bee competitor, and passed away in 2011. In addition to Joey and Chris, contestants in the bee included eighth graders Grant Peiffer, Peter Thoman and Will Warner; seventh graders Michela Guthrie, Koen Latchaw and Jenna Price, sixth graders Lucas Carvalho, Jimmy Davidson, Nick Ponomariov, and Noah Price, and fifth graders Harper Frerichs, Austin Inglett, and Charles Walker.
