

#### **Faith Formation**

### Gospel Reflection

Today we are celebrating the Solemn Feast of the Ascension of the Lord. There are two choices or "options" for the Second Reading. I am focusing on the second option, as it speaks an important message for me.

That message, from Paul's Letter to the Hebrews, is: "...let us approach with a sincere heart and in absolute trust, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed in pure water." Our hearts have been sprinkled clean, cleansed of the evil that we have done by choosing to turn away from God. All we need to do is to acknowledge God's forgiveness and be grateful for it. Remember, it s not a case of having to make ourselves worthy to be with God. God's love for us and God's offer of everlasting life for us these are gifts. We do not earn them. However, we demonstrate our love for God and our acceptance of these gifts by acting in accordance with God's desire for us truly love — God, with our neighbors and with ourselves. The key is love!

As I have written a number of times in this space over the years, I often find myself working with people in spiritual direction on one very important concept: Learning to forgive themselves. Frequently, they come with a heavy heart, troubled by the effects of poor choices they have made. Sometimes, those choices involved an impulsive action, like snapping at a spouse who interrupts their train of thought; or cursing at someone who cuts them off in traffic. Sometimes, those choices have involved a larger transgression, like intentionally committing an act of violence, slander or fraud. No matter what the "bad act" is, if we ask with a sincere heart, we can be sure that God forgives it. In fact, God is simply waiting to shower us with forgiveness and love. Celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a wonderful way to experience the full effect of God's love and mercy. It is a gift from God, via the Church, to us.

And of course, the pure water referenced in the reading is the water of our baptism. A sacrament that we celebrate again symbolically, every time we dip our fingers in the baptismal font and anoint ourselves with that fresh clean water, while making the Sign of the Cross. It's another gift of our Catholic faith! I once had a Baptist Minister say to me: "I am so envious of you Catholics, that you get to celebrate your baptism every time you go into a Catholic Church by using the water from the font to bless yourselves. I wish we had that as part of our rituals."

God's messages of mercy and forgiveness are all part of God's instruction to us regarding the importance of love. How well have I been "loving" lately?

## St. Vincent DePaul Food Collection Mary 31 & June 1



**Mini Reflection:** In today's Gospel, Jesus prays for me. And for you. And for all the people who woke up this morning and headed to Mass because, while it's true that God is everywhere, the Body and Blood of Jesus is only found in one place.

#### That the World May Believe

I love today's Gospel because, in it, Jesus prays for me.

And you.

And the guy sitting next to you at Mass. And the priest, and the altar server, and all the people in all the churches in all the towns in all the world who woke up this morning and headed to Mass because, while it's true that God is everywhere, the Body and Blood of Jesus is only found in one place.

And he prays for the barista who will sell you your coffee later today and see your crucifix and hear you say, "God bless," and think, "That's a weird necklace, and I don't believe in God," but who will one day, at her lowest point, wonder if anyone ever truly loved her, and remember the sight of that broken and bloodied Corpus.

Today, Jesus prays for the person you passed on the way into the parking lot this morning, the one who doesn't go to Mass anymore but who always walks his dog on this street, on this morning, for reasons he can't explain.

He prays for your great-great grandparents and your great-great grandchildren.

"Those who will believe in me through their word." That's me. That's you. That's us. We're the ones who believe through the word of the Apostles, who bore witness to the life and death and Resurrection of the God-Man, Jesus Christ, and whose testimony to that life is an eternal flame illuminating the understanding of every human being who will ever say, "I believe."

But if we listen to what Jesus says today, we must understand: it's not just the Apostles' job, and it's not done. It's not a book that is closed. It's a mission that is alive and ongoing, and it's as much ours as it was theirs: that the world may believe that you sent me.

## Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

#### Question:

What is Lectio Divina, and how is it associated with the Benedictine Monastic tradition, whose founder, St. Benedict, we honor on July 11?

#### Answer:

Benedict desired his monks to live in community, praying the Liturgy of the Hours together, contemplating sacred texts, and doing manual labor. The monks developed a technique to facilitate a spiritual and devotional reading of the Bible known as Lectio Divina, the holy reading of a text. This method encourages the reader to hear the biblical text with an open heart and focus on whatever God wants to highlight and then apply it to daily life.

There are variations on Lectio Divina, but essentially, the technique consists of a three-step process of reflection. When the reflection is done with a group, the responses are shared by all the participants. Once the text is selected, it is read meditatively. and the following are then explored: a word or phrase that attracts you; how and where the content of this reading touches your life today; what you believe that God wants you to do during this coming week (month, year, lifetime).

Thanks to Benedict, the Christian community has been gifted with this special way of entering into the biblical text. This week, use the Lectio Divina process on one of the readings for the coming Sunday and make a note of the life connections you are making. How is this reflection on the biblical text drawing you closer to God and others?


