



### **Faith Formation**

### Gospel Reflection

Today's gospel gives us the parable of the Good Samaritan. This is such a well-known New Testament story that even folks not very familiar with the scriptures generally know its broad outlines. In fact, it is so familiar that I'm not even going to focus on what happens between the Samaritan and the poor victim. Instead, I'd like to look at the conversation Jesus has with "the scholar of the law" before the parable even begins.

Interestingly, we are told that the scholar asked his question in order to test Jesus. "What must I do to gain eternal life?" When Jesus asks him how he reads the law, the scholar gives a great answer. His answer, to love God and love your neighbor as yourself, is a response that Jesus affirms.

But then we read that the scholar asks another question, this time "because he wished to justify himself. "He asks Jesus, "and who is my neighbor?" He knows he is required to love his neighbor as himself but wants to know, specifically, who is included as "neighbor". It sounds to me like he's looking for a "carve out", an exception to the love rule. It sounds like he wants to know if there is anyone he is *not* required to love. Like the kid who is told to eat all his vegetables and responds "all?" (unspoken... Can I leave the peas?)

And now the parable itself. Jesus decided to feature a Samaritan as the hero of the story, as one who embodies love of neighbor. He couldn't have made a more glaring choice. There was such animosity between Jews and Samaritans that they refused to speak to each other in public. I wonder if the scholar of the law was thinking, "Please, please don't tell me I have to love Samaritans as myself!"

Such animosity between groups of people!

And now the parable falls out of the gospel of Luke and into our life and times. As it is supposed to do.

People disagree. They disagree about what the problems are and they disagree about the solutions. Disagreement is not a sin against charity. But demonizing the other ...is!

Liberal? Conservative? Undocumented? Native-born? Whether demonizing others is done on a stage with a microphone or on social media, it is against the law this scholar knew well. There is no exception. There is no "carve out". There is no person or group of people we are allowed to hate.

The Samaritan treated the Jew with mercy, with kindness, with love.

Jesus' words to us, like to the scholar, are, "Go and do likewise. "

# What's Happening with the Citizens Bank Building?

Dear Parishioners, I want to give you a little update on the Citizens Bank Building, our neighbor to the West. As many of you know, the Citizens Bank has moved further west to the site of the former Core Life restaurant. The building at 2770 West Market Street is now totally vacant. The property which includes the building and ALL OF THE PARKING to the west of our church building is now potentially for lease to another entity. We have been in touch with the owner to express our interest in the property so as to preserve our ability to use it for church parking. The owner, which is a Real Estate Investment Company headquartered in San Diego California, is not interested in selling the property to anyone at this time due to a provision to protect investors in the REIT from any Capital Gains liability, and will therefore pursue a new lessee. We do not know how attractive the present building is to developers, and we suspect that any future deal will take time to materialize.

Having said that, the St Hilary Finance Council will continue to stay informed of future developments and will also continue to let the owner know of our interest in the property.

# OPEN M Laundry Detergent Collection July 19 & 20

Open M is an ecumenical ministry in South Akron bringing faith, help, and hope to those living on limited resources and those looking for a way out of poverty. They have a Free Medical and Dental Clinic. Every month on the third weekend (July 19 and 20), laundry detergent (which cannot be bought with food stamps) is collected at St. Hilary for OPEN M. We are the only church that collects this much-needed product for the clients of OPEN M. Please be generous and help out by donating a bottle or pods of laundry detergent.

### St. Hilary Creation Care Ministry

Started as a small initiative in western Australia in 2011, Plastic Free July caught on quickly as a global movement as people everywhere tried to reduce their use of plastics. The challenge is to avoid single-use plastics as much as possible through the month of July. This includes things like plastic bags, water bottles, straws, food wrappers, takeout containers, etc. It's a personal challenge to become aware of the amount of plastics in daily use and available alternatives to reduce our reliance on them. Plastic Free July is not about guilt. It's about awareness and experimenting with better habits that might stick around longer than a single month.

To start, perform a plastic audit. Look around and see what kind of plastic show up most in your daily routine. Is it food packaging? Bathroom products? Grocery store bags? You don't need a formal list - just noticing is powerful.

Next, pick an area to focus on. Trying to tackle everything at once is overwhelming. Instead, choose one area to start.

Third, swap smart, not fast. The goal is not to throw out all plastic at once. Instead, when something runs out, replace it with a plastic-free alternative.

Fourth, embrace progress, not perfection. Plastic Free July isn't about being perfect. It's about making mindful choices more often. Celebrate the changes you do make. Every choice matters.

Last, get inspired and stay connected. If you didn't sign up at the tables after mass last weekend, you can send an e-mail to <a href="mailto:sthilarycreationcare@proton.me">sthilarycreationcare@proton.me</a> to receive more information through the month. You can also follow suggestions in the bulletin in upcoming weeks. You can also connect with others in the parish to share ideas to reduce plastics use.

Not sure where to start? Start with one thing. Bring reusable containers next time you go out to eat to avoid more takeout containers. Bring your own shopping bag or avoid a bag all together if you are only getting a few items. Purchase natural fiber scrubbing products for the kitchen instead of plastic sponges or brushes with plastic bristles. Try to take steps that can continue. And remember that every steps makes a difference.

**Mini Reflection:** As Christians we know that everyone is our neighbor. It's drilled into us from the first time we hear this reading. But do we approach the victims that we see? Or do we draw away from the suffering of others in fear and confusion, thinking: "That's not my problem"?

#### **Crossing the Street**

It takes a cold, hard, godless heart to step over a wounded man on the street.

But in the parable of the Good Samaritan, the priest and the Levite didn't step over the half-dead traveler. I think we picture them doing so, in our collective imagining of this well-known story, but the words of the Gospel are quite clear. "When he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side," Jesus says of both.

So they saw him. They saw his need. It made them uncomfortable; it confused them — many scholars have said that Judaic law concerning the touching of dead bodies might have made them reluctant to approach — and so they decided the simplest way to file this situation in the Not My Problem category was to cross the street.

But that still leaves a half-dead guy on the road. And we all, 2,000 years later, still think of the priest and the Levite as cold and hard and godless — even if they didn't want to be, even if they didn't think of themselves that way — because the bottom line is, they didn't see the half-dead guy as their problem.

As Christians we know that everyone is our neighbor. It's drilled into us from the first time we hear this reading.

Well, I don't know about you, but I find myself crossing the street a lot more than I should.

There is so much pain and suffering in the world. We certainly can't begin to alleviate it all. But we have to start with the pain and the suffering that we see, that's right in front of us — even if it's something we really, really want to ignore. Even if we find it inconvenient or confusing or scary or weird.

The heroism of the Good Samaritan wasn't in his selfless actions, although those were certainly commendable. It was in his courage. "He approached the victim," Jesus said.

Can we approach the victims we see? Do we have that courage?

# Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

#### Question:

When Jesus says, "You cannot serve both God and mammon," what does he mean? What is mammon?

#### Answer:

When you hear Scripture proclaimed each Sunday, remember it wasn't originally written in English. Hebrew, Aramaic, Greek — these ancient tongues were the original language of our Old and New Testaments. Most of the time, all of the words are translated into our native language. Sometimes, a word or two is left in the original language. Such is the case in this Scripture passage.

Mammon is an ancient Aramaic word referring to money, wealth, or profit. Earthly wealth isn't bad in itself, nor does it automatically exclude us from being a disciple of Jesus. But what dominates our life? To serve money — that is, to seek accumulation of wealth for its own sake and to structure our lives around it - is morally problematic. What good is our wealth if it isn't at the service of others? What good is our wealth if its pursuit leads us to selfishness, obsession, greed, envy, and comparison? There are many things that can be opposed to our service of God — power, prestige, popularity. Ultimately, something in our lives will be our master. But there is only one God worth serving.


