



You and I are on a journey, and we have a goal. As John tells us in the Book of Revelation we are headed to, "the holy city, a new Jerusalem". In that New Jerusalem, God will wipe away every tear, no more mourning or death. The old has passed away. We hear God declare, "Behold, I make all things new."

FR. MATT'S LETTER

So that's our goal, the New Jerusalem, the holy city. To get to that goal St. Paul tells us that we have to face tribulation. There's no smooth road to the New Jerusalem. "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships," says Paul, "to enter the kingdom of God."

The question this Sunday is: What sustains us in the journey? To reach the New Jerusalem, God gives us a special food. Some of you have read The Lord of the Rings or seen the movie. It's about a journey. Frodo, accompanied by Samwise, leaves his home, the Shire, to take the evil ring to Mordor, Mount Doom. There, a consuming fire can destroy the one ring. The journey seems impossible. There are so many obstacles, vicious opposition and suffering. What sustains Frodo and Sam on the journey? You probably remember, a wonderful bread called Lembos. A small piece gives renewed energy and strength.

So it is for us. Like the Elves gave the hobbits Lembos, God gives us a wondrous bread. It sustains us as the Lembos. In a few minutes some people will bring some unleavened bread to the altar and wine. I will then pray over the bread and wine. I will ask God to send the Holy Spirit, so the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus. When you receive this Bread and Wine, it unites you intimately with Jesus and with his Church which has two dimensions: the visible Church governed by Pope Francis and the invisible Church. As we hear in the Eucharistic Prayer, the invisible Church includes Mary our Mother, St. Joseph, the Apostles, together with all the saints and angels.

This Bread unites us with Jesus and his Church, visible and invisible. It sustains us in our hardships. J.R.R. Tolkien, the author of Lord of the Rings, speaks about this Sacred Bread, the Eucharist. He actually received Communion daily. When his son was struggling with his faith, Tolkien wrote: "Out of the darkness of my life, so much frustrated, I put before you the one great thing to love on earth: the Blessed Sacrament....There you will find romance, glory, honor, fidelity, and the true way of all your loves on earth..."

Tolkien describes how the Eucharist helps us in face of hardship and discouragement. "The only cure for sagging or fainting faith," he says, "is Communion."

Most of you know that we lost our son-in-law in an automobile accident in late February. Following much thought and prayer, we have concluded that we cannot leave our youngest daughter and her 3 and 5-year-olds to do this alone. We have sold our home and will be moving to Columbus, Indiana to support them, by the end of the month. It has been my joy to serve you these past nine years and I will miss you greatly. SON Ministries, the Men's Fellowship, and the Maria Stein Shrine have been important parts of life for me here and it pains me to say farewell to all who participate in these important ministries. NW8 Bulletin Letter May 15, 2022

Dear Parishioners of NW8 Family of Parishes,

A planning committee with staff and parishioner representatives from all the NW8 family of parishes has been formed and is meeting to discuss, propose and determine a Mass schedule for the weekend Masses in the NW8 family of parishes.

There are several guidelines the Mass schedule will follow. Initially, each priest will be asked to preside at no more than three weekend Masses. Secondly, there will be at least an hour between Masses a priest will have on Sunday so there is time to prayerfully prepare before, greet parishioners after and have time to safely travel to a second Mass. A third guideline is to assess the utilization of each parish church to determine how the Mass schedule can be reduced, while still accommodating the parishioners and not over extending the clergy.

Currently, there are 14 weekend Masses in the NW8 family of parishes. With four assigned priests, we need to reduce that to 12 weekend Masses. Based on attendance, we already know that parishes in the Marion Cluster (Nativity, St. John, Precious Blood, St. Rose & St. Sebastian), as well as St. Joseph, Egypt are usually near capacity most weekend Masses. St. Augustine, Minister has a capacity of 600 and currently averages 1,500 people per weekend. This means St. Augustine could reduce to three weekend Masses and still have room with a weekend capacity of 1,800. Holy Redeemer, New Bremen has a capacity of 600 and currently averages 925 people per weekend. This means Holy Redeemer could reduce to two weekend Masses and still have room with a weekend capacity of 1,200.

The planning committee has determined that for the Marion Community portion of NW8, the weekend Mass schedule will remain as is: 5:00 PM St. John, 7:30 PM Nativity, 8:30 AM St. Sebastian, 9:00 AM Precious Blood, 10:30 AM St. John, 11:00 AM St. Rose (with the schedule of the smaller three parishes rotating every six months). The Saturday evening schedule will also remain the same in the Minster and New Bremen portion of NW8 with 4:30 PM at Holy Redeemer and 5:00 PM at St. Augustine.

Currently, the Minster and New Bremen Sunday schedule is:

8:00, 10:00 & 11:30 AM St. Augustine, 8:00 & 10:00 AM Holy Redeemer; 8:30 AM St. Joseph. The planning committee is determined three possible Sunday Mass schedules for the Minster and New Bremen portion of NW8:

8:00 AM St. Joseph, 8:30 & 10:30 AM St. Augustine, 10:00 AM Holy Redeemer 8:30 AM St. Joseph, 9:00 & 11:00 AM St. Augustine, 10:30 AM Holy Redeemer

8:00 AM St. Joseph, 9:00 & 11:00 AM St. Augustine, 10:00 AM Holy Redeemer

To assist the planning committee, there will be a "preference survey" May 21^{st} & 22^{nd} at Holy Redeemer, St. Augustine's and St. Joseph's immediately preceding the weekend Masses. Each household will be given one survey to complete. Please note this is NOT a vote, but a "survey" to assess the "preferences" of each parish. The planning committee's task is to consider the preferences of each parish, the changes and affects the new Mass schedule will have upon each of the parishes and where each parish can make adjustments for the best possible Mass schedule option for all the parishes of NW8. It is likely that each parish will need to make adjustments. The new Mass schedule will be reviewed this Fall as the full planning process continues.


