

FR. MATT'S LETTER

As we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood, the Gospel of the multiplication of food foreshadows this great mystery. St Luke provides us a clue in the verbs. In multiplying the loaves Jesus takes the bread, says a blessing, breaks the bread and gives it to the disciples to distribute. These same four verbs we hear in the Last Supper. We hear them every time we come to Mass. The priest says, "he took bread and giving thanks, broke it and gave it to his disciples". And then something that must have shocked the disciples, "This is my Body...given up for you".

The Body and Blood of Christ is food and drink for our journey, like those people Jesus miraculously fed. But the Eucharist is so much more. In the opening prayer (the collect) we heard "O God who in this wonderful sacrament have left us a lasting memorial of your Passion". Mass - the Eucharist - renews Jesus' Passion. You've probably heard that when we come Mass we are standing at the foot of the cross with Mary and John. When the priest lifts up Jesus in the Host, Jesus lifts us to the Father. Even if you are distracted, Jesus does his work.

The Mass is Jesus' work, but we have our part. In that opening prayer after speaking about the "lasting memorial" of the Passion, we pray that might "revere the sacred mysteries of your Body and Blood".

In these 2 years I've invited you to revere the mystery of Jesus' Body to come to our churches for Eucharistic Adoration.

Why do we do all this? In one way it's obvious. Jesus is God. You and I were created to worship and glorify God. When we do that, once again to quote the opening prayer, we "experience in ourselves the fruits of your redemption". Those fruits are healing, purpose, peace, all we long for.

The best that any priest can give you is the Body and Blood of Christ. The Eucharist is food in the wilderness, but much more: the memorial of God's Passion that brings us healing, purpose and peace.

O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of your Passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of your redemption.




