Gospel Meditation The Holy Family of Jesus. Marv and Joseph

The Lord is always with me.

Each year his parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when Jesus was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him (Lk 2:41-542)

The feast of Passover was one of the three great pilgrimage feasts when Jews, if at all possible, were to come to the Temple in Jerusalem.

Mary and Joseph are once again depicted a parents who faithfully followed the practices of their religion, and who made sure that their child was part of this tradition.

Mary and Joseph would have made this more than 63-mile journey on foot with other members of a large family group traveling from the northern hill town of Nazareth. It's not hard to imagine how the absence of their son could have gone unnoticed.

It is also not hard to imagine how they felt when they realized that he was not among their traveling party on the way home.

There are times, sometimes, painful times, when we don't feel that the Lord is with us. It's worse when we assume it's our own fault.

The best one to talk to about this is the Lord himself.




