3rd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Jesus brought them the best news for which they could ask. "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." He was telling them that he is the Messiah that they have longed waited for. How they received this message was not what was expected. Their response is continued in next weeks Gospel. Christ found that he was not always well received. When this occurred he moved on in a loving way and hoped that the person would change his/her mind. While he wanted all to accept him and his message, many did not. The same is true today. We proclaim the message of our saving Lord, yet there are those, some even closest to us, who do not want to receive this message with open arms. Maybe even in our own lives we have walked away from Christ for a time. Hopefully we have discovered how far less fulfilling life is without him. If we are rejected because of following the way of Christ, do not be downhearted. Instead, continue to love the person, pray for them and do what you can to show how the love of Christ is better than anything else that the world can offer. This weekend we are implementing a project of the diocese to assess the needs of our community, county, and diocese. This is based on Bishop Bonner's pastoral letter Testify to the Light. A letter has been included in our bulletin to help explain a bit more of this process. To help us get started, we are asking that all parishioners 16 and older complete one of the surveys that are located at the ends of the pews. This will be done during the homily this weekend. It is not a long survey and is easy to answer. A special committee will tabulate the results and prepare a report for our deanery (county) meeting. Our local parishes will then assemble a working document for our deanery. This will then go to the diocesan level where a needs assessment for the diocese will be developed. It is important that we have everyone's response. Completed surveys can be placed in the basket in the narthex or at the day chapel entrance. Thank you for your helping in this process by completing this survey. As we have the results for our parish, county and diocese, they will be shared with you. In an effort to keep us informed and safe, a new Safety Ministry has been formed. The Safety Ministry works to assure that our buildings and grounds are as safe as possible for all who come here. This includes having procedures in place to address weather emergencies, fire, health emergencies, personal safety and other such matters. Members work to spot and correct safety concerns, train parishioners on what to do in an emergency and keep an active roster of individuals who can be called upon for any type of emergency. Individuals who are in the safety forces, medical fields or other places and have expertise on helping in emergencies are asked to consider joining this ministry. An information meeting to find out more will take place on Thursday, February 3rd at 7:00 pm in the parish hall. Stav warm and safe this week. Fr. Chris



Gospel Meditation 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

What would you give to know the fulness of truth? Jesus Christ is the "way, the truth, and the life." Luke's introduction to the gospel is unique among the four gospels. Luke speaks in the firstperson. He addresses his friend, Theophilus, a name which means "beloved of God". In so many words he says, "I am writing to you the most incredible story humankind has known." And this story is utterly believable because it comes from reliable firsthand witnesses of those who knew Jesus Christ personally, heard his teaching, and saw his miracles, death and resurrection, and ascension to the right hand of the Father in heaven. The word "gospel" literally means "good news". The gospel is the good news of Jesus Christ and the freedom he has won for us through his death and resurrection. The gospel is God's word for us today! It's is a living word that has power to change, transform, and bring freedom and healing to those who accept it as the word of God. Are you hungry for God's word? And do you receive it with expectant faith and trust?

"Lord Jesus, you are the fulfillment of all our hopes and desires. Your Spirit brings us grace, truth, life, and freedom. Fill me with the joy of the gospel and inflame my heart with love and zeal for you and for your kingdom".


