

# A MESSAGE FROM FR. MATT

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Why do you think Elizabeth called Mary "Blessed"?

The obvious answer is right. Mary is blessed because by the overshadowing of the Holy Spirit, Mary has conceived in her womb the long awaited Messiah. Mary knows that God has chosen her to bring forth His Son. Mary knows it because the Angel Gabriel told her. This Child will change everything. God has come down from Heaven to be one of us. To be God-with-us. This is Who is inside of Mary. And Mary knows it.

But does Elizabeth know it? I think for sure that there was an amazing moment that gave Elizabeth some clarity. The moment she heard Mary's greeting. Elizabeth knew that her son John would play an important role in the coming of the Messiah. When she felt the child in her womb leap for Joy at hearing Mary's voice and at that moment she knew Who was in the womb of her cousin Mary. It is an amazing, out of this world moment. But what Elizabeth says to Mary gives us an insight into the way that Mary was blessed in herself. In a not so out of this world way.

Elizabeth says, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." Is this just two ways of saying that Mary is blessed because of Who she is carrying? Maybe. Probably. But the answer to Elizabeth's next question may give us something to think about. Elizabeth asks, "And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" What is the answer? It isn't something supernatural. It is found in the very first line of the Gospel passage for this week. "Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste." How does it happen that Mary came to help Elizabeth? It happened because Mary decided to do it!

Think about it. Mary has just learned the most amazing news in the history of history. She is newly pregnant, probably scared, probably not feeling great. Her whole life, all of her plans and goals, have been turned on their heads. If anyone could be excused of thinking of themselves for a minute, for taking a beat to take this huge news and huge change in, it is Mary. But Mary doesn't do that. When Mary hears that Elizabeth, many years older than her, is pregnant, she puts herself aside and goes to help Elizabeth. Mary puts the needs of others before her own. She doesn't



think about herself. It isn't all about her. To Mary, God is first. She has shown that by saying yes. To Mary, others are second. She has shown that by going in haste to help Elizabeth. To Mary, she herself is third.

Now listen, I am not saying that the whole baby leaping in the womb part isn't a sign of Mary's blessedness. But on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception we talked about the fact that Mary is not to be seen as separate or so different from us that we could never be her peer. The whole reason for Jesus' coming is that we could see this as our destiny. Mary is the best of humanity. She is what God made each of us to be. To be fully human, like Mary, is the reason that God gives us the Church and Sacraments, that little by little we can become more like the Mother of the New Creation, more like Mary. So today we are given an example to follow that we might do that.

Mary is indeed Blessed in that she is the Mother of Our Lord. But that singular role is not the only way, lest we think that we cannot emulate her. She is blessed and she is a blessing to Elizabeth because she showed up to help. She has a generous heart. She puts God first, others second and herself third.

Keep this example of blessedness in your heart as we approach Christmas. Be a blessing to your family and friends this week. Keep God first and put the needs of others before your own. Be a blessing to everyone who encounters you. Be like Mary.






#### Families,

No doubt you have heard the saying: "The family that prays together stays together". This is so true. But we should not be satisfied with merely having our family stay together. We should want more, much more. 



### CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD (CGS)

CGS is a gift that appeared to our parish over 12 years ago. It is a way of religious formation for children that is quite different from the published programs. It does not use a catechetical series of books or take place in a classroom. In this approach, there is a room prepared for the children in which every object is a help to knowing God. It is a place of simplicity and order, prayer and work, and community. Everything in this room, known as the ATRIUM, is intended to be appropriate to the ages and sizes of the children who are there. It is their religious needs that guide the catechesis. The atrium allows the children to come into contact with Scripture, the liturgy (mass) of the Church, and for the older ones, the whole of sacred history. The qualities most noticeable about the materials in the atrium are their simplicity and their order. Each material has its own place on the Scripture shelf or the liturgical shelf. There are other centers in the room as well----a Baptism area, an altar table, a geography area, a prayer corner. Above all, the room has a certain solemnity. The young child is shown how to walk slowly and speak softly so that, even though everyone is busy and active, an atmosphere of silence permeates the atrium. Catechists (those trained to present and facilitate the child's relationship with God) have observed that the atrium becomes even more important to older children. It is a respite from the pace and pressure of the modern child's life. CGS sessions offer to children of all ages time to listen, work, learn, pray, sing, wonder, rest, and discuss scripture passages. In the silence of the atrium, children make the first discovery that they have an inner life. The program fosters a foundational belief that even the youngest children are already in a relationship with God. The Holy Spirit leads them to meditate and ponder what has been proclaimed from Scripture.



The CGS takes its name from the parable of the Good Shepherd (John 10:3-5, 11-16). This parable is basic in the formation of a moral person. One who enjoys a relationship with God, a relationship of deep peace, a real relationship of being in love. The primary goal of CGS is to allow young children to see who God really is and watch Him draw them close as His true followers. When children come to understand and love God early on, they will be equipped with what is necessary to live a spiritually moral life filled with Christian virtues listening to God's calling. CGS has three levels. Level I (ages 3-6), Level II (grades 1-3), Level III (grades 4 - 5 presently, but equipped for 4-7). Our CGS started in the back of the hall with five children. We have grown slowly and carefully resulting in Level I, II, and III for a total of forty-four children!

#### CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD (CGS) cont.

CGS is the faith-formation direction of the Catholic Church for many reasons after many years of study. Children under six are now truly "wiser beyond their years" due to everyone and everything they are exposed to long before they enter school. Therefore, the goal and vision of the Catholic Church and CGS is that faith foundation and parish community need to be a larger part of a child's young life. A child's growth includes all aspects of body and mind, heart, and spirit. It is important that while we are providing wonderful blessings, advancements and experience to our younger children, a younger relationship with God as well as a true understanding of scripture, liturgy and our Catholic Faith must also be included. This will ensure that the mysterious bond uniting a young innocent child with God will not be

compromised by our worldly advancement and super intelligence. The long-term

Diocese goal is that consistent CGS instruction will be provided and built-upon
for every child from toddler age through their committed adulthood to the Catholic Church. In the months to follow, we will be providing details of each CGS
Level. Also, please listen for God's calling to assist with CGS as a catechist, aid, or
helper with classroom materials needed.




