THE EPIPHANY *of the Lord*

"Since from you shall come a ruler,
who is to shepherd my people Israel." - Mt 2:6b



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It is Epiphany Sunday! For me, it is one the most cherished Days of the year. I have told you about the most memorable Epiphany Mass in which I have participated. It wasn't in a church. It was in my parent's bedroom. All of my brothers and sisters, nieces and nephews, my uncle Fr. Bob, and my dad and mom were there. It was the day that my mom died. It was without a doubt, the most beautiful Epiphany Mass I ever celebrated. It was the perfect setting for this feast. Why? Wasn't it terrible and sad? Yes. But it was also filled with a sense of God's blessing. It didn't make it less sad. In fact, it made the sadness even more real. But, the setting and situation also made the feeling of hope and blessedness more real too.

In the first reading, Israel is given this great news of extravagant promises from God. Light will come! Blessings will stream to them! Jerusalem will be the beacon of blessedness filled with riches uncountable and the grace of God! But, do you know what Jerusalem looked like when it heard this proclamation from the Prophet Isaiah? It was a ruin, a shambles, not a single building or house was standing. All was rubble. The people of Israel had just returned from exile. They found their homes destroyed. Yet God says, "Stick with me!" Rise up in splendor Jerusalem! God's Glory shines upon you!

In the Gospel, the three kings, wise men, magi, whatever we want to call them, follow a star to greet the New Born King. When they arrive, they do not find splendor in the earthly sense. They find poverty, a homeless family living in a cave surrounded by animals. A desperate situation, even if we like to romanticize it with our manger scenes sometimes. Yet in the midst of deprivation and desolation, they recognize and greet the new king - baby in a feeding trough.

So you see, I think that setting, in my parent's bedroom, just a few hours before my mom died, filled with crying kids, and crying adults, and crying priests and a desperately sick woman, was the perfect place to celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. It's how God does His thing. His Glory and Splendor shine brightest in the most desolate situations.

So answer this question. How is your life right now? I hope it's filled with good stuff, and peace and prosperity and promise. I hope you have no worries, but I know that you probably have many. God's message to you this Epiphany, whatever the situation, but especially if you are facing some desperate stuff, is "Rise up!" Your light has come. God wants to shed his Glory upon you! Jerusalem rose up and rebuilt, trusting in God's words. You, no matter your situation, can too. Rise up and follow the star.

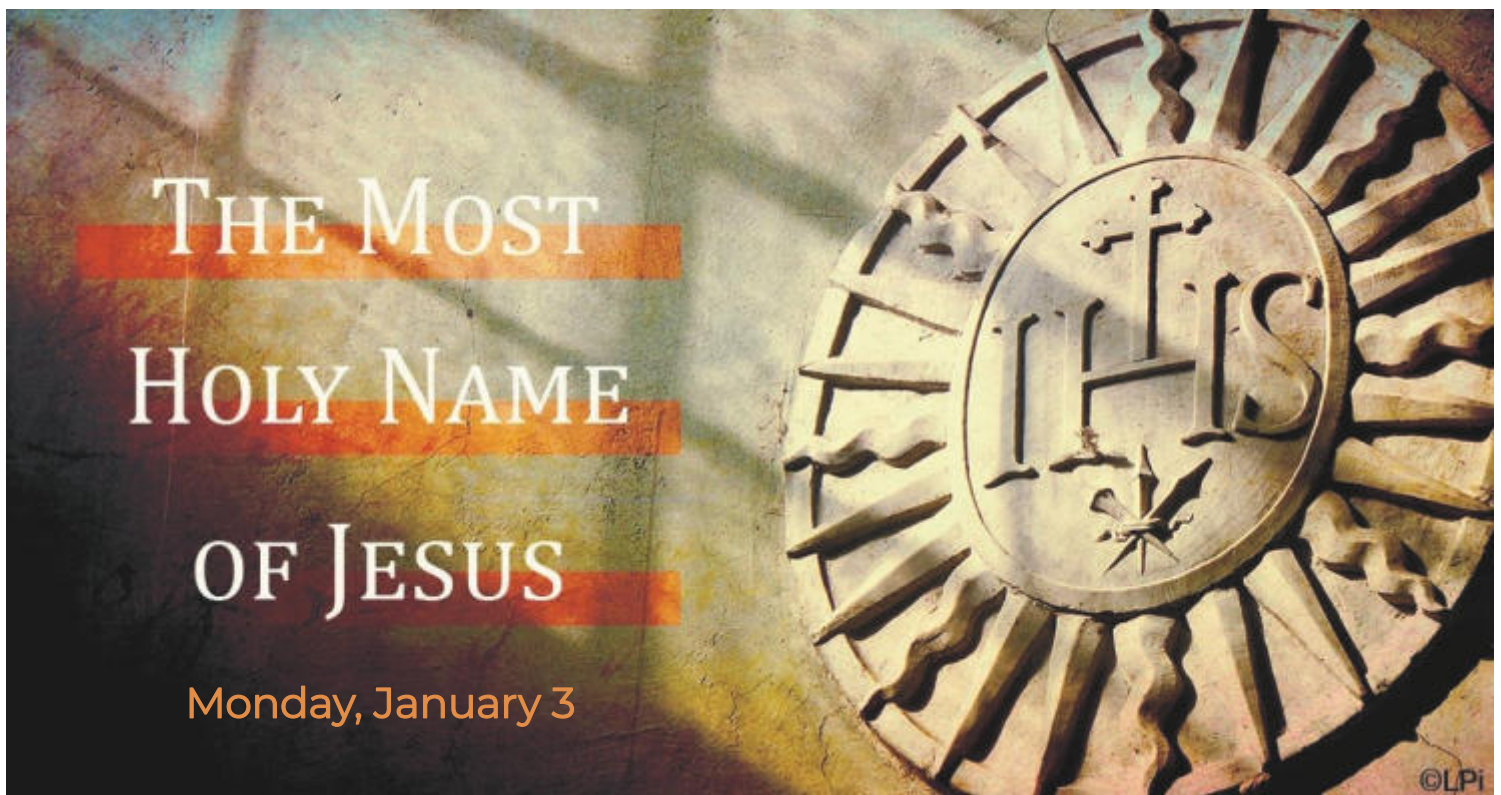

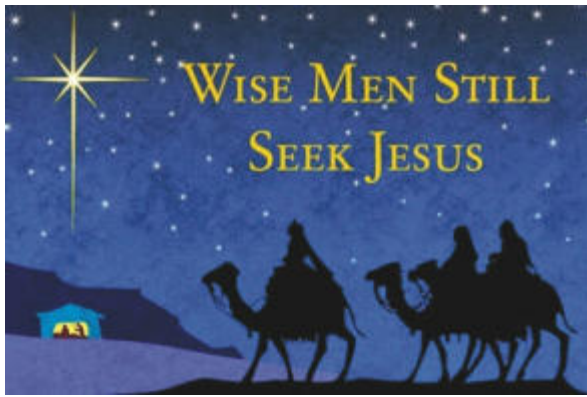

Epiphany Blessing of the Home 20 + C + M + B + 22

On the Feast of the Epiphany, the family gathers to ask God's blessing on their home and on those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows. A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk to write above the home's entrance. The letters have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the Three Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar who were sanctified by their adoration of the infant Jesus. They also abbreviate the Latin words, "*Christus mansionem benedicat,*" meaning, "May Christ bless this house." Please take an 'Epiphany Kit' home with you to bless your home with your family.

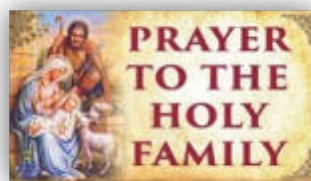

LIFE Butler County Serves Low Income Elders in Their Homes
Are you struggling or overwhelmed, trying to work and take care of a parent, spouse or other family member in addition to everything else you have to do? Do you sometimes have to call off for a day or even longer in order to provide the support needed to help that person remain safe in their home? Do you know someone who is and wish you could help? If so, LIFE Butler County may be able to help you! The LIFE Butler County program, a partnership of Lutheran SeniorLife and the Butler Health System, is a comprehensive health care and supportive services program designed to enhance the ability of frail, low income, older adults to live safely in their homes and communities with dignity, respect, and independence. LIFE can provide the following services: An interdisciplinary team including physicians, nurses, social workers, dietitians, recreational coordinators, and rehabilitation therapists, An on-call nurse and physician available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, Adult day health care services, including recreational programs, Personal care, Housekeeping and laundry, Physical, Occupational and Speech Therapies, Transportation to the LIFE center and to medical appointments, Medication management, Assistance with meal preparation, Medical equipment, Dentistry, Optometry, and Audiology.

The LIFE program is available to all eligible residents of Butler County. To be eligible to enroll in LIFE, a person must meet the following requirements: Be 55 years of age or older Reside in Butler County Have difficulty managing his or her own health-related needs independently at home and meet a level of care determined by the Butler County Area Agency on Aging Be eligible for Medicaid or able to pay privately Be able to remain safely in their home environment with the addition of LIFE services There are no co-pays or deductibles for care and services provided to individuals who qualify. The LIFE program is a part of the national PACE program (Program of All Inclusive Care for the Elderly), which has been successful across the nation. Lutheran SeniorLife operates LIFE programs in Armstrong, Beaver, Butler and Lawrence counties. 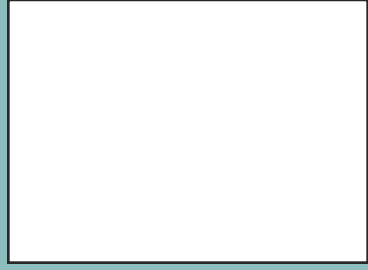
