


### A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MATT



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It's wedding season!

Now I know that maybe you'd say, no, wedding season is in the summer or fall or any other time when the weather is above freezing! But I am telling



you that this is indeed wedding season. I can say that because this weekend I have a wedding for two great young people, Sam and Abby. Now every wedding is special, but these guys really upped their game, because the groom and his groomsmen not only grew mullets for the wedding, they got their mullets permed! If you have never seen a permed mullet, you need to. It is remarkable to say the least. But not only is there a wedding this weekend, there is also a 50th wedding anniversary for another great couple, Larry and Kay. No permed mullets for them, I don't think, but what a remarkable achievement! So you see, as cold as it is, it is wedding season for sure. In fact, I think it is a great time to get married.

Our Readings this week are also filled with stuff about weddings. God really loves weddings. The Bible kind of begins with a wedding, for Adam and Eve in the Book of Genesis, and it ends in the Book of Revelation with the Wedding Feast of the Lamb. So weddings are important to God. We see wedding imagery in the First Reading where Isaiah tells us the Lord delights in us and that we shall be "espoused" to the Lord. Wow that sounds pretty intimate, doesn't it? It is. Just as a husband and a wife share their whole lives with each other, along with all of the ups and downs, the good and bad, God wants to share His life with us. And God wants us to share our lives, every part of our lives, with Him. Every part? Yes.

In the Gospel passage for today, where we hear the story of the Wedding at Cana, people often focus on the miracle. It is a cool miracle. Jesus turns water in to wine! Or they focus on Our Lady, not only the faith that Mary has in her Son, but also the way that Jesus listens to her plea. These are good things to focus on, don't get me wrong! But there is an important question that we might leave out if we stop there. Why does Jesus finally decide to perform this miracle? You might answer that He does it because His mom said to, and you wouldn't be wrong. You might say that Jesus and Mary didn't want the couple to be embarrassed, and you wouldn't be wrong. But I think even deeper than that is the fact that once the wine was gone, the party would be over, and Jesus had just gotten there! I know, it doesn't sound exactly right, but the thing is, Jesus wanted to be with these people, not just to show His power, or His fidelity to His mom, or His kindness in wanting to save them from embarrassment, but because Jesus loves people! Jesus wanted to be at a party with the people He loves so much, He would die for them!

Let that sit with you a little this week. Jesus loves people. Jesus loves you! Jesus wants to share His whole life with you. Jesus wants you to share your whole life with Him. Not just the "Holy parts." Jesus doesn't just want the cleaned up version of you. Sure, He loves the white dress and the ties, but He also loves the permed mullet parts of our lives too! This week do your very best to invite Jesus into every moment of your life. Invite Him to the party that is you. Don't push Him away from a moment in your life because you think it is too intimate or even too bad for Him. He is your maker. He knows it all. He turned water into wine. He can take anything you share with Him and make it better.

It is indeed wedding season! It is a great time to get married. Invite Jesus. Let Him come. He can make all things better. He makes all things new.

In a continuing commitment to care for the health, safety, and spiritual well-being of the faithful, in the Diocese of Pittsburgh, Bishop David Zubik announces the following **updated COVID-19 Safety Protocols**. These practices are effective immediately and until

further notice. The updates are based on the dramatic surge in community spread of the Omicron variant of the COVID-19 virus, and will be re-evaluated on an ongoing basis.

- As leaders in their parishes and in the community, unless extraordinary circumstances warrant otherwise, all priests and deacons must wear masks during the celebration of Mass at all times, including when preaching and at the altar.
- •Everyone entrusted with the distribution of Holy Communion must wear a mask, and must also sanitize their hands immediately prior to distribution. Care must be taken not to directly touch the communicant, especially if distributing on the tongue. If contact is made, the person distributing Holy Communion must re-sanitize their hands before continuing.
- •All Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, servers, greeters, ushers, lectors, and cantors must wear a mask. In addition, faith formation leaders, catechists, and those who visit the sick or homebound must wear a mask.
- •Choir members are to be masked at all times.
- •The presentation of the gifts is suspended.
- •As already directed, the practice of shaking hands to offer the Sign of Peace is suspended.
- •As also previously directed, those attending Mass are urgently encouraged to wear masks, regardless of vaccination status. Based on their age, health history, and family considerations, parishioners must make prudent decisions regarding getting vaccinated, wearing a mask, and staying home if not feeling well. As a reminder, anyone who is sick, feels they are at risk, or is a primary caregiver, as well as those who have serious anxiety about being part of a large group at this time are excused from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass.
- •It is strongly recommended that any parish events outside of Holy Mass are to either be cancelled, rescheduled, or be held virtually. All meetings should be held virtually.
- •Events that must be held should follow the above mitigation protocols.




