*Our Lady Discussion on Justice Theme: Option for the Poor and Vulnerable
July, 2021*

Our topics each month revolve around **Education, Prayer and Action**, and each are related to one of the **7 Themes of Catholic Social Teaching on Justice**. We hope to spur thought, and spark your interest in learning or doing more.

What Does Option for the Poor and Vulnerable Mean Exactly?

According to the US Catholic Bishops a basic moral test of any society is how our most vulnerable members are faring and being treated, especially in a society marred by deepening divisions between rich and poor; the haves and have nots. Traditionally in our Catholic history, this meant the poor and indigent. Vulnerable in today's society can mean those outcast, disregarded, and endangered populations such as the homeless, the elderly in care facilities, the mentally ill, or runaway and trafficked youth.

The primary purpose of this commitment to the poor is to enable them to become active participants in the life of society (USCCB).

Scripture related to this theme: "As you did it to one of these, the least of my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt 25:40).

What does Our Lady do?

Our Lady acts on this theme in many ways, including our support of The Haven of Portage Homeless Shelter project (to open Fall 2021) that will provide shelter, counseling and preparation for employment; the Center of Hope food kitchen in Ravenna; and support for local nursing homes and the homebound.

Our parish also displays this value in the Acts of Mercy displayed on the exterior wall as you enter the parish hall.

>Our Projects and Activities:

- Our annual 'blessing bag' collection of toiletries, socks and essentials for the homeless.
- Our Lady's holiday letter and card writing to homebound parishioners from parish families and Faith Formation classes.
- Support for the Catholic Charities Annual School Supplies Drive and Bishop's Appeal
- Service Day Nursing Home and homebound projects

>What Can I do? It's easier than you think. Many hands working in small ways is how change happens.

Learn: Knowing the causes of homelessness and poverty can provide new ways to think about and act on the problem.

- Homelessness is not a choice. It is often a result of addiction, access to mental health care, or domestic violence
- Most 'homeless' people don't live on the street; they are foster children who aged out of the system and stay with friends, multiple families living in close conditions, and those employed but who can only afford weekly-rate motels.
- 25% of the homeless are children
- A significant number of veterans with untreated PTSD are homeless or unable to hold down a job.

Pray: Praying for justice is not only a solo experience—pray at your family table, post your thoughts and prayers on social media, or join a vigil or prayer chain for justice.

Prayer for the month: *Father, through your Son and by the power of the Holy Spirit, help us to recognize your face in all those affected by poverty and fill us with the love and fortitude we need to confront its causes. Let us pray for the poor, hungry, and neglected all over the world, that their cries for daily bread may inspire works of compassion and mercy among those to whom much has been given. Amen.*

Act: It's easier than you think.

- Support or volunteer for Habitat for Humanity; "Building strength, stability and self-reliance through structures" (<https://www.habitat.org>). Donate to or shop at your local Re-store (Kent, Newbury, North Randall) to fund projects.
- Help Haven of Portage prepare for their fall opening by sorting donations or sharing your talent as tradesman (contact Martha slpmap2000@yahoo.com)
- Volunteers will be needed for mentoring, life skill training, cooking lessons (in the future). See Haven's volunteer training days at <https://www.portagehaven.org/volunteer-training>
- If you are an employer consider partnering with veteran placement organizations. The VFW, AMVETS, Goodwill or Wounded Warrior Project are good places to start.
- Spend a day stocking shelves or serving a meal at the Center of Hope. They need volunteers! (<https://fcsserves.org/program/center-of-hope>)

>Thought from Father Shawn:

Pope Benedict XVI wrote in *Deus Caritas Est* (#34): "I must give to others not only something that is my own, but my very self; I must be personally present in my gift."

This interpersonal connection in caring for others—as an expression of our Christian faith—is what makes this work much more than what is done in humanitarian aid work, which can have a variety of motives. As people of faith, we engender our good works out of our sacramental life; and, we are constantly challenged to be present in our gift.

17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING: 2 KINGS 4: 42-44

A man came from Baal-shalishah bringing to Elisha, the man of God, wenty barley loaves made from the firstfruits, and fresh grain in the ear. Elisha said, "Give it to the people to eat." But his servant objected, "How can I set this before a hundred people?" Elisha insisted, "Give it to the people to eat." "For thus says the LORD, 'They shall eat and there shall be some left over.'" And when they had eaten, there was some left over, as the LORD had said.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM 145:

R. The hand of the Lord feeds us;
he answers all our needs.

SECOND READING: EPH 4:1-6

Brothers and sisters: I, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace: one body and one Spirit, as you were also called to the one hope of your call; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

GOSPEL: JOHN 6:1-15

Jesus went across the Sea of Galilee. A large crowd followed him, because they saw the signs he was performing on the sick. Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples. The Jewish feast of Passover was near. When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little." One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus said, "Have the people recline." Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat. When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world." Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone.




