REGISTRATION

BAPTISMS

Sunday: 12:30 PM or during any weekend liturgy. Prior to baptism of their first child, parents are required to attend a Pre-Baptism class. Please call the rectory at 216-749-0414 to schedule an interview.

MARRIAGES

Should be arranged with a priest by calling the rectory 8 months prior to the wedding date. Individual conferences, plus attendance at a pre-marriage program, are required for proper preparation.

FROM THE CORNER OFFICE...

Do you SEE IT? The star, do you see it? That can be the question between our three Kings (or, these wise-guys...). The celebration of this **Solemnity of the Epiphany of our Lord** points out the <u>Kingship of Jesus</u>. Remember that final feast day of the liturgical year, The Kingship of Jesus or Christ the King, or (even) the feast of "Our Lord, Jesus Christ, King of the Universe" ended off the year, and now we start the year with this **Epiphany** celebrating Jesus Christ, as he has come for all of us!

See in the First Reading from Isaiah telling us to, "Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem!" [and, then] "Nations shall walk by your light..." St. Paul even tells of this revelation being made to the Gentiles, as well, in the Second Reading. This is a revelation to ALL of God's children. This Gospel reading from St. Matthew presents the story of the magi following the star to Bethlehem in search of the new king. Sure this quest by the magi greatly upset King Herod as he felt his kingship was to be challenged. But this is the revelation – The Epiphany – that Jesus is now among us! That our salvation is near, as Jesus Christ, our Savior is now "in our presence. Notice if you will... savior of ALL of God's children; not just the Israelites but the Gentiles, as well. People have seen the signs in the *East* and the *West*, the *North* and the *South*. All of God's children are called to **REJOICE**!

Here are the questions; did you see the star? Did you have the revelation? Did you think about or pray over the *Epiphany of Jesus Christ* this holiday season? Like my pile of Christmas cards, here on my desk – it's never too late – keep working at it!



(John 1:1-3, 14)

Using chalk, write the first half of the current year (22), initials of the 3 Magi (C + M + B) followed by the other half of the year (22) (20+C+M+B+22). Each could be written by a different member of the household. Place this above the main entrance to your home.

ALL: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness and the keeping of your law. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our love for each other may go out to all. We ask this through Christ our Lord.
