Confirmation: Preparation begins in the Fall for those in the 7th and 8th Grade or older.


Marriage: Arrangements must be made 6 to 12 months prior to the wedding date.

From Fr. Joe's Desk...

When Reality Pushes Back

Over the centuries, many people have tried to name what it is that is distinctly human about us. Some have said that we are political animals. Others have named us as rational animals. Some have said that we are economic animals. Thomas Aquinas offered the idea that we are risible animals, that is, we laugh.

All of these name some truth about us, but none captures it all. So I am going to suggest we think about still one more suggestion, namely, that we are interpreting animals. We engage reality with our senses, imagination, symbols, language and culture and we interpret what it is, what it means, how we are to respond, and who we are in the big scheme of things. It is important that we get our interpretations right, because if we don't, we place ourselves not only at a disadvantage but even in peril. So the truth of our interpretations matters.


To bring this point home, one thinker has noted that if we engaged reality and after interpreting it, concluded that we could fly (without an airplane!), and in the strength of this conviction we stepped out of a tenth story window, we would fall to our death. This would show that our interpretation was off the mark, was not true. To cite a rather pithy way of saying what has just happened, we can say that "reality pushes back."

Our interpretations of reality can be off the mark for a variety of reasons. One is that we don't see the whole picture, but rather are operating on incomplete data. Another is that we made assumptions about what we believe reality is or ought to be, and those assumptions prove to be inaccurate or flat out wrong. Another is that we become wedded to long held ideas or theories that seemed to work in the past, but with new and different experience and knowledge, these theories are shown to be inadequate. Still another may simply be our own arrogance. We believe we have all the answers, or at least the ones that are most important, so we choose not to look any further.

Notice that "reality" as I am using the term is an ambiguous term. It can refer to physical things, biological entities, relational and psychological states, social and cultural conditions and dynamics, and even spiritual matters. In all of these realms and in every other one in which we as humans live, we engage reality by interpreting it, and the accuracy and truth of our interpretations matters. No matter what the realm, when we are off the mark, reality pushes back.

So what happens when reality pushes back? How do we interpret that?

Perhaps one of the first of many things we may experience is our own limitations. We have misjudged



who we are, how we are, what we are capable of, how we ought to comport ourselves in this reality. For example, we may judge ourselves to be in excellent health and able to live for a good long time, only to be confronted with an unexpected serious illness. Reality is pushing back. Or we may feel safe and secure in our homes, only to have them ravaged by a tornado that we were unprepared for. Reality is pushing back. Or we may feel a high degree of certainty about what we believe about culture, society and even God, and bump into others who believe with just as much strength of conviction something different than we. Reality is pushing back.

Confronting and facing our limitations is often painful and difficult. This might be one of the biggest reasons that we too often prefer to live in the realities of our own making that fall short of what is true. In addition, to honestly admit that we are off the mark might bring us face to face with the fact that we really don't know what reality is, at least not thoroughly and completely. We can feel lost, uncertain, anxious and afraid.

But there can be an upside to all of this as well. When reality pushes back, it can be an invitation to embrace a more expansive, meaningful, awesome and mysterious understanding of what reality is. It can be an invitation not only to see and confront our limitations, but also to recognize possibilities for ourselves that up to that point had been unknown.

When reality pushes back, we are brought to a point of decision. We must decide what to make of what we have come to know, and to choose an appropriate response. Because of the uncertainty involved, there is also an element of risk. But there can also be an element of hope and a sense of adventure.

All of this is to say that when reality pushes back, we are confronted with the fact (the reality!) that we are creatures and not the Creator! And perhaps this is the confrontation that we most desperately need in our day and age. Reality is pushing back in so many hard and challenging ways that we might simply prefer to back off of the encounter. But that would be truly tragic. In the midst of all that is unfolding, when reality pushes back, there looms in our midst the presence of the Creator of that which is most real and most important for our health, happiness and fullness of life. There echoes in this the words of scripture: "I have set before you life and death, so therefore choose life, not death."




Thank You For Making Christmas Bright for Many!

WHEN GOD WHISPERS

"You don't need to shout. My hearing works just fine."

Are you a parent that has used that one on your kids? I'm not sure at what age they realize that the volume of their voice doesn't correlate to the likelihood of receiving a favorable reply — it might be sometime in the teenage years, when the talking slows down altogether.

But I've got to admit, it would be nice if God always gave us a loud and dramatic sign when He wanted something — the booming voice and the torn-open heavens ("This is my beloved Son!") really get the message across. Sometimes I find myself envious of the Apostles, who were able to witness such things in person.

The fact of the matter is, in the year 2021, God is more likely to speak in a whisper than in a shout. The prophet Isaiah forewarns that Christ himself will not be a noisemaker — for all his preaching, he will not cry out or shout to bring forth justice to the nations. His way is altogether different than that.

We are not the Apostles, and we do not have the privilege of seeing the Holy Spirit descend on Christ like a dove. But here's the good news: God doesn't need to shout. Our spiritual hearing works just fine. We just have to be listening.

Let's wake up each morning ready to hear God's whispers throughout the day. Let's make a conscious effort to invite those whispers into our hearts, where they can become a catalyst for grace in this world.


