
Catechetical Corner

When we speak of the Last Things, we are referring to four specific components: death, judgment, heaven and hell. Hebrews 9:27 says, "... it is appointed for men to die once, and after that comes judgment." We call this the Particular judgment, in which each soul is judged individually after death. At some point in the future we will all experience the General Judgment in which we will be bodily resurrected and judged to enter into eternity either in heaven or hell. What about purgatory? Purgatory is a temporary process to prepare us for heaven. It is not a final destination. How can we prepare for judgment? By trusting in Christ, coming to know Him, love Him, and serve Him and by actively participating in the life of the Church, which is the life of Grace.

Sharing Secrets

The Legion of Mary, Our Lady of Humility shares from The Secret of the Rosary by St. Louis Marie de Montfort. The saint writes of 50 "Roses" or secrets of the most Holy Rosary.

Thirtieth Rose: Confraternity Privileges (Part 1 of 2)

The Confraternity of the Most Holy Rosary is one of the most valuable confraternities to join, if only because of the number of indulgences attached to it. It has been awarded more indulgences than any other confraternity in the Church.

St. Louis explains that an indulgence is the remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins which have already been forgiven. In order to receive an indulgence, one must be a baptized Catholic, repentant and in the state of grace. The most recent Catholic Catechism will explain indulgences and the conditions for receiving them.

Knowing that a good example is more valuable than glowing words, countless popes have chosen to join the Confraternity to attest to its merits. There have been some revisions and modifications to the conditions of the indulgences over the years, most notably by Pope Leo XIII.

St. Sebastian Social Justice Ministry Human Trafficking

The International Labour Office estimates that there are approximately 25 million men, women, and children subjected to labor or sex trafficking worldwide. It is important to understand how to prevent and recognize incidents of human trafficking within your own community. The USCCB strives to fulfill the Church's commitment to combat human trafficking and fight for a fair way of life for all through outreach and engagement programs. These initiatives rely on community and faith leaders like you to join the movement in defending the inherent right of every human being to freedom, justice and protection.

Today, human trafficking is pervasive throughout the world, and no one is immune to its evils or its impact, including in our country's fifty states. Bishop Mario E. Dorsonville, auxiliary bishop of Washington and chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (UCCCB) Committee on Migration released the following statement regarding the Church's commitment to raising awareness of and eradicating human trafficking: "Let us reflect upon our responsibilities as individuals and as a Church to make the well-being and protection of victims of human trafficking a priority. We are called by our Holy Father to take a firm stance against this terrible violation of the dignity of the human person and to do everything in our power to eradicate it."
