CONSILIO EVENTS RAISE FUNDS FOR MEMORIAL ENDOWMENT

This August, two fundraisers were launched to benefit the Christopher James Consilio Memorial Scholarship Endowment. This endowment was established at the St. Sebastian Foundation in 2019 in memory of Christopher Consilio. Christopher was a graduate of St. Sebastian Parish School (Class of 2011) and St. Vincent-St. Mary High School (Class of 2015). The endowment provides high school scholarships to St. Sebastian Parish School 8th-graders who plan to attend St. Vincent-St. Mary High School. The endowment also provides awards to teachers at both St. Vincent-St. Mary High School and St. Sebastian Parish School for student enrichment activities/materials.

The organizers, Christopher's parents, Ed and Brigid Hillmuth, and his sister, Cathleen Consilio '06, staged two fantastic events on a beautiful August weekend. More than 140 golfers showed up bright and early for the first event, the Christopher Consilio Memorial Golf Outing. The August 20 event, which was held at Paradise Lake Country Club in Mogadore, provided participants with a day of great golfing, plenty of good food and drink, and lovely fellowship among Christopher's family and friends and those who support them.

The Friday golf outing was followed by a wonderful, sold-out party on Saturday night at St. Sebastian's Zwisler Hall on August 21. The parish grounds and beautiful weather provided the perfect setting for the over 400 guests to enjoy live music while sampling items from food trucks, concessions, and the beer & wine garden. Inside Zwisler Hall, guests could also buy tickets for an immense array of fun live and silent auction items. Totals are not yet finalized, but the events are expected to yield over \$50,000 for the Christopher James Consilio Memorial Scholarship Endowment. Thank you to everyone who supported this event, from golfers and sponsors, to dinner attendees and volunteers, your help was much appreciated and a great tribute to Christopher's memory.


Class of 1944

Page five of this newsletter features a story of how St. Sebastian Parish School decided to change its mascot from “Bulldogs” to “Terriers” in honor of **Terry Coyle**. The caption to the picture at right, from the Oct. 30, 1947 issue of the Akron Beacon Journal reads: “**Coach Mel Kramer** will be holding aces back to back Sunday afternoon at Old Forge field when he sends his unbeaten St. Sebastian's football team against St. Mary's for the CYO grade school football championship. Kramer, center, confers with Quarterback **Terry Coyle** and Half-back **Louie Baldacci**, left and right, respectively, who could make a difference in the titular game. Coyle raced the opening kickoff back 85 yards to a touchdown as St. Sebastian's downed St. Martha's in the play-off semifinals. Baldacci, son of Paul Baldacci, Akron U. football coach, set a new CYO scoring record this fall.”


Class of 1967

Kenneth Beatty wrote in: “In regard to the gold and green jackets pictured in the [Summer 2021] newsletter, any boy who played basketball for the 8th-grade varsity team in the late 1960s should recognize these items. They are the warm up jackets we wore before every game when we did our warm up drills. I remember wearing the jacket in 1967. My impression was that [Coach] **Charlie Zeno** had been in possession of them for a number of years. He always treated the jackets as if they were something very special. He would bring them to the games and pass them out to the team to wear only during the drills before the game. He collected them from us immediately after the drills were completed. We never wore them at practice, any scrimmage or during an actual game. They were purely for show and to wear before the game. Thinking back, I suspect it was Charlie’s version of ‘shock and awe.’ He was proud of his teams and the school they represented. It’s hard to believe that any survived, but I’m sure Charlie would be pleased to know that his legacy lives on.”

Toni Didato Cooper wrote to share that she published her fourth inspirational book on Amazon, “Life Without Baggage, A Faith-Based Workbook.” Her Amazon biography notes that she began writing an advice column in the sixth grade. TERRY COYLE '49 AND THE STORY OF THE SCHOOL MASCOT NAME

Until recently, **Terry Coyle** was unaware that several members of the Class of 1950 assert that the reason St. Sebastian Parish School changed its mascot from “Bulldogs” to “Terriers” was in honor of him! According to St. Sebastian lore, the Class of 1949 anchored teams that won CYO championships in every season: football, basketball, and baseball. Terry Coyle was a standout player on all of these championship teams. Bob Linton and his classmates from the Class of 1950 (who were 7th-graders when they played with Terry) led the effort to change the mascot in honor of Terry, who they considered the “winningest” student athlete in school history.

Kathy Holaday, Director of Development for the St. Sebastian Parish Foundation, spoke with Terry in September and shared this story with him. Terry said he remembers making good friends with the 7th-graders at school, and he was pleasantly surprised to be tied to the school’s mascot choice. Terry lives in Phoenix and visits the Akron area occasionally. Around seven years ago, he met up in Akron with his son and one of his grandchildren, and he enjoyed ice cream at Mary Coyle Ice Cream, the Akron landmark named after his mother, Mary Hagee Coyle, who owned the original Mary Coyle stores along with her husband William “Buck” Coyle.

Terry has many great memories of his school days, including going to communion in the morning then having breakfast before going to class. He also remembers wearing rubbers, the newspaper drives with competitions between the grades, and playing sports in the small school yard. He spoke fondly of Forest Lodge and ice skating in the winter. He also remembers being scared of Sr. Cleophas (8th-grade teacher) and the intense recess playground competitions between OSU vs. Notre Dame fans! But one memory was especially

striking. Terry vividly remembers praying the Stations of the Cross because it resulted in his strong relationship with Jesus at a young age. Terry still communicates with many friends including **John Bachmann, Dave Scheatzle** and **Ed Dannemiller**. ST. SEBASTIAN PARISH FOUNDATION CELEBRATES 50 YEARS

Congratulations to the St. Sebastian Parish Foundation on its 50th anniversary! The Foundation hosted a 50th Anniversary Celebration on September 16, 2021 at Monsignor Zwisler Hall. Over 70 parishioners, alumni and friends gathered to celebrate, including most of the Foundation's current board members. The St. Sebastian Parish Foundation was started in 1971 with a mission to provide financial support to the parish, including both the church and the school. Since 1971, the Foundation has provided over \$11 million in support to the parish.

The first fund established at the Foundation was the Unrestricted Fund, which to this day provides essential funding for the areas of greatest need in the parish. Today, the Foundation also oversees more than 70 named funds and endowments that provide ongoing support for everything from school scholarships to faith formation activities.

The Foundation has also funded many capital improvement projects over the years, including major projects such as the renovation of the former convent into the Beringer Center for Early Learning for preschool and kindergarten classes, the construction of the Victor Buehrle, Jr. Science Laboratory, the complete renovation of Zwisler Hall, the reconstruction of the brick parking lot, the overhaul of the church organ, the construction of the Helen Barry Hamlin Library, and the \$1 million Cornerstone of Our Faith church restoration project.

During the anniversary celebration, Brenda Pier Beck, President of the Foundation Board of Trustees, provided a brief history of the Foundation and paid tribute to the forward-thinking founders who created a solid base of financial support for the parish. The Foundation's Director of Development, Kathy Holaday, offered
