So, in anticipation of being able to tell you how grateful I am that you were here, that you prayed and participated, that you came to practices, that you cleaned, that you decorated, that you fulfilled ministries, for your generosity, I offer you my thanks for making our celebrations wonderful and our “Christ’s Mass Day” centered on what matters most.

IN OTHER NEWS:

CALENDARS: Thanks to Hummel Funeral Homes, there are available 2022 liturgical wall calendars at the entrances of the church. Speaking of having to print in advance, you will notice that Fr. Morris’s name is on the calendar instead of Fr. Bozek. Things can change quickly! Thank you, Hummel.

TREE TRIMMING: We have been anticipating all of the trees on St. Sebastian Square to be trimmed on December 27th. In theory, the project should have been finished by the time you read this! The trees need to be trimmed during the winter months due to a disease in Ohio that can infect our beautiful oak trees if they are trimmed during the warmer months.

VISITORS: We are blessed to have a few visitors to St. Sebastian over Christmas break. Joseph and Vincent, seminarians from Vietnam studying for the Diocese of Cleveland, moved into the rectory just before Christmas and have been helping out at Masses and such. Charlie has also returned but has a number of duties at his home parish as well as leaving after Christmas for a week to go on retreat.

The Epiphany of the Lord

“Epiphany” means manifestation. And the “Epiphany of the Lord” is Jesus’ manifestation not only to these three Magi from the East, but it’s also a symbolic but real manifestation of the Christ to the whole world. These Magi, traveling from a foreign and non-Jewish nation, reveal that Jesus came for all people and all are called to adore Him.

These Magi were “wise men” who studied the stars and were aware of the Jewish belief that a Messiah was coming.

God used what they were familiar with to call them to adore the Christ. He used a star. They understood the stars and when they saw this new and unique star over Bethlehem they realized that something special was happening. So the first lesson we take from this for our own lives is that God will use what is familiar to us to call us to Himself. Look for the “star” that God is using to call you. It’s closer than you may think.

A second thing to note is that the Magi fell prostrate before the Christ Child. They laid their lives down before Him in complete surrender and adoration. They set a perfect example for us. If these astrologers from a foreign land could come and adore Christ in such a profound way, we must do the same. Perhaps you could try literally lying down prostrate in prayer this day, in imitation of the Magi, or at least do so in your heart through prayer. Adore Him with a complete surrender of your life.

Lastly, the Magi bring gold, frankincense and myrrh. These three gifts, presented to our Lord, show that they acknowledged this Child as the Divine King who would die to save us from sin. Gold is for a King, frankincense is a burnt offering to God, and myrrh is used for one who would die. Thus, their adoration is grounded in the truths of who this Child is. If we are to adore Christ properly, we must also honor Him in this threefold way.

Reflect, today, upon these Magi and see them as a symbol of what you are called to do. You are called from the foreign place of this world to seek out the Messiah. When you discover Him, do not hesitate to acknowledge the full truth of who He is, lying prostrate before Him in complete and humble submission.

COVID support from The Foundation

The Helen Barry Hamlin Library Fund supported remote learning with the purchase of audio/video equipment in the fall of 2020. The upgrades included new sound bars, XD microphones, and document cameras for each classroom. The new equipment provided significant and timely improvements for the learning environment for all of our students, especially those who chose the school's remote learning option during the pandemic.






The St. Gabriel Fund was established to fund the purchase of “live-streaming” equipment for masses, weddings, funerals, concerts and more. The fund also provides ongoing support for maintenance and purchases such as licensing fees. Initiated in 2020 during the pandemic, the St. Gabriel Fund provided crucial funding for the establishment of the parish's broadcasting systems, which helped the parish stay connected and minister to its parishioners.
