From The Pastor

Greetings,

And HAPPY FEAST OF ST. SEBASTIAN! Our actual feast day is on January 20, but a parish is permitted to move the celebration to the weekend so that everyone may participate. This weekend we give thanks for his intercession and ask him to continue his prayers on behalf of our community.

Because of St. Sebastian's role as being the patron saint to invoke against contagious diseases and plagues, we have a particular obligation to ask for his intervention to keep us safe during this time of COVID.

PRAYER TO ST. SEBASTIAN DURING TIME OF PANDEMIC

O Glorious St. Sebastian, faithful follower of Jesus Christ, to you do we raise our hearts and hands and implore your powerful intercession in obtaining, from God the Father, all the helps and graces necessary for our spiritual and temporal welfare, and especially in our day, for protection against contagious diseases. O, special guardian from diseases and accidents, we are confident that your intercession on our behalf will be graciously heard before the throne of God. Amen.

St. Sebastian is considered a protector against the plague. He is celebrated for his protection in answer to intercessory prayer against the plagues in Rome in 680, Milan in 1575, and Lisbon in 1599." He had never come in contact with a plague during his life, but his recovery from what seemed certain death by being pierced by many arrows has inspired Catholics to call for his intercession for centuries. Therefore we call out in joy and hope, "St. Sebastian, pray for us!"

IN OTHER NEWS:

CANCELLATIONS: Due to the current concerns over COVID and having received instructions from our bishop, many large gatherings that would have been taking place this month and early next month have either been cancelled or postponed. Among the casualty list is our St. Sebastian Feast Day Spaghetti Dinner. On the postponed list currently is the International Festival (which helps pay for all of the needs in the sanctuary including candles, books, vestments and such) Night at the Races (which is well known for keeping our sports programs among the most affordable and accessible) and Theology on the Rocks. Keep an eye out for upcoming details.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

At least once a year, Christians are reminded of Jesus' prayer for His disciples before going to the cross. He asks that His followers "may all be one," as He and the Father are one, "so that the world may believe" and have life in His name (John 17). Christian unity is here made central to the very being of the church and to its mission and witness.

The event that touches off this special experience is the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

Traditionally the week of prayer is celebrated between January 18-25, between the feasts of St. Peter and St. Paul.

In the Gospel of John, Christ prays for His disciples before going to the cross. He asks that His followers "may all be one," as He and the Father are one, "so that the world may believe" and have life in His name (John 17). Christian unity is here made central to the very being of the church and to its mission and witness.

Today, we live with divisions even as we yearn for the unity promised and commissioned by Christ. The long and often painful history of Christianity has sundered our churches for theological, liturgical and political reasons. Many Christians now strive to heal these divisions, yet honor our diversity, through ecumenical dialogue, common action and relationship-building. They also come together to pray for unity, joining Christ in His prayer to the Father.

The worldwide celebration of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is both the seed and the fruit of this striving for 'unity in diversity'. This time of shared prayer, reflection and fellowship invites Christians of different traditions to deepen our relationships and to live and witness together throughout the year.

Sharing Secrets

The Legion of Mary, Our Lady of Humility, shares from The Secret of the Rosary by St. Louis Marie de Montfort. The saint writes of 50 "Roses" or secrets of the Most Holy Rosary.

From the Thirty-Seventh Rose:

This secret tells of how the Most Holy Rosary freed a monastery from the grasp of worldliness. A nobleman with several daughters entered one of them into a lax monastery, where worldliness, comfort and attachment reigned supreme. A priest and confessor of the monastery requested that this young nun say the rosary every day while meditating on the Passion of our Lord Jesus. She found her heart transformed but she was persecuted by her fellow religious. The priest came to her aid when he had a vision of the Blessed Mother offering protection and warding off evil spirits from the nun who was devoted to the Rosary. The priest then decided to reform the Monastery once again, buying Rosaries for all the nuns and asking them to recite it every day. They again found their hearts transformed, and allowed peace, silence and other spiritual gifts to enter their lives.


