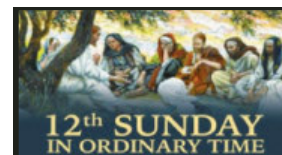

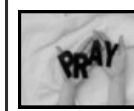

Before you baptize your child, parish and diocesan policy require you to complete a **Baptism Preparation Class.** The next class will be at **St. John Nepomucene, Sunday, July 23rd at 11:30 am.** If you plan to attend, call them at (216) 641-8444.

Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church for at least three months. If you attend Mass, but are not registered, contact the rectory. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, should register as an adult.

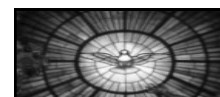
There is a limit of 2 Masses, each 6 months, for the Vigil and Sundays only.

Dear Parishioners,

We began the Thursday evening Holy Hours last week. The attendance was sparse, but I said that Jesus started with only 12 men, so I hope more will begin coming to the hour of silent prayer

before the Blessed Sacrament. Eucharistic Adoration is a way to develop our personal relationship with Jesus. Our lives are hectic sometimes and our living spaces are not always conducive to a spirit of prayer. Coming to church, even if just for a brief moment of prayer with the Sacrament of Jesus' Body and Blood on the altar is a remedy for many of the difficulties we find ourselves in. A heart to heart talk with Jesus is easier in the context of Eucharistic Adoration even than in the Mass. It is an oasis of grace and prayer in the silence of our beautiful parish church is a rest and a fountain of strength spiritually.

If you cannot come to church, I ask that you remember the hour from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Thursday and pray as you can at home. Joining yourself to the prayer virtually will help all of us.

We are in the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. As you may recall if you have looked studiously at the stained glass window of the Sacred Heart with St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in our church, the revelation of the love of Christ in this devotion began during a time of Eucharistic Adoration. I have visited the chapel in which that occurred in Paray le Monial in France. The Sacred Heart of Jesus is intimately connected to the Lord's Real Presence in the Sacrament. That is something that is more obvious as you pray before the monstrance. Inevitably, Eucharistic Adoration will give a person more depth in the reception of Holy Communion. We need to focus our prayer in order to focus our lives on Jesus. Spending time with Jesus in loving contemplation is a necessity for a Catholic Christian, not something extra.

Thanks to our friend Daniel Stys, we have many pictures of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to give out during this time. In former periods, almost every Catholic home had an image of Jesus like that. It was a constant reminder of Our Loving Savior and a stimulus to faith and trust.

Our parish should be a community of prayer with Jesus as the Center. The litany of the Sacred Heart calls Jesus "King and Center of all hearts." We should ask ourselves if Jesus is our king and if our lives are centered in Him. Every time you dedicate to God, every Communion, every rosary, every visit to the Blessed Sacrament helps our parish. A rising tide lifts all boats is an expression economists (and President Kennedy) used to promote growth. Spiritual growth is a communal project, also. If you are more holy, all of us can be more holy. Holiness is what we are all about.

On a more pedestrian note, we have several projects going on this summer for repairs: the school gymnasium, the front porch of the rectory, and others to be announced. Recently our school received 150 desks from Archbishop Hoban High School in Akron. We'll never be done, but we're trying. **May Our Lady of Perpetual Help intercede for us and may God bless us all.** Msgr. Richard Antall
