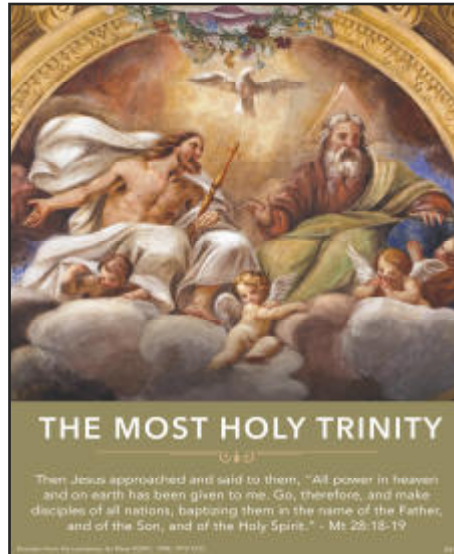
A Vicarious Descant

The two most recent apparitions of an angel that are approved by the Church are the apparitions at Fatima and the apparitions to St. Faustina. In both cases, the apparitions specifically brought messages of adoration of the Most Holy Trinity.

At Fatima the prayer was “Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I adore Thee profoundly. I offer Thee the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges and indifferences whereby He is offended. And through the infinite merits of His Most Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I beg of Thee the conversion of poor sinners.”

And St. Faustina wrote in her diary of a vision she had of the Most Holy Trinity. The diary entry was dated Friday, September 13, 1935—the vigil of the Exultation of the Holy Cross. She wrote:

474 In the evening, when I was in my cell, I saw an Angel, the executor of divine wrath. He was clothed in a dazzling robe, his face gloriously bright, a cloud beneath his feet. From the cloud, bolts of thunder and flashes of lightning were springing into his hands; and from his hand they were going forth, and only then were they striking the earth. When I saw this sign of divine wrath which was about to strike the earth, and in particular a certain place, which for good reasons I cannot name, I began to implore the Angel to hold off for a few moments, and the world would do penance. But my plea was a mere nothing



in the face of the divine anger. Just then I saw the Most Holy Trinity. The greatness of Its majesty pierced me deeply, and I did not dare to repeat my entreaties. At that very moment I felt in my soul the power of Jesus' grace, which dwells in my soul. When I became conscious of this grace, I was instantly snatched up before the Throne of God. Oh, how great is our Lord and God and how incomprehensible His holiness! I will make no attempt to describe this greatness, because before long we shall all see Him as He is. I found myself pleading with God for the world with words heard interiorly. As I was praying in this manner, I saw the Angel's helplessness: he could not carry out the just punishment which was rightly due for sins. Never before had I prayed with such inner power as I did then.

475 The words with which I entreated God are these: ‘Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our

Lord Jesus Christ for our sins and those of the whole world; for the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us.’

“A certain place, which for good reasons I cannot name:” what place was that and what was its crime? It was a place that St. Faustina said would be destroyed like Sodom on account of the crimes perpetrated there.

Fr. Sopocko, St. Faustina’s spiritual director, said that the place was Warsaw. And in 1936, it was one of the capitals of abortion in the world. While Sister Faustina was alive, the city was spared, but one year after her death, the city was invaded and nearly completely destroyed. Let us not forget the power of prayer for our country—particularly the Divine Mercy Chaplet!

Our Gospels today in the Ordinary and Extraordinary forms of the Roman Rite speak directly and indirectly of the Most Holy Trinity. Nothing new has been revealed since the time of our Lord and the Apostles, yet the Church proclaims with greater clarity this most infinite mystery.

Our Lord summarized his command to the Church just before He ascended into heaven: “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.”

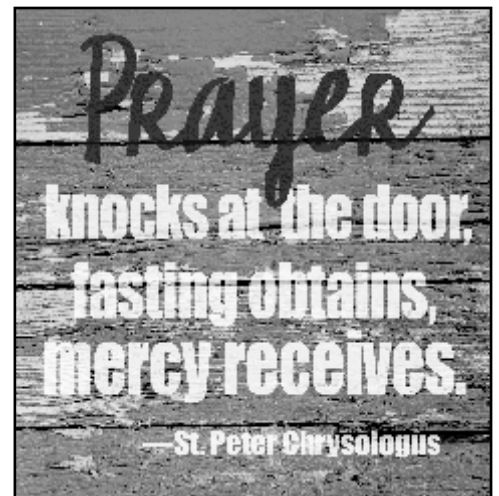
WEEKDAY MASSES: Monday-Saturday 7:30 a.m. (all Tridentine).

St. Gregory says, “There is no sacrifice so acceptable to almighty God as a zeal for souls.” And the twelfth century theologian Richard of St. Victor says, “I know not whether any greater benefit can be conferred by God, than that others should attain salvation through obedience to him.” Likewise, Dionysius the Areopagite wrote, “Of all divine works, the most divine is to cooperate with God in the conversion of those who stray, and in the bringing back of sinners to Himself.” (Lapide).

We may not be able to expound on the dogma of the Most Holy Trinity as St. Augustine did, but we can give glory and honor to God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit—Three Persons, One God.

The Compendium gives us a short prayer to the Most Holy Trinity written by Blessed Elizabeth of the Trinity: “O my God, Trinity whom I adore...grant my soul peace; make it your heaven, your beloved dwelling, and the place of your rest. May I never abandon you there, but may I be there, whole and entire, completely vigilant in my faith, entirely adoring, and wholly given over to your creative action.” Amen.

Note: Next Sunday, June 6, the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite Mass (Tridentine Latin) will be celebrated at noon instead of 9:30 AM. The 9:30 AM Mass will be the Ordinary Form of the Roman Rite in Latin. A Eucharistic Procession to the four altars will follow the noon Mass, weather permitting. A social and refreshments will follow the procession.

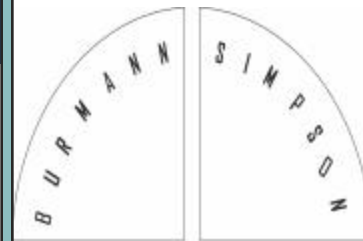

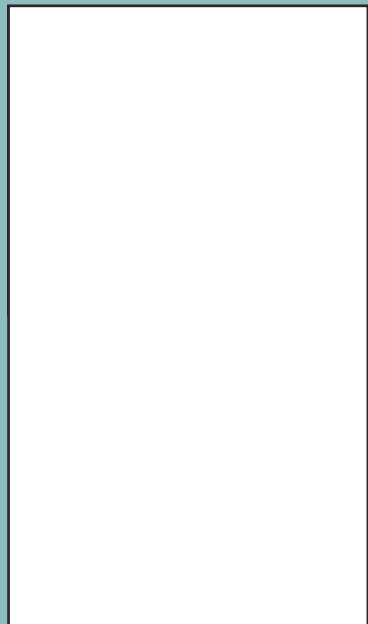
