A Vicarious Descant

Today's Gospel in the Latin Mass is the account of the man with dropsy. It is not uncommon to ask an obvious question in order to point out an obvious error. Asking a question is a powerful way of teaching that goes back to the earliest use of language (eg. "And the Lord God called Adam, and said to him: Where art thou?" --Genesis 3:9). Sometimes the ones who are asked the question fall silent. Like the Apostles discussing on the way who was greatest among them (Mark 9:33). Or the parable of the man invited to the wedding banquet who did not have the proper wedding garment—he was "reduced to silence." Here, in the house of the "chief of the Pharisees" on a Sabbath, while they watched the Lord, they remained silent when the Lord asked, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath day?" It was certainly a rebuke. For they knew well that the Sabbath was made for man, but instead taught the opposite.

Of the many miracles that our Lord performed, the miracle of the healing of the man with dropsy is quite unique. Dropsy is called edema today. It is a visible swelling that usually affects the legs or arms. The Gospels do not say how this man was cured or how severe his condition was. If his tissues had been visibly stretched and filled with excess fluid, were they instantly restored to normal or did the reduction of the swelling take place over time? We do not know. But what we do know, is that he was cured in front of the Pharisees and they remained silent.

I suspect that the cure was instantaneous,

but the swelling disappeared after the man left the presence of the Pharisees. As the Lord had denied the disbelievers from witnessing the restoring to life of Jairus' daughter, so, too, our Lord may have denied his enemies the witnessing of what was a most unique and remarkable miracle. They had to remain silent because they could not see whether the Lord had actually healed the man or not—he probably didn't look any different to them. They were blind to the miracle because they were blind to their visitation by the Messiah.

When we exclude ourselves from the presence of the Lord we exclude ourselves from seeing things as God intended them to be seen. But we also exclude ourselves from witnessing the spiritual miracles that do not end with death, but which last unto eternal life. Given the choice of receiving a miracle that will end at our death or one that will last unto eternal life, I suspect that we would all choose the latter.

But I also consider the many hidden possibilities of the Lord's miracles: dropsy is usually caused by other more serious illnesses or ailments. Our Lord could have healed an infirmity that the man didn't even know about which then would have subsequently led to the healing of the symptoms of it. By healing the man's heart or liver, the edema would have also disappeared. Is a miracle any less miraculous if it takes place over a period of time? There are many miracles that have been going on for centuries—the tilma of Our Lady of Guadalupe is

but one and even numerous Eucharistic miracles. Think of how many souls have benefited from witnessing that miracle? But there are also miracles where God allows man to participate. I think good medicine is a good example of that.

Sometimes in our prayers of petition we are asking God to fix just the symptoms and not the deeper problems. It might be because we simply don't know about the deeper problems. But our Lord may choose to answer those prayers by healing those deeper problems instead of simply taking the symptoms away. Such deeper healing can take time—just as the man with dropsy probably left the presence of the Lord healed of the infirmity and then was fully restored visibly over a miraculously short period of time. Or consider the ten lepers: they left the presence of the Lord every bit as leprous as when they first called to Him and it was only on the way to the High Priest that they were cured. Some miracles are meant to be received through patience and obedience. And patience and obedience are wonderful expressions of trust in the Lord.

How often do we petition the Lord for something very apparent and instead our Lord heals the deeper cause and it is only over time that we become aware that our prayers have been answered? We see the effects of a defect—sometimes far removed from the actual cause—and pray for healing and our Lord answers that prayer in a greater way but over a longer period of time.

When we offer prayers of petition, we should conclude those petitions with




