
An Advent Descant

We have reached the last week of our Advent preparation. We still have a good week before the Solemnity of Christmas.

Today is Rorate Sunday. Rorate caeli—"drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just (Introit). This is the opening of the Advent hymn we have sung these past weeks. Last week was Ember Week in Advent. Three days of penance and preparation for the ordinations that in earlier centuries took place on the third Ember Day. Every important event calls for preparation on the part of the one holding the event and those called to participate in it. In this way, all of the faithful were called upon to pray and prepare for those called to particular service of the Lord in the Church.

Our preparations for Christmas ought not be excluded from this prayerful origin. Each of us have hopefully made the best possible use of this time of Advent to prepare to celebrate the birth of our Savior, but, in a greater sense, to make progress in holiness: love of God and love of neighbor as we await the Lord's return in glory.

The Catechism teaches us, "The coming of God's Son to earth is an event of such immensity that God willed to prepare for it over centuries. He makes everything converge on Christ: all the rituals and sacrifices, figures and symbols of the "First Covenant." He announces him through the mouths of the prophets who succeeded one another in Israel" (CCC 522).



The Church experiences a particular anticipation in these last days before Christmas. In each Holy Mass, we do not merely have a glimpse of heaven, but we are present at the eternal heavenly liturgy in a real way. "Heaven unites with earth," as we are present to the Incarnation and "God is with us."

The prayers in our last week of preparations change to a more joyful, expectant tone. The Church moves through these remaining days with greater joy to celebrate the birth of our Savior. We meditate on Sacred Scripture and see that God's revelation of Himself was gradual and hidden in the words of the prophets. The Prayers and Readings at Mass this week will speak about our Lord and our Blessed Mother.

The mystery of the Incarnation has been the preeminent meditation during this holy Advent season. As our Blessed When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leafed in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." — . 1:41-42

Mother would treasure all these things in her heart, we too, should prayerfully unite ourselves with her and the Church in contemplating these mysteries with joy and confidence in God's grace.

When we meditate on the Child Jesus, we cannot help but consider the Blessed Virgin Mary and Joseph. And when we meditate on the Blessed Virgin Mary, we, in turn, meditate on Christ. Mary's humility, her obedience to God's will: "May it be done to me according to your word" brought about the fulfillment of God's plan of salvation—a plan unfolded across centuries.

Let us continue to ask God to grant His mercy upon our country at this most critical time. Let us turn with great confidence to our Lady, under whose watchful care our country has been entrusted. May our nation and the people of all nations come to know, adore and serve the Lord Jesus Christ now and forever.

May this remaining week of Advent be a time of great prayer, great preparation and great graces for each of us, that we may fully celebrate the Solemnity of Christmas.




