
A Vicarious Descant

In July 2009, Pope Benedict XVI promulgated his last encyclical titled, *Caritas in veritate* (Charity in Truth). In that encyclical, the Holy Father wrote an apt reply ahead of time to many of the troubles plaguing the Church today.

We read, "Truth needs to be sought, found and expressed within the "economy" of charity, but charity in its turn needs to be understood, confirmed and practiced in the light of truth. In this way, not only do we do a service to charity enlightened by truth, but we also help give credibility to truth, demonstrating its persuasive and authenticating power in the practical setting of social living. This is a matter of no small account today, in a social and cultural context which relativizes truth, often paying little heed to it and showing increasing reluctance to acknowledge its existence" (*Caritas in veritate*, 2).

The Holy Father goes on to say this: "Without truth, charity degenerates into sentimentality. Love becomes an empty shell, to be filled in an arbitrary way. In a culture without truth, this is the fatal risk facing love. It falls prey to contingent subjective emotions and opinions, the word "love" is abused and distorted, to the point where it comes to mean the opposite. Truth frees charity from the constraints of an emotionalism that deprives it of relational and social content, and of a fideism that deprives it of human and universal breathing-space" (*Caritas in veritate*, 3).

Fideism can be defined simply as blind faith divorced from reason. It calls to mind



Pope John Paul's famous encyclical *Fides et ratio*, Faith and Reason, "like two wings on which the human spirit rises to the contemplation of truth; and God has placed in the human heart a desire to know the truth—in a word, to know himself—so that, by knowing and loving God, men and women may also come to the fullness of truth about themselves" That is the opening sentence of Fides et ratio promulgated in 1998.

The Holy Father said that the word "love" can be "abused and distorted to the point where it comes to mean the opposite." So, what is the "opposite" of love? It is not hate. The opposite of love is not described with one word, but if one could be chosen it would be selfishness.

The opposite of love is the willingness to lie and misrepresent what has been divinely revealed and faithfully handed on to us through the teachings of Christ through the Church. It is what the serpent did in the Garden of Eden: "And the serpent said to the woman: No, you shall not die the death. For God doth know that in what day soever you shall eat thereof, your eyes shall be opened: and you shall be as Gods, knowing good and evil" (Gen 3:4-5). Three back-to-back lies that underlie what we call today a "fallen human nature." Adam and Eve did die, their eyes were not opened (except to shame), they did not become as gods and their ability to discern good from evil was greatly diminished.

There is a lot of opposition to love, that is, true charity, right now over a broad range of issues that would not even have been countenanced by the most progressive secularist minds of even a few decades ago.

In the Book of Wisdom we read, "Let us lie in wait for the righteous man, because he is inconvenient to us and opposes our actions; he reproaches us for sins against the law, and accuses us of sins against our training (or doctrine)" (Wisdom 2:12). But then a few verses later we read, "Thus they reasoned, but they were led astray, for their wickedness blinded them, and they did not know the secret purposes of God, nor hope for the wages of holiness, nor discern the prize for blameless souls; for God created man for incorruption, and made him in the image of his own eternity, but through the devil's envy death entered the world, and those who belong to his party experience it" (Wisdom 2:21-24). These verses are most directly a prophecy of the redemption by Christ through the


CONFESSIONS: Saturday 2:30-3:30, Sunday 9:00 & 11:30 a.m.

Cross, but they also speak of what has followed ever since that redemption.

The Holy Father said that "charity degenerates into sentimentality" and "love becomes an empty shell, to be filled in an arbitrary way." This is easily seen today through the distortions to such foundational institutions as marriage and family—and manipulating language to deny how God created the human person—male and female He created them (Gen 1:27).

The Holy Father teaches us that justice is not ever divorced from charity, but presupposed by it. This is both at a personal level and a societal level.

Holy Mother Church offers this wisdom to all peoples—and especially those in positions of authority. You may not remember this, but Pope Benedict personally handed President Obama a copy of *Caritas in veritate* along with a copy of the encyclical, *Dignitas personae*, on bioethics and the dignity of man at their meeting on July 10, 2009.

We should not be scandalized when we hear about others, even fellow Catholics, expressing ideas and innovations contrary to what has been held by the Church and will always be held by the Church. It has been going on for a long time at every level. The Lord has assured us that He will provide for the indefectibility of His Church. It is our task to remain faithful disciples and continue to love our enemies and do good, especially with prayer, to those who persecute us.

On this seventh Sunday after Pentecost, holy Mother Church places before us the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit and, in particular, that gift of wisdom. The offertory verse points to the thousand sacrifices offered by Solomon in the first days of his reign—after which the Lord appeared to him and said, "Ask what thou will and I will give it to you." Solomon, not even 18 years old at that time, asked for wisdom, and God granted him wisdom in a measure unlike any man before him or after him.

May we each continue to pray to apply the gift of wisdom that is strengthened through our sacramental life so that we may each bear much good fruit. May our prayers also be for those greatly in need of true wisdom and charity. And through the intercession of the Our Lady, Seat of Wisdom, may we one day come to share in that eternal joy of the heavenly kingdom.
