

A Vicarious Descant

egarding today's Traditional Latin Mass Gospel reading, St. John Chrysostom, a contemporary of St. Augustine in the 4th century, wrote, "There is a certain erroneous opinion inborn in mortal men that increases evil doing and lessens good. It is the belief that whatever comes into our possession in this life we possess it as masters of it; and so when the chance arises we seize these things as ours by special right. The contrary is true. For we are not placed in this life as lords in our own houses, but as guests and strangers, brought hither whether we would or not, and at a time not of our choosing" (Sermons of the Great Fathers, Vol 3, p 321).

St. Paul says, "Thus should one regard us: as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. Now it is of course required of stewards that they be found trustworthy....What do you possess that you have not received? But if you have received it, why are you boasting as if you did not receive it? (1 Cor 4). And as St. Paul speaks of things material to teach of things spiritual, so, too, in our day are we called to understand that we are stewards of God's many gifts--material and spiritual. We are stewards of what we have been given--whether it is one talent or ten. Likewise, in the spiritual life, the Lord chooses those whom He wishes to receive a greater share of the gifts of the Holy Spirit as he said to Nicodemus, "The wind blows where it wills, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know whence it comes or whither it goes; so it is with every one



who is born of the Spirit." There are those whom God has chosen to bear particular gifts of the Holy Spirit and even dispense such gifts to others, and there are, equally chosen by God, those who receive from them these gifts. The one who is healed, for example, is in every measure chosen by God to receive that gift as is the one who dispensed it. We should likewise be generous with our prayer for others, since each of us has received a measure of God's blessings far beyond what we merit. So, too, with our forgiveness, all of us forgiving the small offenses quickly and the large offenses completely.

If we have difficulty discerning how and by what means we are to love our neighbor, then we are probably lacking first in love of God. The greatest commandment is that we love God with our whole heart, soul, mind and strength. The second is like it: you shall love your neighSomeone in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me." He replied to him, "Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?" Then he said to the crowd, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."


