



STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

15TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Our readings today remind us to live our lives in total surrender to God's care.

The Gospel recounts when Jesus instructs His twelve apostles to begin their missionary work two



by two. He encouraged them to take very little a walking stick and sandals.

If you can recall a time you packed for a trip, or even left the house for a day's travel, you might remember making a list or packing days in advance. We tend to pack so we know we will be comfortable.

If we extend this concept of "comfort" into other areas of our lives, we will most likely find a few instances where we ensure life is comfortable. It could be buying extra food at the grocery store, making sure we have the most updated technology, or even feeling safe in our bank accounts.

It is not bad to have extra food in the pantry or a new phone. And it isn't bad to save money. These things can be good when used properly.

But what if we are looking to these things for comfort, security or even happiness?

Imagine if Jesus approached you and said, "Go out and do my work, but you can only bring a walking stick and shoes." Would you be willing to surrender all the rest?

A key component of living out our call as Christian stewards is total surrender. It is trusting in God during our best moments and our hardest. It is looking to Him for security, comfort and happiness.

Reflect on the ways you might be looking for comfort in the things of this world. Tangibly find a way to become independent from that "thing" so that you can become more dependent on God.



STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

Imagine taking nothing but a stick when you go on a trip. The Apostles must have really trusted in God's providential care. Think of all the material things "we can't live without" in today's world. We make our life's journey more difficult because of all the material baggage that we drag along. Putting God first in everything and putting our money and possessions second gives us freedom because we don't become "slaves" to wanting to acquire more things.



Biographies of the six most nominated candidates will be published in the August 8 bulletin.

The election will be held Aug 14-15 to choose three new members for the council.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PROTECTION OF YOUTH & VULNERABLE ADULTS

*** IMPORTANT INFORMATION ***

ANYONE WORKING WITH CHILDREN OR VULNERABLE ADULTS IS REQUIRED TO HAVE TRAINING AND A BACKGROUND CHECK. This includes school volunteers and coaches, catechists, youth ministry volunteers, scout volunteers, and Eucharistic Ministers who visit the sick and homebound or take Eucharist to area nursing homes.

The following requirements MUST be met BEFORE you can volunteer for the above ministries, OR volunteer at any school activity including after-school events.

- 1. **Get fingerprinted**. BCI reports are only good for five years. Contact Pam Brady at the Parish Office to schedule fingerprinting at <u>pbrady@stpaulncanton.org</u> or 330-499-2201, ext. 101. This is a free service to our staff and volunteers.
- 2. **Complete Appendix 9 on both sides**. This can be accomplished at the same time you are fingerprinted.
- 3. **Complete VIRTUS training** (required *even if* you previously attended the Diocese of Youngstown Child Protection Class). Currently, VIRTUS is available online with the convenience of doing it in the comfort of your own home at a time you choose.

Instructions for the on-line VIRTUS class are available when you get fingerprinted.

PLEASE NOTE: Due to a recent system update, the State of Ohio currently has a background check **delay of 45 days**. "This delay is impacting the entire State of Ohio and they are not able to predict with any certainty when the issue will be resolved. Despite almost constant work on the new system, the earliest resolution would be sometime late next week. I expect the time delay to increase. I apologize for the inconvenience, but the safety of our children and vulnerable adults cannot be jeopardized. The Diocese will not grant the compliant status to a person until we receive their background check(s) from BCI. Please remember that only compliant adults may work with children and vulnerable adults." (As quoted from a memorandum dated June 28, 2021 from the *Safe Environment Coordinator*, *Victim Assistance Coordinator*, Diocese of Youngstown.)

WEEKEND OF JULY 17 & 18 A Letter from Fr Joseph

2021 MISSION COOPERATIVE PLAN FOR IKOT EKPENE DIOCESE, NIGERIA.

My dear Friends,

First of all, I thank your Bishop, the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, and your Pastor, for giving me this opportunity to come and share with you the situation of the Catholic Diocese of Ikot Ekpene in Nigeria.

Ikot Ekpene Diocese is a very poor diocese, located in the rural South South (formerly South East) of Nigeria. Due to the present economic and political situations in Nigeria, we need urgent help from you to survive. Being the only Catholic Diocese in an area with over Three million people, there are tremendous needs for the people both for evangelization and human development. The Diocese administers to very poor rural people whose occupations are mostly subsistent farming and mixed-cropping. In addition, the Diocese is also helping displaced people moving into the area due to political, social, and religious instabilities in the nation.


Many of you have heard about the persecution of Christians carried out by groups of Islamic extremists, and supported by Turkey and Saudi Arabia. The problems faced by the Church in Nigeria is compounded by terrorist groups like Boko Haram, the Fulani militias of the Miyetti Allah anti-Christian movements, which through kidnappings, beheadings and banditry, have made Nigeria a very instable country. Their evil actions have resulted to thousands of Christians, priests, nuns, and seminarians to lose their lives. Many Churches, convents and seminaries have been burned down. The recent bombings, killings and displacements of poor farmers in our locality had made it very difficult for the people to live in peace. Our Diocese is filled with refugees who have no other place to go to. In addition, the COVID pandemic makes a bad situation worse.

As you can see, our Ministry comprises of TWO main sections. The first is EVANGELIZATION (Spiritual) and the second is HUMAN DEVELOPMENT (Temporal). Before the recent development, Primary Health Care had been foremost in Human Development. CURRENTLY we are trying to invest in MATERNITY CLINICS due to the number of Women that die each year at Childbirth and the high rate of infantile mortality in our area. Therefore, in addition to the refugee situation, money that we realize from this appeal will also go into this project. All these have made it urgent for us to turn to you for help. Therefore, proceeds from this mission will directly benefit and help the people in the areas of education of children, rehabilitation of refugees, the physically and mentally challenged, primary health care, maternity, orphans, shelter for the homeless, training of catechists and seminarians.

Thank you very much in anticipation for your kind consideration and response to our humble appeal, and for all you have done for us in the Missions. God BLESS You.
