

Communion: My eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples.

Responsorial: O God, we ponder your mercy within your temple.

Communion: Let your face shine on your servant. Save me in your merciful love. O Lord, let me never be put to shame, for I call on you.

**Friday, February 5—Saint Agatha, Virgin and Martyr**

Entrance: Behold, now she follows the Lamb who was crucified for us, powerful in virginity, modesty her offering, a sacrifice on the altar of chastity.

Communion: The Lamb who is at the center of the throne will lead them to the springs of the waters of life.

of all things visible and invisible.


I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,

**GUIDELINES FOR PUBLIC MASS**

Please remember that you have been dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass, and that dispensation will remain in place for the foreseeable future.

Those who are elderly or vulnerable may continue to stay at home, mindful of the dispensation from the Sunday obligation. People who are fearful that they may be putting their health, or the health of their family, at risk may likewise continue to remain at home.

Those who wish to participate in Mass and receive Holy Communion can do so by attending *any* Mass that is celebrated *any* day of the week. Because of social distancing, church capacity will be significantly reduced and the number of people who attend a particular Mass will have to be regulated and limited.

Since you don't HAVE to go to Mass on Sunday, go to a weekday Mass instead to help spread out the demand over the whole week! Our regional mass times remain the same. (*Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday 8AM at St. Saviour; 4PM Saturday & 9AM Sunday at St. Saviour; 11AM Sunday at St. John*)

The main parking lot doors and the front wooden doors will be our only entrances into church. At St. John's the only doors open will be the main door and the door by the choir section.

The only restroom that will be open is the one by the front entrance of church.

*Please continue to wear your face mask when entering the church building. Please leave your mask in place when you are in line to receive communion and do not remove it until you step to the side and then you may lower your mask to take Communion and then please immediately put your mask back in place.*

***Listen to the guidance of our ushers as they assist in seating and the flow during Communion.***

To respect the regulation for social distancing, please do not gather in church or in the parking lot after Mass.

**Deer Park Preschool Preregistration**

Deer Park residents with students who turn 4 before August 1, 2021, are eligible to attend Deer Park preschool in the 2021-22 school year. You can request a spot to be held for your student beginning Jan. 7 by contacting Pam Gilreath at the Deer Park Board Office at 513.936.4698. A \$25 nonrefundable deposit is required to reserve your child's spot in the class.

**GOSPEL REFLECTION**

This passage from Mark's Gospel could be the scene from a horror movie. Well, at least if Hollywood were producing the film. In truth, it's the scene of an act of great love and mercy and reveals the power and authority of Jesus!

It's the story of a man with an unclean spirit, a demon. The demon is tormenting him. So, Jesus looks at the man with great love and compassion and expels the evil spirit, setting him free. This truly is an act of love.

But one question this clearly brings up is the role of the evil spirits in our world and their ability to control, manipulate or, at least, tempt us. They are powerful spiritual beings created by God with free will, and they exercised that free will to turn away from God. One of their primary duties, granted them at the moment of their creation, was to care for humanity. Those spirits who fell from grace by their pride and sin still retain their natural spiritual power. But because of their fall, they now only have hatred for mankind and seek to destroy us. This is real. And this is something we should be keenly aware of.

But there is no reason to lose hope or to give in to fear. These beings are, of course, ultimately subject to the power and authority of God. They can do nothing without God permitting it—and, in the end, they can have no power over our lives.

But for now, we need to be aware of their natural spiritual power and influence. We need to understand that they can and will try to wreak havoc in our lives. When we let fear weaken our faith, and lack trust in God's almighty power, we slowly allow them to have more influence over us. But when we allow the grace and mercy of God to overshadow their evil influence, we hear Jesus rebuke them and order them to cease.

Reflect, today, upon the fact that the spiritual battle is a real one. However, the victory is assured if we only humble ourselves before God and trust in His power and authority. Humility is the key to this spiritual battle. It's the key to overcoming the attacks and temptations of the evil one. So, humble yourself before God when you feel oppressed or tempted. Humble yourself by admitting your weaknesses. Acknowledge that only God has the authority to strengthen you. Put your trust in Him. He will not let you down!



SVDP

I would like to thank our parishioners, Linden Grove School, and the Deer Park Community for your generosity and support of Saint Vincent de Paul here at St. Saviour.

SVDP's mission is to feed, clothe, house, and heal individuals and families in our community who have nowhere else to turn for help.

For the past 3 years, our average annual expenses were \$18,400 for rent/utility payments and \$16,600 for food distributed to our clients. Our 10 SVDP members meet twice monthly and have averaged over 1200 service hours and 3300 miles driven annually in serving our community. We averaged 130 household visits and impacted the lives of more than 450 people each year.

This would not be possible without your Fifth Sunday offerings, Christmas Giving Tree gifts, Thanksgiving donations, special fund raisers, and contributions from community businesses like IGA. Over 80% of our operating funds come from these sources. May God bless you all for your generosity.

## WEDDING ANNIVERSARIES IN 2021

A special blessing of throats occurs on the feast of St. Blaise, February 3. What is the origin of this?

St. Blaise, Biagio in Italian, Blasco or Blas in Spanish, was a bishop of Sebaste, Armenia, in modern Turkey, who was martyred for witnessing to the faith. He was tortured and beheaded for his beliefs by the local Roman governor around AD 316. This is all that is known about him, the rest being legend. We know much more about devotion to and the popularity of St. Blaise than historical facts.

The special blessing of throats associated with St. Blaise is due to a miracle attributed to him. While in prison, he miraculously saved a boy choking on a fish bone. Early in the sixth century, evidence exists in the Eastern Church that Blaise was prayed to for ailments of the throat. To this day, his feast is a holy day in the Eastern Church. In the ninth century, veneration of St. Blaise came to the Western Church and became very popular. Blessing of the throats with crossed candles began in the 1500s, the height of devotion to St. Blaise, and that blessing is still part of the devotion of the Catholic Church.

No matter what the facts are, St. Blaise is a constant reminder to us of God's care and concern for us in our weakness, sickness, and limited human existence. God's healing touch is with us always. St. Blaise's celebration is one of the ways in which we highlight and thank God for that care and concern.


