



Focus on Mary for 33 days

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati is celebrating its bicentennial with a 300-mile "parade" for Mary.

It's the longest Marian pilgrimage in the United States. The observance began on May 9 at the Our Lady of Fatima Shrine in Russells Point, Ohio.

Pilgrims continue to escort a statue of Our Lady of Fatima throughout the diocese. The route threads back and forth through concerts, celebrations and three dozen parishes.

Events this week include Holy Hour & Rosary at St. Maximillian in Liberty Twp on June 6 at 7 pm; Children's Rosary & Marian concert at St. Margaret of York, on June 7 at 6 pm; Outdoor Stations of the Cross at the Jesuit Spiritual Center in Milford, on June 8 at 5:30 pm; Holy Hour at Holy Trinity in Batavia on June 9 at 7 pm; Rosary, Confession & Mass at St. Bernadette in Amelia on June 10 at 2 pm; Holy Hour at Mt. St. Mary Seminary on June 11 at 7 pm; Mass and Concert at St. Gertrude on June 12 at 4:30 pm; and Rosary and outdoor celebration at St. Cecilia on June 13 at 4 pm.

The capstone will be a reconsecration of the archdiocese at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Peter in Chains on June 19. A family concert will follow on Fountain Square beginning at noon.

Catholics are invited to participate individually, doing everything from praying the 33 Days of Morning Glory booklet to walking as a Statue Guardian pilgrim. Booklets are available in the back of church.

QUESTION AND ANSWER



What are the origins for the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, often referred to as Corpus Christi Sunday?

By the year 1000, the active participation of the laity at Mass was minimal. Most of the people did not receive Communion for a variety of reasons, especially the notion of unworthiness. A form of Eucharistic spirituality that attempted to involve them developed, known as "ocular communion." It put forth the notion that Eucharistic graces were received by merely looking at the host. Instead of physically partaking, one fervently looked at and adored the host.

Elevating the bread and wine at consecration dates to this period. The practice of viewing the host outside of Mass developed into a devotion called Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, where the exposed host could be viewed and adored for a more extended period of time. The request for even more time to view the host led to a devotion known as Forty Hours, the exposition of the host for forty hours straight. By 1250, we have the development of Corpus Christi, a procession through the streets with the exposed host in a holder called a monstrance, enabling all to view and adore the Blessed Sacrament.

With the return to the full, conscious, and active participation at Mass by all, these devotions, while appropriate for their day and time, have lost some of their significance. They are still valid devotions, but only in relationship to the source and summit of our faith, the Eucharistic celebration by the whole assembly.

NEW GUIDELINES FOR MASS

Good day everyone!! On May 13, 2021, the Diocesan Bishops of Ohio decided that the general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (including the Saturday/Vigil Mass) is to be reinstated. This will take effect in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati the weekend of June 5-6, 2021. As has always been the case, those who have a serious reason are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. This includes those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immuno-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons. Nevertheless, these persons should observe the Lord's Day and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sunday, meditating on the Lord's passion, death and resurrection; an appropriate way to do this is through viewing a broadcast of the Sunday Mass. Masses that are broadcast through various media are not intended as a substitute nor do they fulfill the obligation for the persons who are able to gather for a Sunday celebration and other Holy Days of Obligation. Instead, they are intended for the sick, home-bound, the imprisoned, etc., who are unable to attend Mass in person.

The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days is not something God asks of us out of his own necessity to be worshipped, but rather a gift to us for our spiritual well-being, eternal salvation and formation in our relationship with God and one another. To that end, Saint John Vianney rightly asserts, "There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, He would have given it to us." The Eucharist is the greatest gift Christ left to the Church—the gift of Himself. There is no substitute for Mass celebrated in person.

Until the statewide mask mandate changes effective June 2, 2021, it is expected that masks are worn at all times in church. Priests, deacons, readers, and cantors may (if socially distant from others) remove their mask while speaking or singing, but masks must be worn while in procession throughout the church and especially during the distribution of Holy Communion. Please continue to leave your mask in place when you are in line to receive Communion and please do not remove it until you step to the side and then you may lower your mask to take Communion and then please immediately put your mask back in place.

Some of the ribbons marking off pews have been removed. Guidance from the Archdiocese of Cincinnati allows this. We realize that some parishioners may prefer to be socially distanced so some of the pews remain marked off with ribbons.




