From the Pastor's desk

We may think the doctrine of the Trinity is too complicated or abstract to make much of a difference in our day-to-day life. Yet “the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching” (CCC234) The Trinity is who God really is: a real, personal, wise, and loving God. And because he has revealed to us who he really is, we can really speak to him and love him: “O my Three, my all, my beatitude, infinite solitude, immensity in which I lose myself... Bury yourself in me that I may bury myself in you until I depart to contemplate in your light the abyss of your greatness” (St Elizabeth of the Trinity). Life with the Trinity is truly the whole point of the Christian faith and the goal of every human life. (Magnificat)

Today we celebrate the central mystery of Christian faith and life – the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity. “Now this is the Catholic faith: We worship one God in the Trinity and the Trinity in unity, without either confusing the persons or dividing the substance; for the person of the Father is one, the Son’s is another, the Holy Spirit’s another; but the Godhead of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, their glory equal, their majesty coeternal.” (CCC 266)

There is a beautiful saying about the Trinity: ‘united, but not the same, distinct, but not separate.’ It is a belief that we openly profess every time we say the Nicene Creed, written in the 4th century AD – “*We believe in one God, the Father Almighty... We believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father ... We believe in the Holy Spirit... who proceeds from the Father and the Son...*”

Next Sunday is the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. This Solemnity kicks off the three year Eucharistic Revival sponsored by the US Catholic Bishops. The bishops write: “Scandal, division, disease, doubt. The Church has withstood each of these throughout our very human history. But today we confront all of them, all at once. Our response in this moment is pivotal. In the midst of these roaring waves, Jesus is present, reminding us that he is more powerful than the storm. He desires to heal, renew, and unify the Church and the world. How will he do it? By uniting us once again around the source and summit of our faith, the Holy Eucharist. The National Eucharistic Revival is the joyful, expectant, grassroots response of the entire Catholic Church in the USA to this divine invitation.” May all of us grow in our love of the Eucharist and come to appreciate what a great and precious gift that God has given us, living bread come down from heaven. May Catholics who have fallen away from the faith soon come back to the Mass every Sunday and join us in worshipping our God in the Eucharistic Sacrifice.

We hope and pray that the St. John Festival is blessed with safety, good crowds and good weather. Many thanks to all who support this great parish and community event.

The month of June is traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This is a beautiful and important Catholic devotion. The feasts of the Sacred Heart of Jesus will be on Friday, June 24th, and the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Saturday, June 25th. We are so blessed to have these feasts!

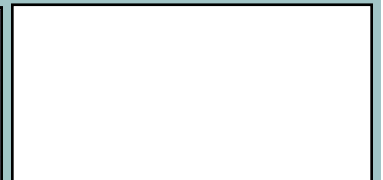
