To all fathers, “Happy Father’s day!” We hope it is a great day for them. They have given us life and love, and may we show them in return respect and love. St. Joseph is the great example and patron of all fathers. He was a good and just man, a man of great faith. He was the leader and protector of the Holy Family. He was obedient to the will of God. May all fathers, physical and spiritual, pray to St. Joseph for help and guidance. We need faithful, loving, good, courageous, strong fathers, husbands, grandfathers, priests, more than ever. For those of us whose father is deceased, let us remember them in our prayers today.

This Sunday is the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. The opening prayer of Mass says: “O God, who in this wonderful sacrament have left us a memorial of your Passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of your redemption.”

This Solemnity kicks off the three-year Eucharistic Revival sponsored by the US Catholic Bishops. The bishops write: “Scandal, division, disease, doubt. The Church has withstood each of these throughout our very human history. But today we confront all of them, all at once. Our response in this moment is pivotal. In the midst of these roaring waves, Jesus is present, reminding us that he is more powerful than the storm. He desires to heal, renew, and unify the Church and the world. How will he do it? By uniting us once again around the source and summit of our faith, the Holy Eucharist. The National Eucharistic Revival is the joyful, expectant, grassroots response of the entire Catholic Church in the USA to this divine invitation.”

May all of us grow in our love of the Eucharist and come to appreciate what a great and precious gift that God has given us, living bread come down from heaven. May Catholics who have fallen away from the faith soon come back to the Mass every Sunday and join us in worshipping our God in the Eucharistic Sacrifice.

Saint John Paul II reminded us that the Church “does not only celebrate the Eucharist but solemnly bears it in procession, publicly proclaiming that the sacrifice of Christ is for the salvation of the whole world.” Our Eucharistic faith gives us confidence that Christ abides with us through all the sorrows of our life, sanctifying us and leading out to his unveiled presence in heaven. (Magnificat)

We are so blessed as Catholics to have the Eucharist – Jesus with us! The month of June is traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This is a beautiful and important Catholic devotion. The feasts of the Sacred Heart of Jesus will be this Friday, June 24th, and the Immaculate Heart of Mary this Saturday, June 25th. We are so blessed to have these feasts!

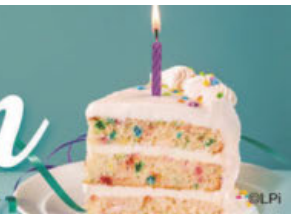

'New Pentecost' for Our Family

New Mass Times

Two weeks ago on Pentecost Sunday I preached about leaders of the "Crescent Parishes," which is how I like to refer to our S6 parish Family. I spoke about how I witnessed the Spirit, faith, enthusiasm and hope in the Crescent Family Parishes' Mass Time Subcommittee and pastoral councils. Let me say a few words about those leadership groups.

Mass Time Subcommittee

Made up of members from all five parishes and recommended by pastoral council members because they were smart and well-respected parishioners, the Mass Time Subcommittee gathered in May showing many gifts of the Spirit: "knowledge" about their parishes, "understanding" for each other, and "wisdom" and "counsel" in the ways they interacted and worked to offer pastoral councils outstanding options for a Crescent Parishes new Mass schedule.

Five Pastoral Councils Meet Together

I was also joyful and inspired to witness members of our five pastoral councils gathering as one body on May 31. It reminded me of the unity from diversity brought about by the Spirit at the first Pentecost! At that meeting, our pastoral councils reached a consensus to recommend to me the first option offered by the Mass Time Subcommittee, which is found below.

A New Pentecost

Also during that homily on Pentecost Sunday, I spoke about how Beacons of Light offers the Church a "New Pentecost." Just as the Church was born on Pentecost, so too in our age, Beacons of Light offers birth to a new way of seeing and being Church. What do I mean?

We are familiar with our parish church. A special loyalty lies there. Also, we are familiar with the

Archdiocese as another level of Church. Significantly, Beacons of Light is asking us to see and be Church in a whole new way, as a Family of parishes. Indeed, this is a New Pentecost! How do I know this?

Pastor of Multiple Parishes

I believe and know that Beacons of Light is an earthshakingly hopeful opportunity because I was pastor of multiple parishes for sixteen years! I saw firsthand the greater unity, the blessed cooperation, the multiplication of opportunities, and the saving of resources that "regioning" or "familying" of parishes offers. However, there are dangers to Beacons of Light, just as there were on the first Pentecost.

Dangers to a New Way of Church

The dangers to Beacons of Light are similar to dangers of the first Pentecost: fear and cynicism.

If the Apostles, huddled in the upper room for fear, had not overcome their fears, the Church would not have been born. What are your fears of Beacons of Light?

Another danger is cynicism. Cynical observers of the first Pentecost thought the apostles were drunk on new wine! They were negative on this new thing God was doing, and sadly, some of them opted out of the outpouring of the Spirit.

Main Topic: Mass Time Changes

Let me turn now to address the main topic of this bulletin contribution: Mass Time Changes in our Crescent Parishes. What are some reasons for changing some Mass times?

Reasons for Flexing Mass Times

1. Greeting warmly, knowing parishioners by name and welcoming visiting parishioners are my number one values aside from essential pastor/priest responsibilities. However, I can't welcome well with the current Mass schedule, where three pairs of our Mass times are identical.

2. Varied Mass times are a convenience and a blessing to parishioners. Changing the Mass times offers new and better options for all and may attract returning or new parishioners.

3. With Mass times varied by thirty minutes, it would be possible on special occasions, for me and other parish leaders to address all/most parishioners in one weekend either before Mass or at homily time.

New Mass Schedule for Our Parishes

Now let's look at the Mass time schedule offered by the Mass Time Subcommittee and recommended by pastoral councils. Four Mass times were changed. (Previous Mass times are listed in parenthesis, otherwise the Mass time is unchanged.)

Church of the Resurrection

3:30 PM Saturday (4:00)

10:00 AM Sunday

Holy Trinity

9:00 AM Sunday

Nativity

5:15 PM (4:30) Saturday

11:00 AM Sunday

St. John

10:30AM (11:00) Sunday

St. Saviour

4:00 PM Saturday

8:30 or 9:30 AM (9:00) Sunday

This Mass schedule will be effective September 3rd and 4th.

All Share in Sacrifice

Most growth in the Christian life comes from participation in the paschal mystery: the suffering, sacrifice, death and resurrection of Jesus.

For example, when a husband and wife sacrifice themselves for the other their love grows and they grow closer in unity with each other and Jesus.

The same is true in parish life, for individual parishioners and for the parish as a whole, sacrifice leads to new life.

One of the most profound dimensions of this new Mass schedule is that most everyone is sacrificing with a Mass time change.

Sacrifice is what we are about as Christians. Pray we will participate in the paschal mystery with the same dignity and courage as Jesus, not crying out, being bitter or nurturing anger, but rather, responding willingly and with hope.

Subject to Change

I am confident the new Mass schedule is an awesome one, especially because it came from parishioners. At the same time, it might need to be changed or flexed for good reason. Note the lack of certainty about the best time for St. Saviour's Sunday Mass. Leaders will work through this question and more explanation about the entire schedule will follow. Please do not hesitate to contact a pastoral council member to talk with them, whether for kudos or concerns!

A New and Vibrant Church

Thanks in advance to parishioners who receive the burden of Mass time changes with trust and hope. I pray that you will be on board with both, which will be a work of faith and prayer in itself. Beacons of Light and our new Mass schedule offer us an opportunity for the new life of the Resurrection and a New Pentecost!

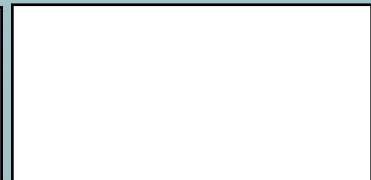
