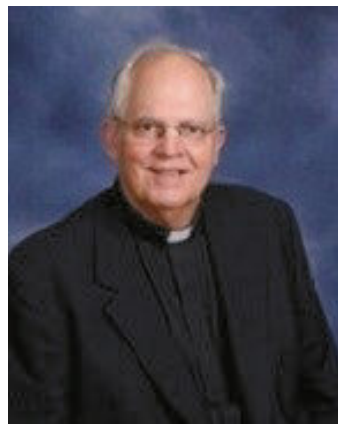

Hogwash

I've learned much over the twenty years that I have been blessed to be a pastor in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. (Surely, too many of those learnings have been from mistakes!!) From being made the youngest pastor in the Archdiocese at the time, 2002, being made pastor of Immaculate Conception, Botkins, and St. Lawrence, Rhine, and then having two more parishes added to our region over the course of that sixteen year pastorate, and from a four year pastorate at the Church of the Incarnation in Dayton, I have never ceased to be joyfully humbled and to learn more about being the best image of Jesus that I can be as a priest/pastor. I love being a priest and pastor!!

When we added St. Joseph, Wapakoneta and St. John, Fryburg to our pastoral region (read "Family of Parishes" in the words and mindset of Beacons of Light) we called ourselves "Petersburg Parishes" after the now vanished St. Peter and Paul Church founded in the early 1800s. Before it closed it was located in the geographic center of our four parishes.

By Jesus' grace, we realized, even before archdiocesan leadership, that "regioning" (today it's called "familying") was the future path to a vibrant Church. The effectiveness of "Petersburg Parishes" was ratified recently by Beacons of Light over a decade after it was founded, as the four parishes remained as they were, already united in a family of parishes!

As I prepared to leave Petersburg Parishes to go to Incarnation, I remember the first article sent for Incarnation's bulletin. I wrote it late at night between packing my belongings and preparing for the new assignment.

The article was entitled "Hogwash," which was ironically appropriate, since Petersburg Parishes included dozens of farm families. It talked about how, while statistics say a small percentage of parishioners read a parish bulletin, perhaps less than 30%, the people who matter most read the bulletin! They are people who love Jesus as shown by their faithful presence at Mass, their desire to serve and their connections to Jesus through the Church. In other words, I say "hogwash" to those who don't think a parish bulletin is important. Let me make a promise.

Today, I make the same promise to Crescent Parishes (a nickname I give us, because plotted on a map, our churches look like a crescent moon) as I did in that bulletin article four years ago: I promise that if you read the bulletin you will know lots about what is going on in our parishes. You will grow in faith, be challenged and hopefully even inspired! You'll know me, our priests and our staff better too! Please read the bulletin and see if this promise isn't true!

Kind of like St. Paul, who was always writing to Jesus' people, as a measure of the value I place in writing, in the past four years I have written at least 180,000 words in Incarnation's bulletin—850 weekly words X 52 weeks x 4 Years + a few more during critical times. I'd like to think that those words—what would equal two average books—are a measure of my love for Jesus and his flock.

And so, in this first official article, before all else, I offer thanks to you, the people of Crescent Parishes. Thanks for reading the bulletin. Thanks for being generous to Jesus with your time, talent and treasure. Thanks for being open to the challenge of continuous conversion and transformation in Jesus. Thanks to so many leaders, ministers and staff who serve to unite us. Thank you for the opportunity to grow and become a better man and a holier priest among you!

Interestingly, I'm going to close my first official bulletin article in Crescent Parishes' bulletins with words that are not my own. They are words printed on my twenty-five-year-old ordination card and taken from the late Most Reverend Joseph L. Bernardin as he started his ministry as Archbishop of Chicago. They represent what I hope the Lord Jesus and the Spirit will allow me to be and do at our parishes: "...I give myself to you. I offer you my service and leadership, my energies, my gifts, my mind, my heart, my strength and, yes, my limitations. I offer myself in faith, hope and love."

After he was released, he became a lay brother. She was canonized in 1950, and her mother and her killer came to her canonization ceremony.

July 9: St. Augustine Zhao Rong and companions. Father Augustine Zhao Rong is one of 120 saints of the Catholic Church associated with China. He was a soldier who became a diocesan priest after being influenced by Bishop Gabriel-Taurine Dufresse. Like the Bishop, he was arrested, tortured, and died in 1815.
