

BEACONS of LIGHT

As of October 1, the draft plan of Families of Parishes, the first phase of the Beacons of Light pastoral planning process, is posted for you to view on the BeaconsAOC.org website. Your thoughtful input at this stage of the planning process would be most valuable. Please provide your feedback in the comment box available on the website before Wednesday, October 20. These Families of Parishes will become a new parish under a single pastor within the next four years. "Parish" refers to a number of Catholics living in an area, pastored by a single priest. The parish may have multiple church buildings or campuses. The plan is that each Family of Parishes will have a single pastor and one or more parochial vicars (priest assistants) who may be either active or retired priests. The administrational and organizational model and details of the new parish will be planned by each Parish Family and all plans will be reviewed and given final approval by the Archbishop.

Formation and Training for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

In-person and online formation and training for new and veteran extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion will take place this fall in both English and Spanish. Some sessions will focus on ministry to the sick, hospitalized, and homebound. Some sessions of this training for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will be conducted virtually using Zoom. Several sessions will be conducted entirely in Spanish. The sessions are:

- St. Mary of the Assumption, Springboro (English): Nov 4, 7-9 pm
- St. John the Baptist, Tipp City (English): Nov 16, 7-9 pm
