



FIRST READING - 1 SAMUEL 1:20-22, 24-28

In those days Hannah conceived, and at the end of her term bore a son whom she called Samuel, since she had asked the LORD for him. The next time her husband Elkanah was going up with the rest of his household to offer the customary sacrifice to the LORD and to fulfill his vows, Hannah did not go, explaining to her husband, "Once the child is weaned, I will take him to appear before the LORD and to remain there forever; I will offer him as a perpetual nazirite." Once Samuel was weaned, Hannah brought him up with her, along with a three-year-old bull, an ephah of flour, and a skin of wine, and presented him at the temple of the LORD in Shiloh. After the boy's father had sacrificed the young bull, Hannah, his mother, approached Eli and said: "Pardon, my lord! As you live, my lord, I am the woman who stood near you here, praying to the LORD. I prayed for this child, and the LORD granted my request. Now I, in turn, give him to the LORD; as long as he lives, he shall be dedicated to the LORD." Hannah left Samuel there.



When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.

MERRY CHRISTMAS! Fr. David Poecking (Pastor)

The Christmas season began with our celebration of the birth of Jesus, and continues with the feasts of:

- Holy Family (usually the Sunday after Christmas)
- Mary, Mother of God (January 1, but this year not a holy day of obligation)
- Epiphany (in the U.S.A., the Sunday after new year's day)
- Baptism of the Lord (usually the Sunday after Epiphany)

Each of these feasts highlights some way in which God uses Jesus' humanity for our salvation. Holy Family, for example, highlights how Jesus accepts human family life as a school of divine love: For us to assume the mutual submission of husband and wife, or the asymmetric responsibilities of parents and children, becomes a way for us to share in the life of Jesus and thus also the life of God.

In these days of increasingly anti-religious sentiment, perhaps equally important is how these feasts highlight Jesus' acceptance of religion as a human obligation. Though the religion of his own day and people was far from perfect, nevertheless the Temple in Jerusalem figures prominently in the gospels, and on January 1 we read of Jesus' circumcision as a symbol of submission to religious law.

In our own day, folks are quick to identify the religious failures or hypocrisies of others. They often do so as justification for withdrawing from Mass, confession, or our responsibility for contributing to the life of the Church. But others' failures do not excuse us; on the contrary, after the example of Christ, they intensify our obligations!

OTHER NEWS

- Among our major obligations in this generation is the cultivation of habits of missionary discipleship. Just as our great-grandparents made great sacrifices to build the churches, schools, and Catholic "infrastructure" from the late 19th through the mid 20th centuries, so our Pope and Bishop call us to build a culture of outreach, encounter, and accompaniment. At Archangel Gabriel Parish, our main tool for this culture shift is the Alpha process, which I hope most every parishioner will undergo. The next cohort starts on February 1. You can learn more and register here: <u>archangelgabrielparish.org/alpha</u>.
- In September I started a kind of parish pledge drive, asking every household prayerfully to consider giving 5% of household income to the parish, or if not 5% then some amount which comports with its household budget. Then I got very sick with appendicitis and its complications, and the pledge drive was much delayed, now dragging into the Christmas season. Even so, many of you have been responsive and supportive: At the time this column was written, it looks as if the parish offertory may have risen by about \$20,000 per month. This is a great start! If you've been a part of it, please keep up the good work; if not, please be prayerfully receptive when you get a letter from me.

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD Steve Swank (Director of Faith Formation)

In the December 12 bulletin, Patty Sampogna shared her motivation for becoming a CGS catechesis. Reading her reflection made me recall why I wanted to start a CGS atrium at our parish.

My first encounter with Catechesis of the Good Shepherd was at a meeting for catechetical administrators. A CGS catechist came to the meeting to talk about the ministry and the benefits of implementing it at our parishes. I have heard similar spiels before, so I was not yet sold. But then the catechist showed us an example of a presentation, delivering it to us just as she would to children. I was floored. The presentation was amazing in its simplicity. CGS is led by the child's own natural desire to seek a relationship with God and the catechist accompanies and guides the child in this relationship. I could immediately see why young children would be drawn to this form of catechesis. It also became quite apparent that this method could be extremely useful for working with children with special needs and helping them to encounter Jesus. Most importantly, I could see how CGS could touch the hearts of our children, because this presentation touched mine.

The presentation I witnessed at the meeting that day was that of the Good Shepherd from John 10:3-18. If you would like to view the CGS presentation, a video is available at <u>archangelgabrielparish.org/cgs</u>.
