What is Alpha?

Alpha is a chance to ask questions and explore the Catholic faith in a fun, no-pressure environment. Each of the ten sessions includes a meal, a short talk, and a discussion where you can share your thoughts.



HAPPY EPIPHANY!

“Epiphany” is a pre-Christian word. It was used by the pagans to describe a moment in which a god or goddess should reveal himself or herself to mortals for an especially dramatic recognition. Greek-speaking Jews appropriated the term to describe Old Testament moments such as God’s appearance to Moses at the burning bush, or to the people of Israel on Mount Sinai via the tablets of the Ten Commandments.

Still later, early Christians co-opted the term “epiphany” to describe events in the earthly life of Jesus which hinted at his divinity, e.g.:

- The toddler Jesus’ adoration by the magi, signifying that he is to be worshiped by Gentiles as well as Jews;
- Jesus’ baptism, when he is revealed as “Son” of the “Father” in the “Spirit,” imparting to water the power to introduce people to the Holy Trinity;
- Jesus’ conversion of water into wine at the wedding in Cana, signifying his creative power to elevate the earthly blessing of marriage into a sacrament of divine life and love.

In the Latin Rite of the Catholic Church, all of these and more can be described as epiphanies, but when we speak of the epiphany we mean Jesus’ adoration by the magi, which we commemorate today. Let us bring our first and our best gifts of time, attention, money, energy, patience, charity, etc., and sacrifice them cheerfully in worship of the Lord Jesus.

OTHER NEWS

- In this generation, we are called to build a parish culture of missionary discipleship. At Archangel Gabriel Parish, our main tool for this culture shift is the Alpha process, which I hope most every parishioner will undergo. The next cohort starts on February 1. You can learn more and save your seat here: archangelgabrielparish.org/alpha.
- Over the coming year, parish finances will undergo some major changes. Already on January 1, 2022, the way in which we subsidize the school changed. Next January 1, 2023, the Diocese of Pittsburgh will replace the “Parish Share” program with the “Parish Appeal.” The changes might have been very confusing, except that I suspect many people never really understood parish finances in the first place. I am resolved this year to try to correct that lacuna by explaining parish finances as best I can. It’s a good year to do so: Our bible readings at Mass will often come from the Gospel of Luke, which highlights how our worldly use of money reveals our spiritual commitments. Stay tuned!

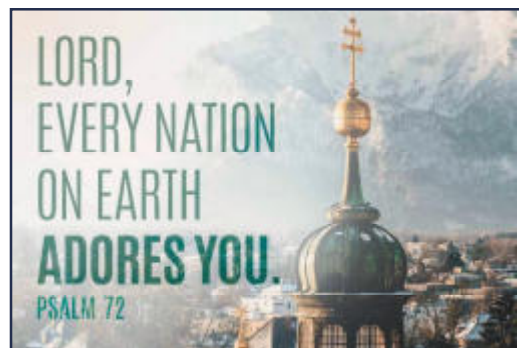
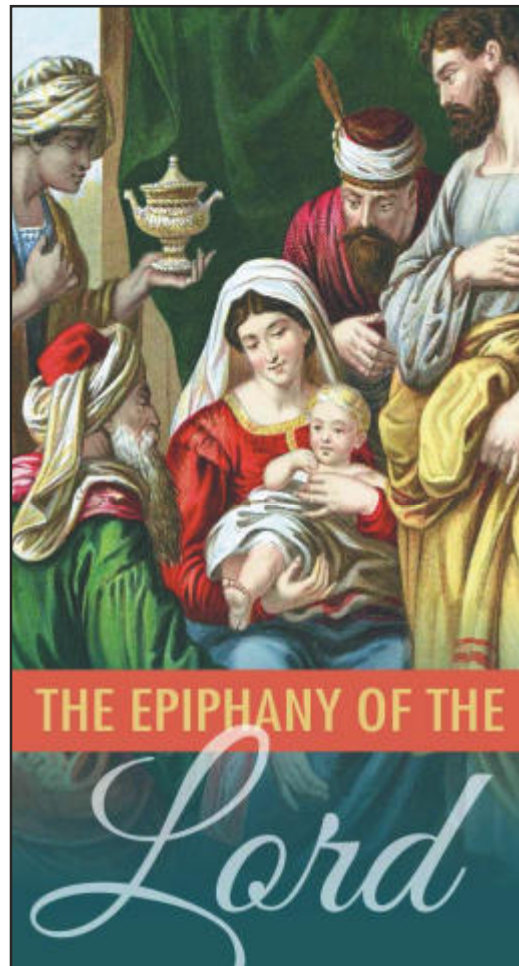

Last year was a great year for youth ministry at our parish. We resumed our middle school ministry, EDGE, in person and launched our Life Teen ministry for high school teens. I'm excited to continue these ministries in the new year as well as begin our improved Confirmation preparation.

Confirmation preparation is open to all teens 13-17 years old who have not been confirmed prior. Confirmation is powerful but often misunderstood. It finishes what was begun in your baptism. Baptism made you a child of God, Confirmation gives you the strength to live like one.

This is why preparation for Confirmation is so important. The Holy Spirit doesn't force His gifts on us. We need to be open to receive His gifts. Confirmation prep helps our confirmandi open their hearts to the Holy Spirit who wants to make them strong and help them live as children of God.

This is also why we continued EDGE and launched Life Teen. Young people need a strong Christian community around them to see how to live as a disciple, a person who follows Jesus. Our Life Teen and EDGE participants see this in each other and in the adult Core Team who help lead these ministries.

Our mission in youth ministry is to help our young people become disciples. If you feel a call to help in this mission, please contact me.

If you want your child or grandchild to be a part of a Christian community oriented towards discipleship, please reach out. Even if you're not sure of their interest.

Please contact me prior to attending EDGE. For Life Teen, no sign-up is necessary. Just show up!

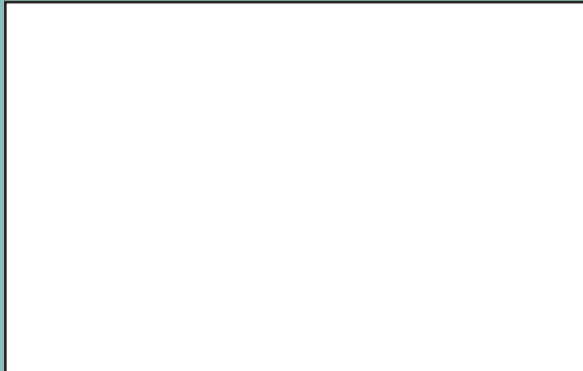
