THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

The Christmas season concludes with today's feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The feast brings us to a missional conclusion, paralleling how the feast of Pentecost concludes the Easter season:

- Jesus is revealed as the eternal Son of the eternal Father, in the Spirit—God as Trinity.
- Jesus is also revealed as God made man, assuming our mortal human nature. By going down into the water, for ancient Jews was a harbinger of death, Jesus anticipates his death; by rising out of the water, he anticipates his resurrection and the gift of the Spirit.
- Jesus doesn't need baptism to be freed from sin nor to receive the new life of the Spirit, with whom he lives forever. By submitting himself to baptism, he gives water the power to extend these mysteries to the rest of creation. God created the world by rolling back the "waters"; now God re-creates the world by immersing it in the waters of baptism.
- Thus we can now be baptized into the life of the Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Spirit—and begin to share in the life of God by sharing in Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

Due to early bulletin deadlines over the holidays, this column is my first composition of the new year of Our Lord, 2022. My pastoral new year's resolutions are:

1. To deepen and broaden the conversion of our parish life toward missionary discipleship. One of the most important means will be the Alpha process, from which I hope to seed the community with more and more missionally oriented disciples. A new cohort begins February 1; you can check it out here: www.ArchangelGabrielParish.org/alpha

Besides Alpha, there'll be other opportunities. Early this year, we'll be announcing ways our parish will help with the diocesan preparations for the 2023 global Synod "on synodality," in which we will all be practicing spiritual listening and discernment. Stay tuned!

2. To familiarize the parish with how the parish and school are funded. My work with the regional Catholic school board and with our parish pledge drive—and notably, responses to these efforts—make it clear that many people simply do not know how money "works" in the Church. To be fair, that's not necessarily their fault: It's not a typical business nor even like a typical non-profit. But it's complicated, so it will take me a while to do this.

The first lesson: I am grateful to those of you who have already responded to my appeal for reliable pledges up to 5% of household income. The responses thus far suggest pledges of \$13,000 monthly over our previous revenues. This is a great start.

Donors will receive end-of-year acknowledgment letters. These are useful for those of you who itemize your deductions. They also serve as additional security for our money management, insofar as widespread discrepancies would suggest systematic mismanagement or fraud. Those who donate via our electronic-giving service will receive acknowledgments direct from Faith Direct.

Electronic giving is more secure also in that volunteers and staff don't need to handle checks with your personal banking information on them, and can't misplace or miscount cash. It's also cheaper for the parish, because we don't have to mail the envelopes or spend staff time on opening them. For the same reasons, it's better for the environment.

Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God. 

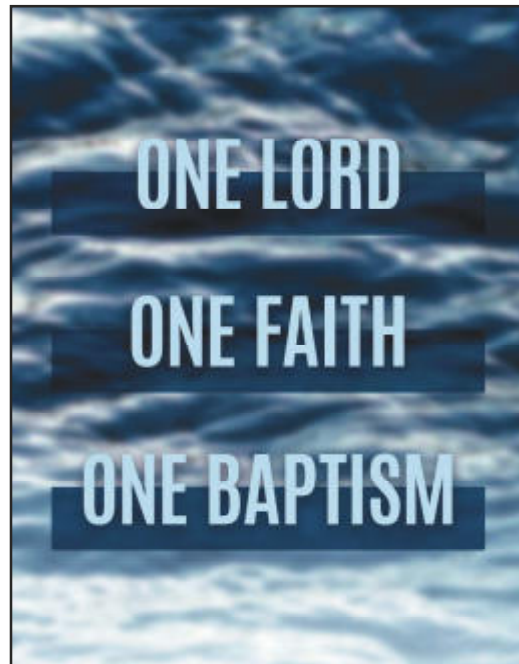

SERVICE OF LOVE - FLEECE BLANKETS AND MORE

Start the new year off by joining us on Wednesday, January 12, at Weirauch Hall from 6-8 PM to make fleece tie blankets that will be donated to patients at local health care providers in our community. Please bring 1 ½ yards of two fleece fabrics that go together (3 yards total) or a “No Sew” blanket kit size 48x60 inches that can be purchased at local craft type stores. Bring your fleece and a SHARP pair of fabric scissors and we can show you the rest. Feel free to bring a friend or two.

TAI CHI CLASSES

Tai Chi classes will reconvene on Thursday mornings at 10 AM, beginning on January 13th, in the Saint Malachy gym. Because pre-school will be in session we will use the outer doors up the stairs outside the gym to enter and exit instead of the glass doors. BE AWARE: For the same reason we will not be able to use the restrooms in the school.

Last fall the students learned the beginning 10 postures of the T'ai Chi form and will continue on to learn the next 10 postures to complete the first 1/3 of the form. Even though we will be continuing from there, new students would be welcome to join us as we continue to learn!

TO STAND IN YOUR PRESENCE

“Offer up our first and best gifts for the ministry of Word and Sacrament” – our first parish goal

Back in the days when I was a chaplain in health care ministry, the Protestant chaplain made a comment about how we Catholics spend a lot of time getting up and down during Mass. I hadn't really thought about it much until then because that's just what we do at Mass. But since then, I am much more aware of the movements we make when we worship. Standing, sitting, kneeling, bowing...all have meaning and serve to communicate what we believe Mass is about.

As our new parish comes to life post-pandemic, or better maybe to say during pandemic, many have commented that it will never return to how things were before March 2020 when everything changed. And maybe that's a good thing. While some people are change adverse, that has never bothered me. Change, at least in my experience, is a way that God shakes us awake and asks us to consider things. Yes, I can hear some of you complaining that everything was better before, or you don't like anything to change, but I would ask you to stop and consider that if nothing changed, there would be no progress here on earth.

Anyway, back to our worship. That changes minimally really, and we follow a pattern that was set centuries ago as the early Christians put form to their communal prayer. Standing was to praise God. So, we stand for the Gospel, we stand to welcome the entrance procession and the closing procession, and in fact, we stand for these processions – movement that reminds us we are on the way, journeying to our eternal homeland. Communion, the presentation of the gifts of bread and wine, and even processions when we carry the Eucharist through the church or around the neighborhood, Christians are on the move.

Sitting is the stance for paying attention to what is being communicated, like the sacred texts of the Scriptures, and the homily that expounds on those texts. Kneeling is a penitential stance, and also one for adoration. We kneel to ask God's mercy sometimes, and we kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer to reverence the miracle of the Mass: the consecration of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ.

We bow when we approach the altar, or when the name of Jesus is mentioned, just a simple movement of our heads. And we genuflect, that is, make a reverence by going down on one knee to acknowledge the presence of Christ in the tabernacle when we enter our pew at the beginning of Mass and leave at its conclusion. The ministers who come in the procession as Mass begins make a genuflection if they aren't carrying an object like the cross or the Book of the Gospels, because the sacrament is reserved in the sanctuary.

All these movements say something about how we worship. Standing in the presence of God is how we spend a lot of our lives, even though we might not think about it like that. Take a moment to consider the postures of your life, especially when it comes to our communal worship.

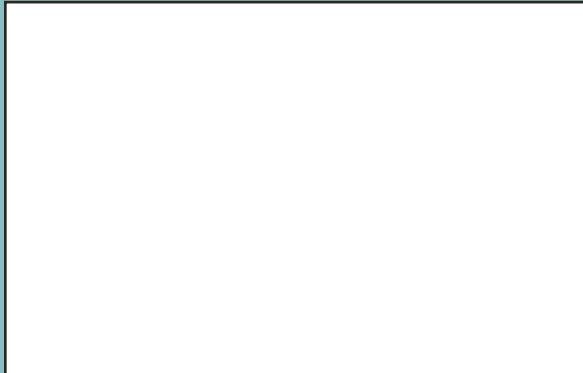

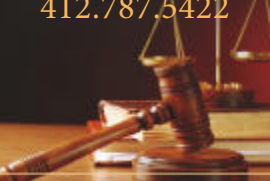
