





5th Sunday of Easter May 18, 2025

Exegesis Of the 1st Reading: Acts 14:21–27

This reading includes the last stages of the first missionary journey. Previously on this journey, Paul and Barnabas were confronted by angry mobs (13:50; 14:5). And Paul was most recently stoned and left for dead (14:19). Despite such hardships, the apostles are not discouraged. As this reading begins, they are proclaiming the good news to the populace at Derbe, the eastern limit of their journey. By God's grace a significant number of people there accept the invitation to faith.

1) Devoted Service. From Derbe, Paul and Barnabas retrace their steps, returning to the very places where they had met such resistance earlier. Understandably the apostles feel a need to encourage the disciples in those places, reminding them of the need to accept such hardships for the sake of a kingdom many could not yet appreciate. To further strengthen these fledgling communities of faith, the apostles appoint leaders over them, entrusting them to the Lord with prayer and fasting. Such details make clear what good shepherds Paul and Barnabas are to the Churches established on their journey.

2) Divine Grace. From the port of Attalia on the southern coast of Asia Minor, the apostles return to Antioch in Syria, the community of faith in Antioch that sent the apostles on this first missionary venture. Now the apostles gather that community together to give them an account of their experiences. Remarkably, they make no mention of their hardships. Instead, with surely breathless excitement, they speak of everything God accomplished, especially the invitation to life extended to the gentiles.

Exegesis of the 2nd Reading: Revelation 21:1–5a

1) Holy City. John sees a new and holy Jerusalem coming down from heaven like a bride on her wedding day.

2) Divine Presence. A loud voice declares that God is now with the people, giving them comfort and new life.

Exegesis of the Gospel: John 13:31–33a, 34–35


Today's passage is taken from the introduction to the farewell discourse of the Gospel of John. That discourse extends from chapters 13 through 17. Its purpose is to prepare the disciples for Jesus' departure from this earth when they will have to take over his work. This chapter began with the unique event of the foot washing wherein

the interrelationship between Jesus and his disciples is stressed. It will end with the powerful teaching of Jesus formulated as "a new commandment."

1) Mutual glorification. Today's Gospel begins with an emphasis stressing that Jesus, the Son of Man, is glorified and God is glorified in him (13:31). The phrase "to glorify" is repeated here five times. This is not an easy phrase to interpret because of its intimate connection with John's emphasis on the "hour" of Jesus. This hour refers to the time of Jesus' death when he will be raised up on the cross in glory and exaltation. This mutual glorification was first emphasized in the prologue to the Gospel: "And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son full of grace and truth" (1:14). In other words, glorify implies the presence of God in Jesus, which has become visible to the world. This glory will reach its fullness when Jesus returns to God. Herein the full glory of God and Jesus will be revealed.

2) A new commandment. Jesus' final instruction to this disciples is to give them a new commandment, one stating that the disciples are to love one another. That, however, is not the new part. The new part is that they are to love one another as Jesus has loved them. Jesus' love is to be the paradigm for the disciples' loving one another. There is even more. How did Jesus love his disciples? As he demonstrated in the foot washing, Jesus loved his disciples as an equal, as a mutual servant about to give everything up for those he loved. That is what he will do when he is given up on the cross. This radical equality is what the disciples are commanded to imitate: to love one another as Jesus has loved them. This kind of love uniquely marks the disciples of Jesus. That commandment is still in force.
