### Good News From Father Daniel... Baptism of the Lord

Do not fear death, my dear brothers and sisters. The one who awaits us is the one described by the prophet Isaiah: *a bruised reed he shall not break. A smoldering wick he shall not quench.* What does this mean? It means that Jesus is the friend of the imperfect, a friend of the wounded and the ones who are not at the front.

Jesus demonstrated this by his reaction to those who hurt him. He said to his friends who deserted him, *Peace be with you* and to those who crucified him, *you are forgiven*.

We are not relying on our own merits when we approach God at our death. Jesus has taken away our sins and Jesus is there to welcome us.

We start this year with the presence of the Lord in our spirits and in our very being. He always says, *Do not be afraid*. We rely not on our own merits but on our trust in the love and mercy of God. This is our faith.

#### January Catholic Social Teaching: OPTION FOR THE POOR AND VULNERABLE

More than 43 million Americans live in poverty. Our faith demands of us a loving response to poverty, hunger, homelessness, unemployment, and other community issues that affect the poor. According to Pope Benedict XVI, a fundamental principle of the life of our Church is that "within the community of believers, there can never be room for a poverty that denies anyone what is needed for a dignified life."

We pray for all people who are unemployed, that they may find consolation and support in their time of need, and stable and dignified work.

#### **SEAT SAVING POLICY**

Saving seats for family or friends who have not yet arrived for Mass is not permitted.

CDC physical distancing requirements and our limited seating capacity make it necessary to ensure that **no seat goes unused.** We are often seating in the overflow area, and we do not want to seat people in the Commons or turn people away unnecessarily.

If you want to sit with individuals who have not yet arrived, you must wait until everyone is present to be seated.

An exception will be made for those who are dropped off at the door. Holding a seat for the driver, who is already on-site, is permitted.






